1. PEDIATRICS PROFESSOR Andrew Hsi, M.D. is the first recipient of the Humanism in Medicine Award presented by the American Association of Medical Colleges. Nominated by his students, Hsi is the director of the Newborn Nursery at University Hospital and founder of the Los Pasos Program.

2. UNM REGENTS APPROVED A REQUEST FOR A 5.7% COMPENSATION increase as their highest priority for the 2000 legislative session. This is part of the Operating Budget Legislative Funding Requirements to be considered by the NM Commission on Higher Education and the NM Legislature. The proposed budget, approved on Tuesday, also calls for a 2.4% increase in workload and base adjustments and a 3.9% increase in instruction and general (I and G) enhancements.

Bailey challenges perceptions of the revolution as simply a triumph of free love arguing, instead that it was a product of Post-war social and economic conditions and the mass media explosion.
