In the next two years more than fifteen-million dollars will be spent on construction which is to include a two-million dollar recital hall for the new Fine Arts Center, a two-million dollar addition to Zimmerman Library, a Physics building and a Biology building which, together will cost three-million dollars, a Medical School to cost five-million dollars, and residence halls costing two to three-million dollars. Additional instructional buildings are also planned for the near future.

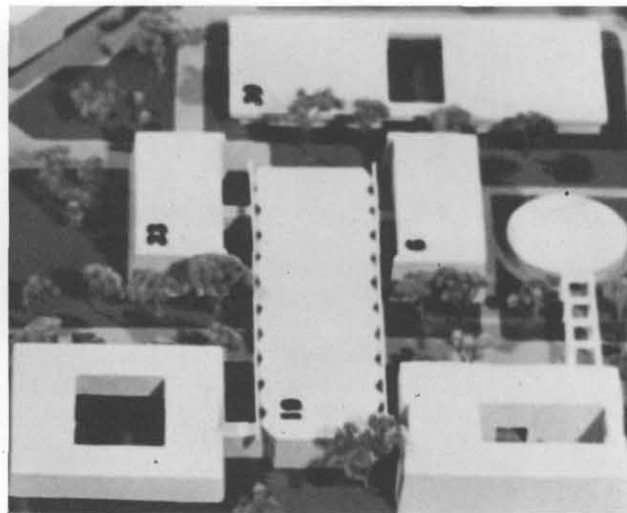
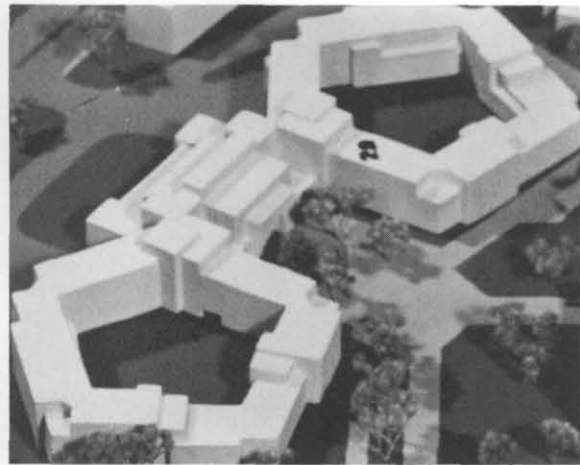

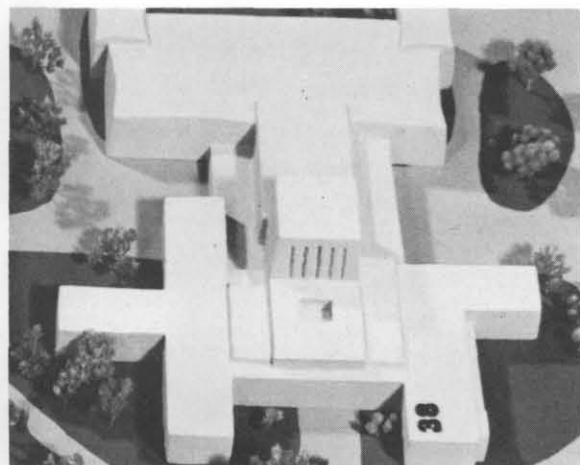

Physical increase, however, is not the only consideration in planning for the future. In this, our 75th year, our thinking is directed toward a close look at the campus as it is now with emphasis on Southwestern studies, analyzing its strengths and its weaknesses, and planning for the UNM with a 25,000 enrollment predicted for the late 1970's.

It is predicted that new techniques and media will have to be employed to allow the faculty to reach a maximum number of students. Budgets will tighten and admissions will be much more selective. Some of the increase will be absorbed by vocational schools and junior colleges.

The graduate schools and the schools of medicine and nuclear engineering are predicted to receive large proportional increases, while the national need for specialists in foreign languages, education, geography, area studies, science and engineering will demand the development of these departments. Some curricula will be liberalized probably by extending the professional programs to five years.

