1. THE UNM HOME PAGE has been redesigned and is scheduled to go live Friday, June 30. To produce the new design, University Communication and Marketing Department staff studied usage of our current site, consulted with key users including students, parents, staff, faculty, administration, alumni, and reviewed a number of 'best practice' university sites around the country.

- 2. ACTING PRESIDENT David W. Harris has banned fireworks on all university property. The ban goes into effect immediately and will remain in force until further notice. The ban comes as a result of the severe drought conditions and the potential risk to life, property and the environment. - 3. ANOTHER SEMESTER means another record for student-athletes at UNM. The combined grade point average for the Lobos' 21 athletics programs during the 2006 spring semester was a school-record 3.08, according to the UNM registrar's office. - 4. THE FINAL AGREEMENT that put 3,002 acres of state land at Mesa del Sol into the hands of the developer was signed recently among the three entities involved.
