will see a very large

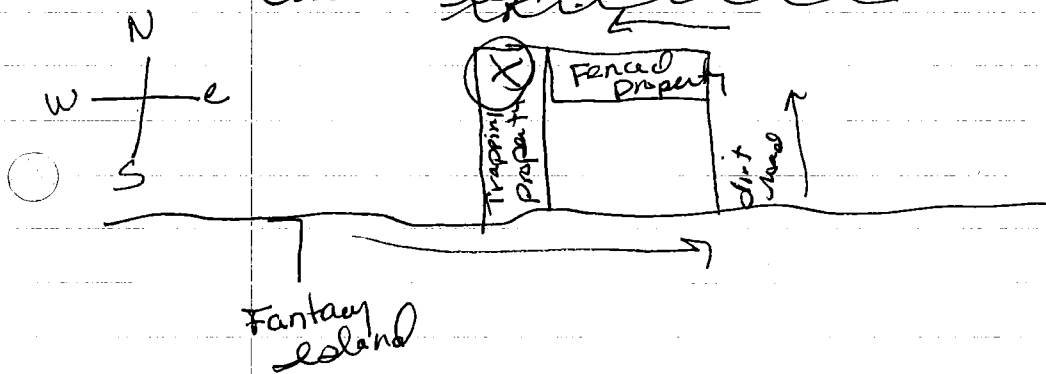

COWS!!!

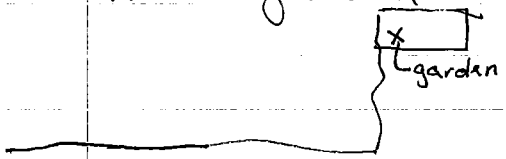

July-7-95

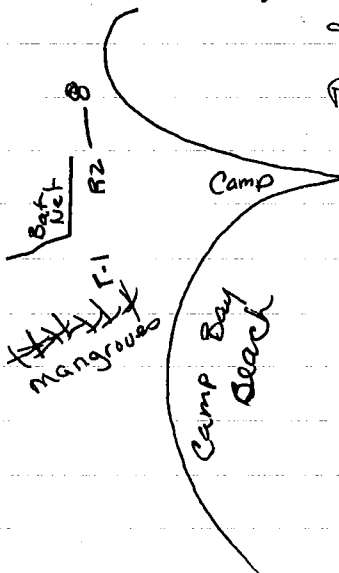

### Camp Bay habitat

rows 1 + 2 were in dense areas with a lot of leaf litter, twigs, etc.... The rest were in open areas consisting of coconut trees, mango trees + a few small shrubs. down by the sand was sea grape + almond - and an ~~area~~ area of mangroves.

Bait is oatmeal + vanilla  
tomohawk also had sardines

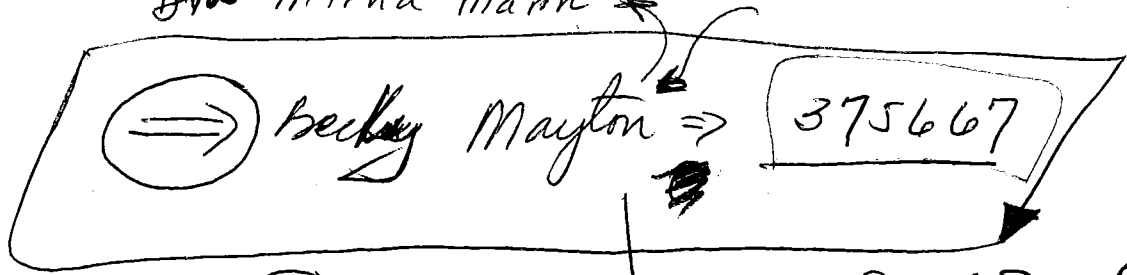
