DEVELOPMENT PRIORITIES

- * **work out a proposal submission for NIDR that is consistent with their level of funding and allows AIO to take the issue management training process to one "reservation tribe" and one "non reservation/allotment" tribe**
- * **propose that census volume on Indian tribes be incorporated with the telecommunications project**
- * **propose AIO management of EPA Clearinghouse and possible tie it into the telecommunications project as well**
- * **recast the the planning grant proposal for the Telecommunications Project and submit to the Northwest or Macarthur Foundations**
- * **develop proposal to ANA to underwrite the development of a U.S. FAX Directory. Also watch for opportunity to develop one for the Americas as part of the Quincentenary.**
- * **give Ron Andrade copy of Economic Flows project and see if the Energy Dept is willing to assume the lead role**
- * **investigate the Rural Fellows program to see if we can use one of our projects such as the Fax Directory or the Indian Census volume**
- * **follow-up proposal for community-based health issue management forum with JoAnn Kauffman**
- * **develop proposal to fund LaDonna's participation in the Papua New Guinea's *Culture and Development Seminar***
- * **JoAnn to review the IHS Evaluation project re: possible AIO participation**
- * **submission to church to provide AIO house as a charity**
- * **submission on provision of car for AIO**
