An Important Question which some  
of our People would like to  
have Answered.

Several parties have recently inquired for an explanation of the following fact: It was reported that when the Indians came into Fort Stanton about a year ago that they were on foot and compelled to wait on the trail for transportation to be sent from the fort to help them in with their families. They have since been well fed and cared for, and have been always spoken of as peaceable. From being destitute of stock they have now from twelve to fifteen hundred head of horses and mules on hand, and the inquiry comes in very pertinently, how have they managed to raise that number in so short a time. Several parties who have recently been through their reservation state that the numbers cannot be less than the above.

At the last session of the court in Lincoln county the Indian agent there is reported to have said that Cadette did a large amount of trading at the stores, and when asked if Cadette had a salary from the government with which to pay his bills, he replied that Cadette paid in mules. We now have the authority of a gentleman well known throughout the territory that Cadette very lately presented the agent with a splendid pair of mules worth at least six hundred dollars. Where does Cadette get these mules, and where does he get so many horses? These are pertinent questions which the people want answered. We do not wish to do injustice to Cadette or his band or to the agent, but if they have a legitimate method of increasing stock so rapidly it is a matter of general interest and all stock-raisers in the country would like to know how it is done.

## CHIHUAHUA NEWS.

Last week we had supposed that the revolution in Chihuahua was ended and peace restored. An arrangement was effected by which both the revolutionary and government forces were to disband and the state government turned over to Terazas, while Guerra accepted the general amnesty. With this understanding the citizens of Chihuahua, who had taken refuge in El Paso, left for the city of Chihuahua, but their hopes were again doomed to disappointment. Up on the receipt of the latest news they hurried back to El Paso, and many other citizens of Chihuahua are coming into the same place for safety.

Terazas had disband his force according to agreement and went to meet Guerra, when the last report says he was seized and imprisoned. Guerra declaring it was done in retaliation for the killing of his men at Presidio del Norte. The agreement is broken up and worse confusion than ever reigns.

Trevino and Diaz are both reported in Chihuahua, and reports say refuse the amnesty. Apprehensions are now strongly felt that El Paso will be taken by the revolutionists, and will fall an easy prey, as the means for defence are very limited.

## Second National Bank of Santa Fe.

This point is the nearest to the diamond fields where an outfit can be obtained, and saves a long distance through the Apache country. Whether the reports of the existence of diamonds be true or not, a party starting from this point will go through the richest mineral region on this continent, and will demonstrate the truth or falsity of the existence of the Apache treasury for which several parties have hunted.

## California Has Started Another Immense Sensation.

Some man who lives in a dilapidated house on a back street is manufacturing pure gold from base metal; has entered into partnership with a banker and they propose to run the gold business for the world. The gold has been tested and coined and pronounced perfectly pure. The manufacturer has engaged to deliver tons of the precious metal and has already furnished a large amount. That's better than diamonds and rubies as the men are in no danger from Apaches.

We clip the following recipe from *The Industrial Age*, and it is worth trying:

**METALLIC SOAP FOR CANVAS.**—The following is highly recommended as a cheap and simple process for coating canvas for wagon tops, tents, awnings, etc. It renders it impermeable to moisture, without making it stiff and liable to break. Soft soap is to be dissolved in hot water, and a solution of sulphate of iron added. The sulphuric acid combines with the potash of the soap, and the oxide of iron is precipitated with the fatty acid as insoluble iron-soap. This is washed and dried, and mixed with linseed oil. The addition of dissolved India-rubber to the oil greatly improves the paint.

## Eight Children at a Birth.

On the 21st of August, Mrs. Timothy Bradlee, of Trumbull county, Ohio, gave birth to eight children—three boys and five girls. They are all living, and are healthy, but quite small. Mr. Bradlee was married six years ago to Fannie Mowery, who weighed two hundred and seventy-three pounds on the day of her marriage. She has given birth to two pairs of twins, and now eight more, making twelve children in six years. Mrs. Bradlee was a triplet, her mother and father both being twins, and her grandmother the mother of five pairs of twins.

**INDIANS RAISING STOCK.**—Last week the Indians raised several head of horses and mules from Trumbull belonging to Dr. Blazer, Nesmith, and others. Dr. Blazer and two men followed the trail leading through the Organ mountains toward Canada Alamo. The Indians who raised the stock were a small party, but were joined by about fifty others, when the three men in pursuit gave up the chase as too dangerous to follow.

**ANOTHER STOCK RANCH.**—The Indians who are raising stock in Grant county understand their business, and are more successful than in any other ranch in the country. A letter from Silver City of the 7th says: "Yesterday the Indians ran off twenty mules belonging to a train from Cimarron that were camped two miles from town. A scout from Bayard passed here to-day in pursuit."

## PROSPECTO.

Ha experimentado un gran desarrollo sin interrupcion, ha acrecentado constantemente y ofrece al estudiante todas las facilidades para adquirir una educacion liberal.

La Institucion posee un Museo valioso, que tiene una gran variedad de muestras, autas de arte y de naturas especiales de las diferentes partes del globo, especialmente de nuestra patria; tambien unos completos y hermosos Apartas Filosóficos y Químicos, la biblioteca perteneciente a la Institucion cubren mas que 16,000 tomos, abarcando casi todos ramos de la literatura y ciencias, y contiene muchas obras raras e interesantes. Las ciencias Literarias, la disposicion de los estudiantes, forman una coleccion de mas de 20,000 tomos.

## REGULACIONES GENERALES.

El año Académico comienza en una sesion, comen-zando el primer Lunes de Septiembre, terminando en el ultimo Jueves de Junio, cuando el conmentario anual, confiere de grados, y la distribucion de premios tomara lugar.

La sesion es dividida en dos terminos, la primera termino en el dia primero de Febrero, y la segunda el ultimo Jueves de Junio. Un Ductor de cada termino disuamente visita la Institucion. El conmentario anual y atencion es dada a los enfermos.

Los Profesores á la memoria de los estudiantes son miembros de la Iglesia Católica. Fajillas de excomunion son admitidas, pero los que ellos concienten estar en atencion a la causa religiosa, pueden bucar.

El dinero de bolsa de los estudiantes ha de ser depositado con el Tesorero, y es el dinero de la Facultad que se usa para el pago de los gastos de los estudiantes, y cada semana son permitidos.