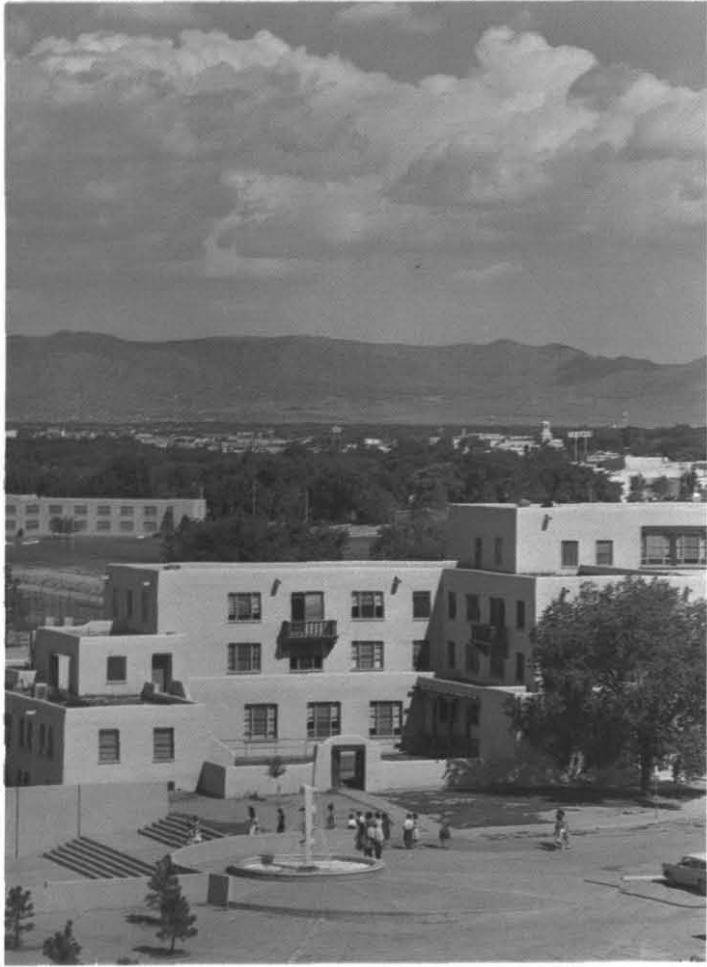
The university is to be designed with three distinct campuses—a central campus to focus around the main library, containing the bulk of the classrooms; a north campus to house the Medical Center, student residence facilities and service facilities; and a south campus to be used for intercollegiate athletic fields, student housing, and research units.

