Salvadoran Government Expels Three European Journalists

On Sept. 26, Salvadoran officials expelled three Western European journalists after having them imprisoned for five days. The reporters are Eric Venturini (French) and Michel Stumrenberg (West German) of the Vorwaerts magazine, and Alain Hertohe (Belgian), of Luxembourg radio and TV, and the daily newspaper LE SOIR. Army troops arrested the three on Sept. 22 near Dulce Nombre de Maria, a town in the northern department Chalatenango, after interviewing rebel leaders in guerrilla-controlled areas.
