The Metro Law Enforcement Internship Program may be right for you. Graduate accounting students at Anderson have an opportunity to work with the white collar crime unit of either the Albuquerque Police Department or the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department. This 3-credit accounting elective is offered on a limited basis each fall and spring semester. Students are required to complete an application, be interviewed both internally (UNM) and externally (APD or BCSO) and have a background check. Selected students will then serve as an intern for an entire semester working 7 - 9 hours per week with one of the law enforcement agencies.

Question: Do I have to take CS 150 to be admitted to Anderson? I've heard I can take an exam instead and not take the CS 150 class. What do I need to do?

Answer: If you're comfortable with your level of Microsoft Word, Power Point, and Excel skills, the choose this option, you'll want to make sure you take time to prepare for the exam because parts of it can be challenging. You will not get credit for CS 150, so it will be three credit hours you'll need to make up later on, but you will not have to take the class. All three parts - Word, Power Point and Excel - of the exam must be passed with 80% or better before you can be admitted to Anderson. waiver exam might be a good option for you, particularly if you are a self-disciplined student. You purchase the license for around \$50 at the UNM Bookstore, work through some practice modules and sample tests on CD-ROM, and then schedule the exam through the UNM Testing Center. If you do choose this option, you'll want to make sure you take time to prepare for the exam because parts of it can be challenging. You will not get credit for CS 150, so it will be three credit hours you'll need to make up later on, but you will not have to take the class. All three parts - Word, Power Point and Excel - of the exam must be passed with 80% or better before you can be admitted to Anderson.
