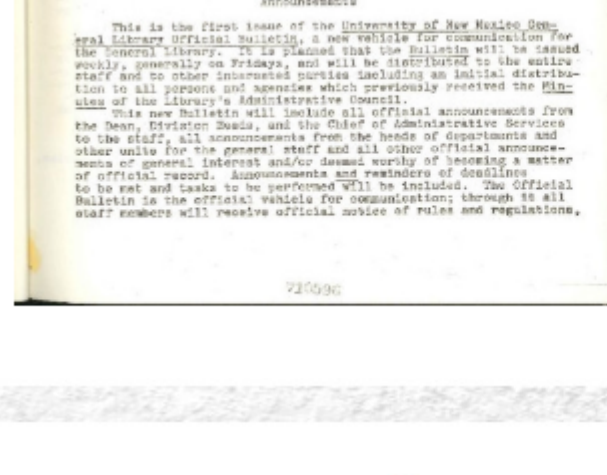

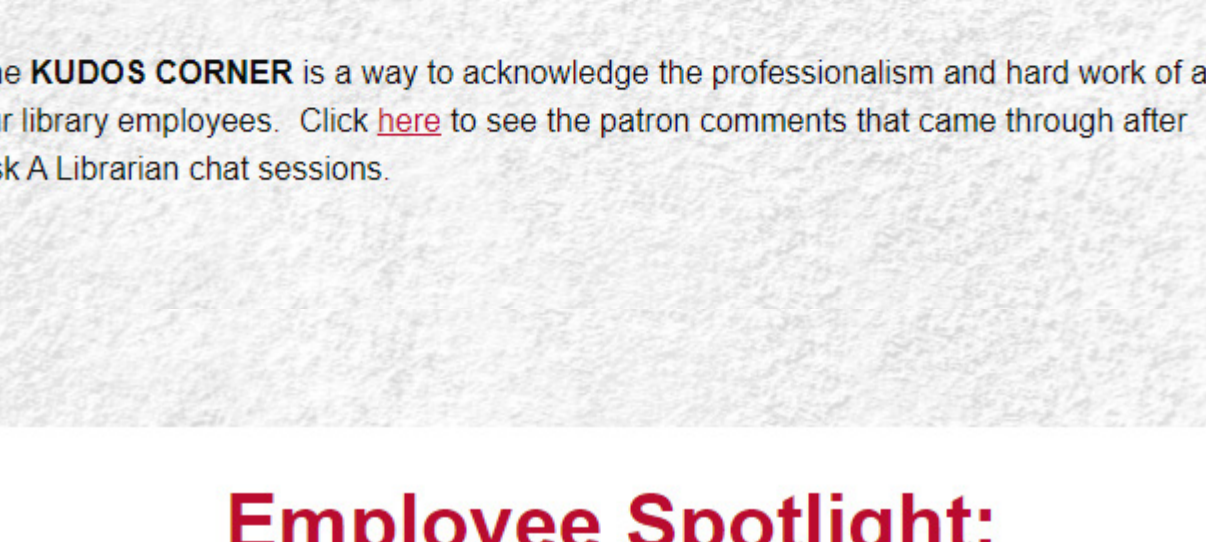
Get to Know Your Neighbor: OILS



The OILS program has experienced a lot of change recently. As the fall semester begins, OILS will have:

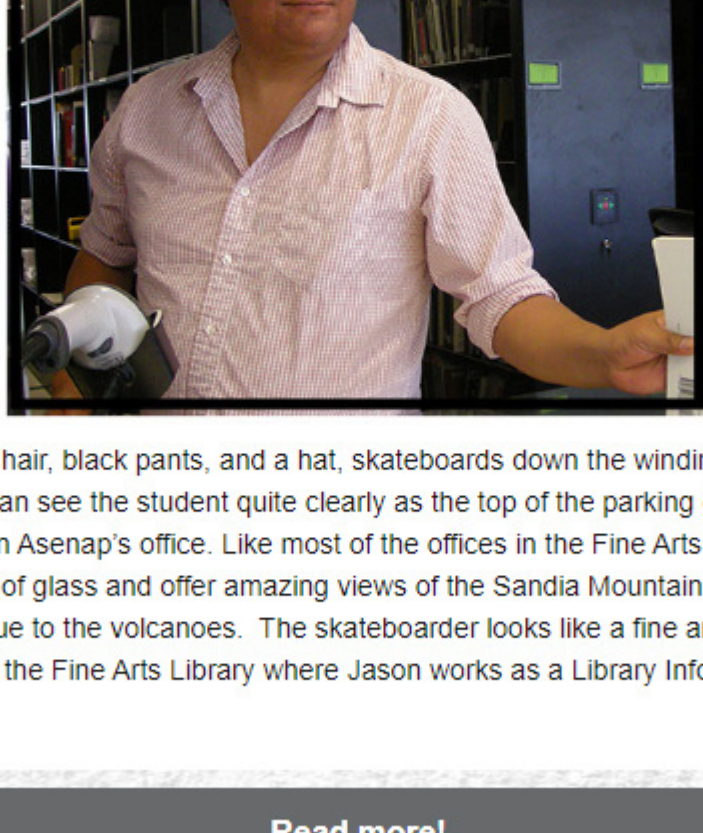
- A new faculty member

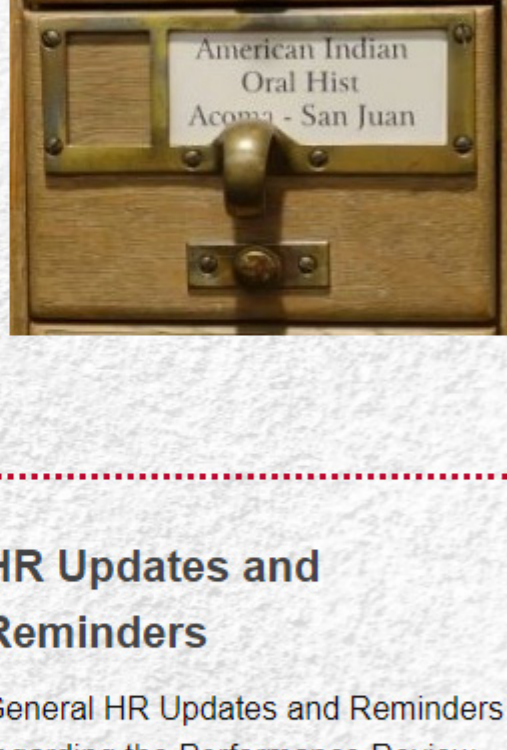
Tech Tip
