THE UNM BOARD OF REGENTS voted unanimously to award the construction contract for the UNM Children's Hospital and Critical Care Pavilion project to a joint venture between Jaynes Corporation of Albuquerque and JE Dunn Construction of Kansas City, Mo. The companies submitted a low net bid of \$129,355,500.
