BRIEF RESUME OF ANNUAL REPORTS OF NRJ/NMLR FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1975-76

NATURAL RESOURCES JOURNAL

During its 15th year of publication, more pages were printed than ever before as, simultaneously, a new high in subscription sales income was reached.

In March, 1976, the Journal co-sponsored at Kino Bay, Sonora, Mexico, a conference on The Ecology of the Gulf of California. Papers from this meeting will be published in the July 1976 issue.

Plans for the coming year include publication of symposia on "Water Management in a Developing World," and "Energy and the Rocky Mountain Region."

8,200 copies of four issues containing 916 pages were published at a cost of \$19,398.51. Volume cost increased to \$9.44 per four issues, an increase of \$.96 over the previous fiscal year. Subscriptions will be renewed for \$13. per volume through January 1977; thereafter rates will rise to \$14. per year.

Expenditures exclusive of wages and salaries totalled \$24,629.53. Earned income totalled \$25,849.20, with \$2,520. of that amount in accounts receivable at the close of the fiscal year.

NEW MEXICO LAW REVIEW

A special issue was published on November 1, 1975, for distribution to members of the State Bar and other friends of the Law School. A POLITICAL HISTORY OF THE NEW MEXICO SUPREME COURT, 1912-1972, was written by Susan B. Roberts, Ph.D.

Plans for the coming year include a change in designated dates of publication from "November" to "Winter" and from "May" to "Summer."

1,900 copies of two issues containing 374 pages were published at a cost of \$7,175.88. 2,500 copies of the 80 page special issue cost \$2,196.00. Volume cost was \$7.58 for two issues, a decrease of \$.42 from the previous year. Subscriptions are being renewed at \$10. for Volume 7 (winter and summer 1977).

Expenditures exclusive of wages and salaries totalled \$10,232.91. Earned income totalled \$6,263.64, with \$215.50 of that amount in accounts receivable on 6/30/76.

The half-time position needs to be increased to 25-30 hours per week for the next (1977-78) fiscal year.
