1. ROBERT GLEW, professor in the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology at the UNM School of Medicine, was recently awarded the Paul Brindley Distinguished Professorship in Pathology by the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston. The professorship recognizes academic excellence in the study of pathology.

2. UNM'S COLLEGE OF EDUCATION has received a \$65,000 grant from the New Mexico State Department of Education to assist the state in widespread efforts to improve education and school participation for students with disabilities. The grant will help New Mexico comply with requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act by helping teachers educate students in more inclusive environments.