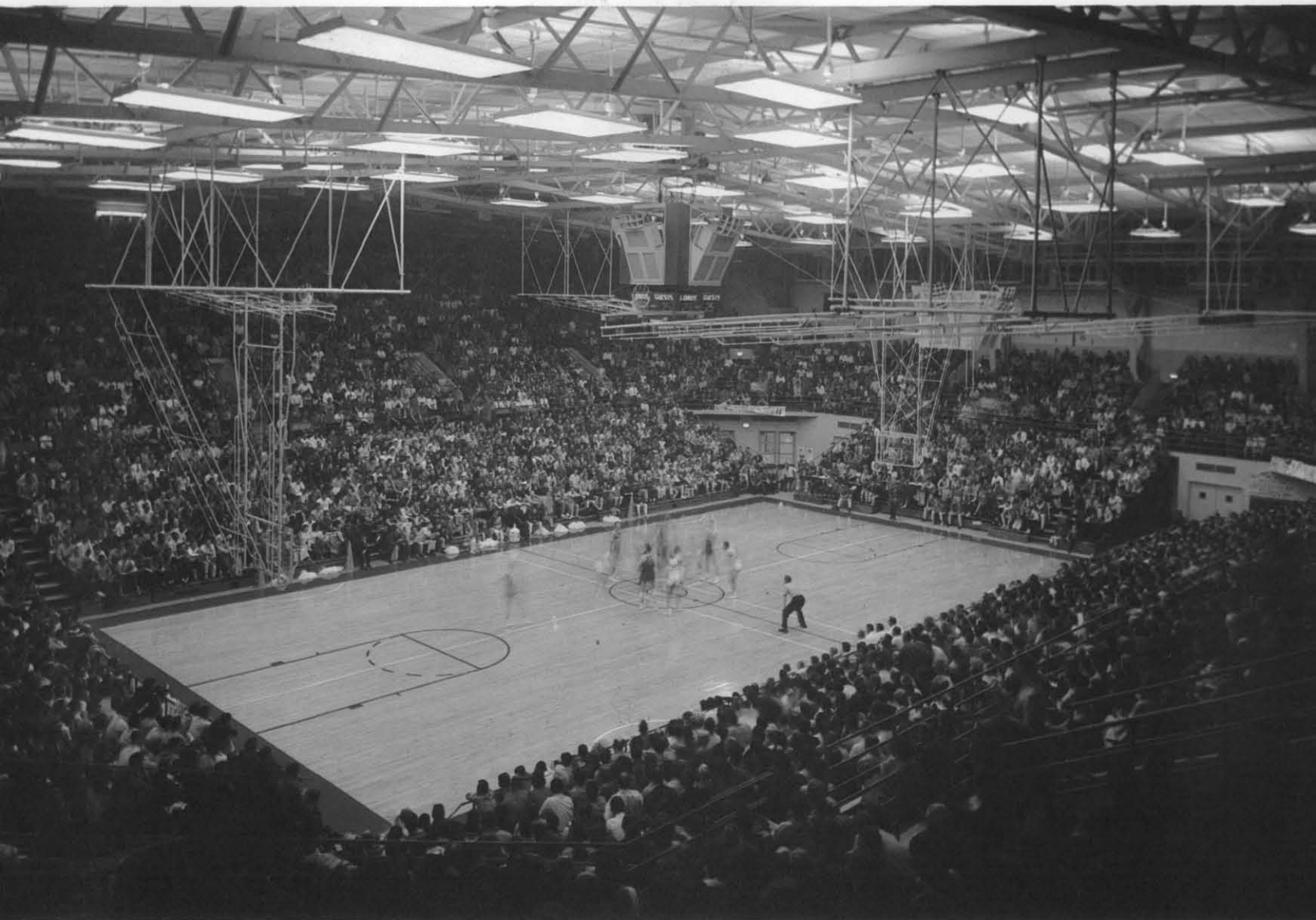

The central campus will be situated so that all classes will be within a ten-minute walking distance. Buildings of related fields will be grouped together in complexes. Research units will be more consolidated so that there will not be a duplication of facilities. Vocational schools, administrative offices, and housing will be moved to the periphery or to the north or south campus.

