OFFICIALS FROM UNM, the UNM Extended University and the University of Cadiz in southern Spain are meeting this week to discuss the design, development and implementation of a seamless bilingual virtual student support services program from a grant awarded by Funds for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education.
- 2. FIVE MEMBERS OF THE New Mexico Disaster Medical Assistance Team will be in Salt Lake City to provide medical care for the 2002 Winter Olympics. At the request of the FBI and the Federal Emergency Management Agency, one physician, two paramedics, one nurse and one emergency medical technician will be deployed from the NMDMAT.
