N.M., San Miguel Co., Wellow Creek two miles above its mouth at Terreno. A small mountain stream difficult to seine or angle because of the tangle of vegetation and fallen brush. The stream consists <sup>mostly</sup> of a series of rocky pools with small falls or slight ruffles between. The pools are usually with sufficient cover for the fish. The ruffles are too slight and poorly developed to be of much value. The bottom is largely of boulders with some patches of sand and silt. Water is clear white. The width averages 3-4 feet with extremes of 1 to 6 feet. The pools were mostly 8-24 inches deep, a few were 36" deep. Cover for both the stream and the fish is excellent. Food is rather scarce. Several springs were seen to enter the stream. 9.80 W50 about 12 M.