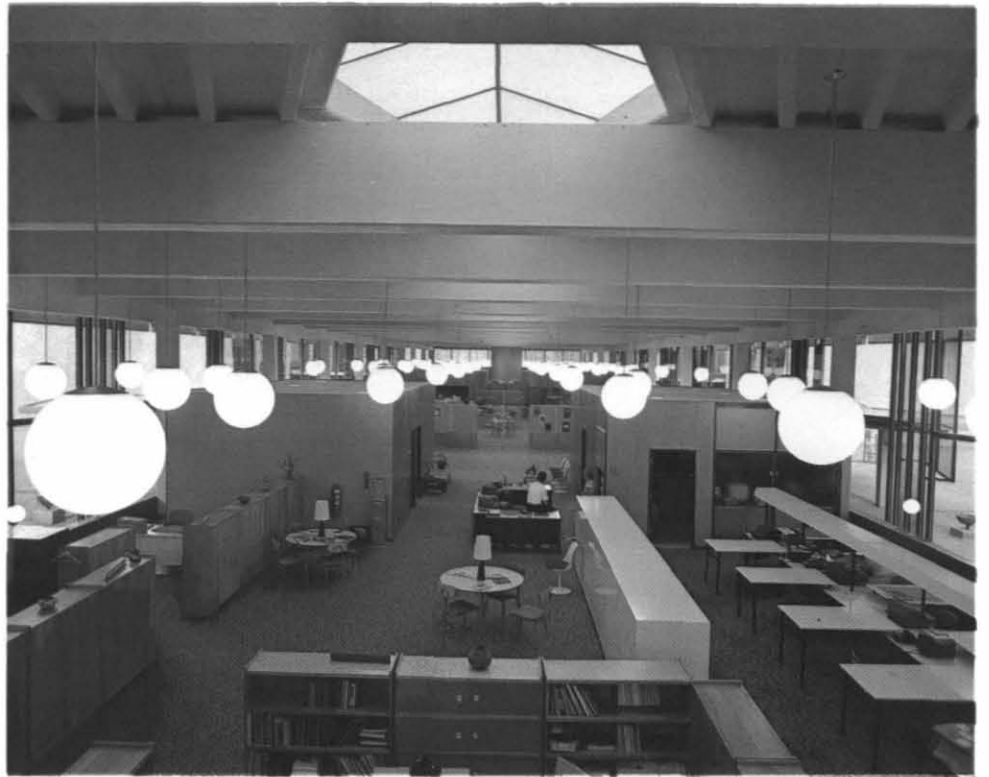


A central pedestrian mall and "green" in front of the library will have a reflecting pool, marking the center of the campus. What is now Cornell Drive between Johnson Gym and the Union will become a mall planned as a free-moving paved plaza, broken by grass carpet and trees in seat-height boxes, and culminating in the sculptured fountain at the College of Education entrance. Turning this corner, one will look from a broad raised terrace under a pavilion of trees down the park-like Humanities Mall, bordered with irregular masses of Ponderosa Pines and spring-flowering trees, to the fine little chapel at the far end. This mall will be laced with freely curving paths within oval and circular frames, designed to combine overall form with functional circulation.



Crossing it at right angles, parallel to Cornell Mall, a long canal will bisect the Campus, centering on a large lagoon in front of the library. This canal will be bridged by several main crosswalks, which will make it part of the daily experience of most students and faculty.

In the interest of maintaining the unity of architecture already established, the modified pueblo style will be continued.



The use of terraced, flat-roofed and rectangular faced masses, earth colors in exterior stucco walls and the softening of parapets and exterior corners all create the image of the ancient dwellings that once existed in this area.

The campus will become strictly pedestrian with broad walking lanes and only a few access roads. A loop surrounding the central campus will allow automotive admission to the parking areas. It is estimated that 7000 to 8000 parking spaces will be needed to accommodate 25,000 students.

The central campus will be grouped around the library. Directly to the south will be the Fine Arts complex, already initiated, and the Social Science complex which will replace Zimmerman Stadium and the old football field.

The Physical Science buildings will be grouped around the present Biology and Geology buildings, while many additions will be made to the existing engineering group. Mesa Vista residence hall will house student services, and some additions will be made to



The residence halls will be on the periphery of the central campus east of the instructional area. Two high-rise residence halls will be built, one east of Santa Clara and the other on the present baseball diamond.

The North Campus, now the University golf course, will house the new Medical School, while the South Campus will include the present football stadium, a baseball field, a research park, recreational facilities and student housing.

