UNM IS ONE OF 10 institutions nationally to receive a two-year, \$200,000 grant from the Pew Learning and Technology Program at the Center for Academic Transformation as part of the Pew Grant Program in Course Redesign. The grant will support the redesign of general psychology 105 at UNM using technology to enhance learning and reduce costs. The principal investigator for the grant is Gordon Hodge, associate professor in Psychology and UNM Presidential Teaching Fellow.
