Searched the Cimarron River at Springer.
This is a stream 10 to 30, mostly 10 to 15 or 20
feet wide with slightly turbid white water. The
bottom is of bed rock, rubble and in the deeper
holes and a beaver dam (apparently occupied)
of silt. The current is sluggish to strong. The
depth in the pools searched reached four feet. In
the beaver dam it may be greater but the depth
of mud or silt prevented searching the deeper parts.
A small amount of vegetation was present
especially along the edges of the pools and
ripples over the bed-rock area. Water 70°F about
3:30 P.M. A fisherman had two Artemia
melas catulus taken from the beaver dam.