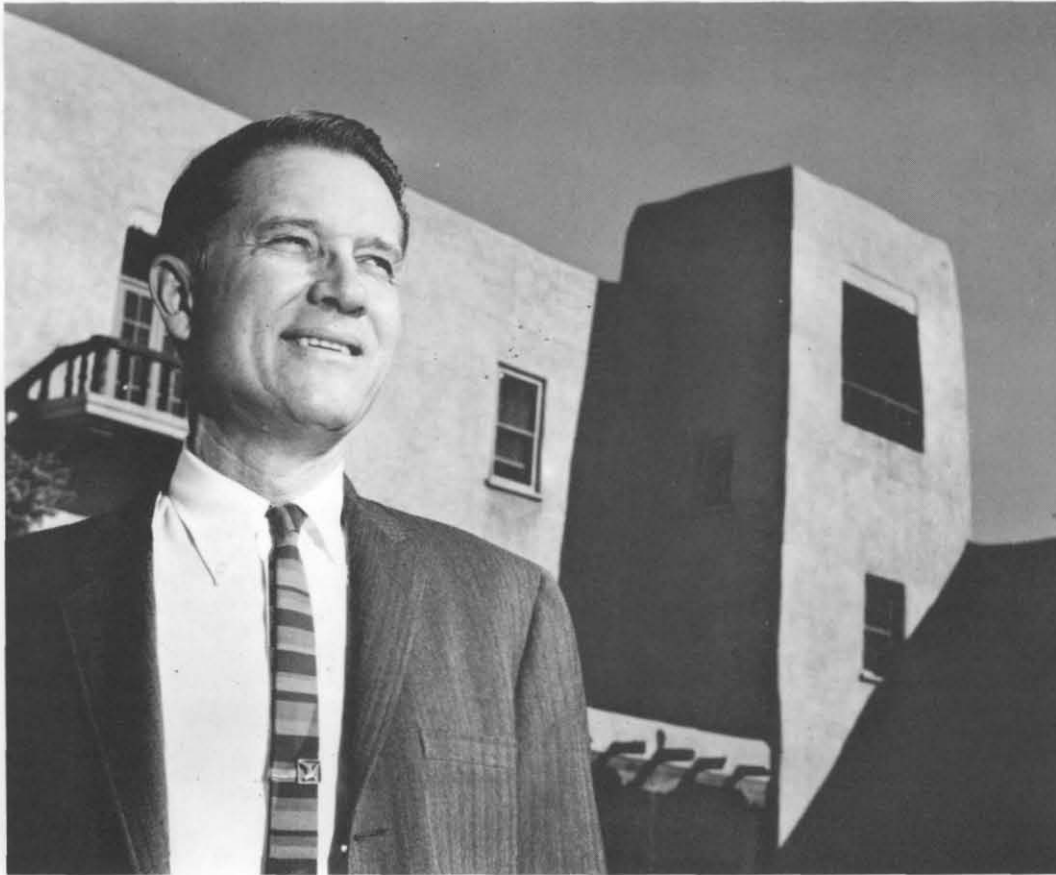

The University Board of Regents consists of five members appointed by the Governor of New Mexico for a term of six years. They meet once each month during the academic year to decide on administrative policies concerning proposed budgets, major construction contracts, building-bond issues, general University policies, and sales and purchases of University land.



University business is divided into three main sections. The first section is headed by Hoyt Trowbridge, which is in general control of all departments and which formulates the basic academic program and plans for the growth of the University.

The second section is the business department, led by John Perovich, the comptroller. The third division deals directly with the student and his problems. This section is headed by Sherman Smith, the dean of students.

The personnel deans offer individual counseling to any student seeking help with financial, academic, or personal problems. In addition, the deans are responsible for counseling programs in the residence halls; they act as advisers to honorary organizations; and they supervise rush in the social fraternities and sororities.

