Question: Does Anderson offer a management minor?

Answer: Anderson does offer a management minor for students who are not in the BBA program. To fulfill the minor requirements, you must complete a total of 18 hours of specific coursework with a C- or better. You'll choose 6 to 9 hours from lower-division management and economics courses and then 9 to 12 hours from a list of pre-approved, 300-level management courses. Other management courses may count towards the minor with prior approval from the Associate Dean. Remember you'll need to make sure you have the appropriate pre-requisites completed in order to enroll in the upper-division management courses and must complete a Course Override Request to register for these courses.
