N. M., Taos Co., Rio Puello above mouth of
Rio Augustura, 3 miles above Tres Pinos.

A small trout stream 6-12 feet wide, usually
8-10 feet. The depth varied from 4 inches to 4 feet. The
ripples are fair, pools good usually 18 inches to 2 feet deep.
A few are deeper. Water clear white. Current moderate
to strong. The bottom is of boulders with much rubble
and some silt. Vegetation is sparse and consists
of a few patches of Ranunculus mostly in a stretch of
stream in a pasture. Food is only fairly common.
The stones are embedded too firmly in the bottom to
provide much shelter for the insects. Very few large
species were observed. Come for the fish and the stream
are both good. Fish were common. A 41 W 43 6:30 AM.
Served 5:40-6:00 PM + 6:15-7:45 AM.

N. M., Taos Co., Rio Puello, six miles south
of Tres Pinos.

A good sized stream 12-20 feet wide, 8 inches
to 4 feet deep. Water clear white, current
moderate to strong. Bottom of ^{boulders.} ~~rubble~~ with some
rubble. A slight growth of filamentous algae.
Come for fish and stream good. Food fair, less
than above Tres Pinos. A. 67. W 53. T. 10:30 AM.
