## From HSLIC's Executive Director

First, the news: The groundbreaking for construction of the Domenici Center, Phase III, has been scheduled for June 2, with completion estimated in early July 2017. Also, we anticipate that the new 49-seat classroom on the library's 4th floor will be ready for use on June 1.

Now, continuing the story of HSLIC's history as part of its upcoming 70th anniversary: Robert Divett was one of the UNM School of Medicine's founding faculty members and the director of the Library of Medical Sciences, followed in 1977 by Erika Love, who served as the director of the Medical Center Library. In 1997, I was hired as the director of the Health Sciences Center Library, which was renamed the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center in FY2001. Two of the directors have been elected to serve as president of the Medical Library Association. Today, HSLIC has 31 faculty and staff members. Since 2012, Kiyoi has been the director of the San Francisco General Hospital Barnett–Briggs Medical Library of the University of California. In that role, he oversees the library’s activities and programs; recruits and manages staff; and leads grants for patient education, archives and research. He is a principal investigator on a new NLM information resource grant to reduce health disparities. The grant will support the research and development of better ways to engage safety-net patients with personal health records.

He also serves as the president of the Northern California and Nevada Medical Library Group (NCNMLG), a regional chapter of the Medical Library Association. NCNMLG is instrumental in connecting, educating, and empowering health sciences librarians.

Previously, Kiyoi was an Associate Fellow with the National Library of Medicine, where he led projects in mobile web design, outreach to special populations and legislative advocacy. He has an MLIS from UCLA and an MS in Healthcare Administration and Interprofessional Leadership from the University of California, San Francisco.

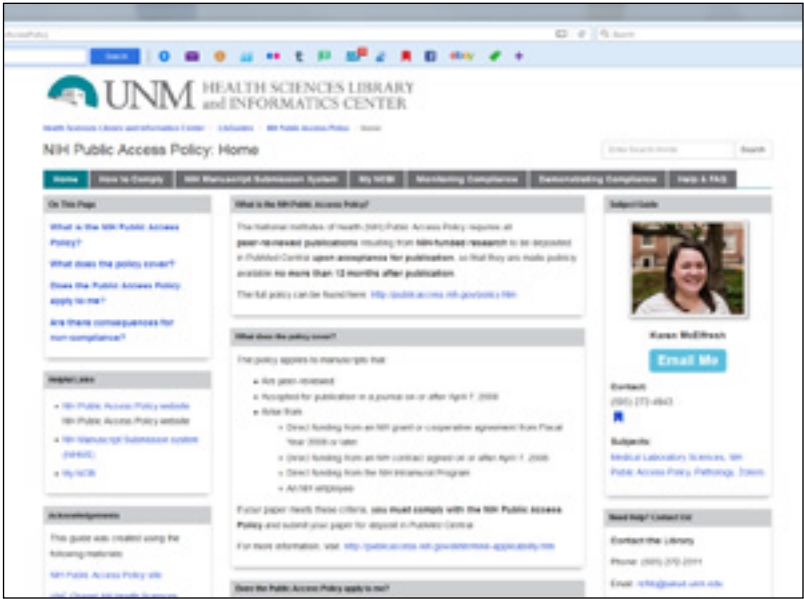

If you are an NIH-funded researcher, you may be interested in HSLIC’s NIH Public Access Policy LibGuide at <http://libguides.health.unm.edu/NIHPublicAccessPolicy> (screen shot shown at left). The guide provides information on how to comply with the NIH Public Access Policy, which applies to all peer-reviewed journal publications resulting from NIH-funded research. The guide explains how to submit your manuscript to the NIH Manuscript Submission System, monitor compliance in MyNCBI, and demonstrate compliance in grant renewals and applications.

**Ingrid C. Hendrix**, HSLIC's Nursing Services Librarian, had a revised a chapter titled "Evidence" published recently in the second edition of the nursing textbook *Concepts for Nursing Practice*, edited by Jean Foret Giddens.
