For the Fiscal Year July 1, 1974 - June 30, 1975

In March, 1975, the New Mexico Law Review was host review to the National Conference of Law Reviews annual meeting, at a series of seminars at the Hilton Inn. The final event of the Conference was a banquet addressed by Dean Soia Mentschikoff of the University of Florida Law School. Third year student Michael Campbell served as Chairman of the Conference.

Readership of the Law Review was 679 at the close of its fifth year of publication. A solicitation for additional subscriptions is planned for the 1975-76 fiscal year.

Review of Publication Year

Lead articles published during the year were: "The Community Property Act of 1973: A Commentary and Quasi-Legislative History," "The Treble Damage Provision--Jury Instructions in Perspective," "The Confusing Law of Criminal Intent in New Mexico," "The Writ of Prohibition in New Mexico," "The Legal Education of Chicano Students," "Tax Consequences of Divorce in NM," and "Rape

Plans for the Coming Year

The November 1975 issue will include the following: "Uniform Probate Code," by Garrett Flickinger; "The Role of the Lawyer in Society," by Lee Teitelbaum; "Changes in the Model Business Corporations Act in New Mexico," by Charles Wellborn and Suzanne Barker; and "Malpractice--H.M.O's," by Robert Meyer. In addition, student notes on landlord-tenant relations, by Carl Calvert, and double jeopardy, by Leslie Harris, are scheduled for publication in November.

The May 1976 issue will include student notes on election reform, by Betsy Cunningham, and due process claims, by Lynn Slade. Lead articles are not committed except for a Survey of New Mexico Law, which will comprise a large part of that issue.

In addition to the November 1975 and May 1976 issues, a special issue will be published in October 1975, to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the first graduating class of the Law School, and the 50th anniversary of the New Mexico State Bar. This issue will be entirely devoted to "The History of the New Mexico Supreme Court," a previously unpublished Ph.D. dissertation by Susan Roberts. It will be sent to all members of the New Mexico Bar and to other friends of the Law School and appropriate public libraries and institutions.

Finances

Two issues were printed during the year, at a total billed printing cost of \$7,056.38, including reprints. This breaks down to a per single copy printing cost of \$3.98, compared to \$4.01 in the 1973-74 fiscal year. The subscription rate was raised from \$7. per year to \$9, beginning with the November 1974 issue.