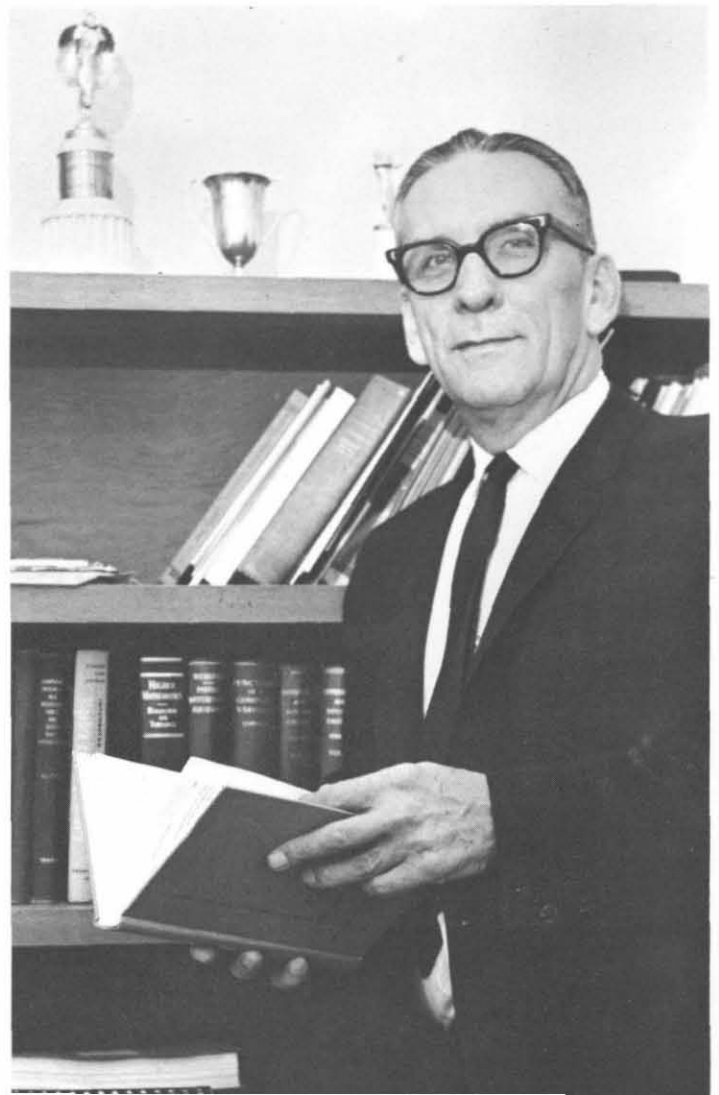
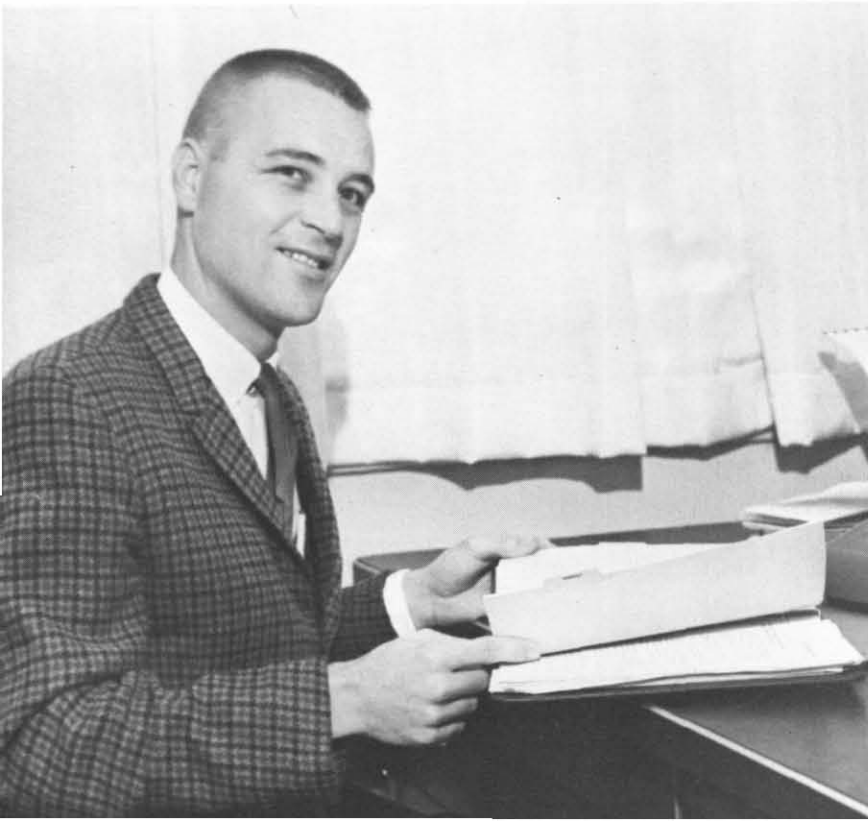

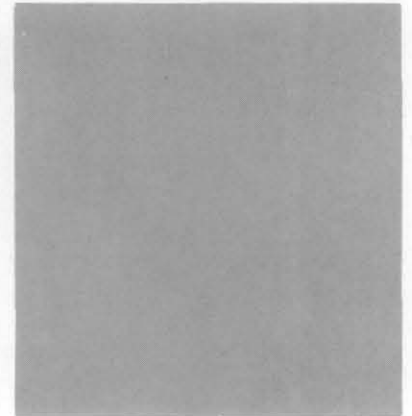


STUDENT COUNCIL

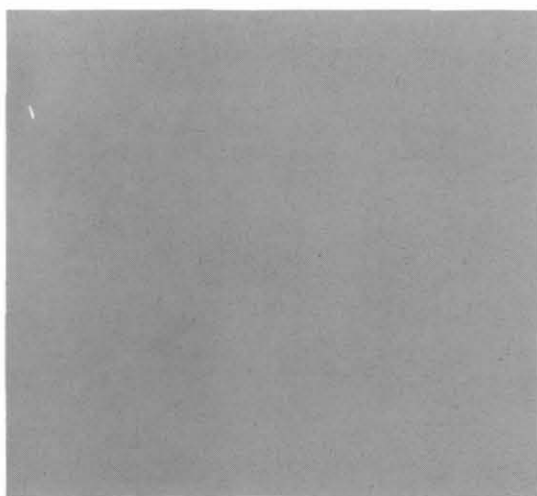

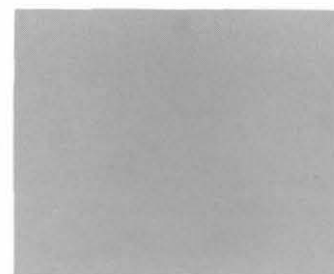

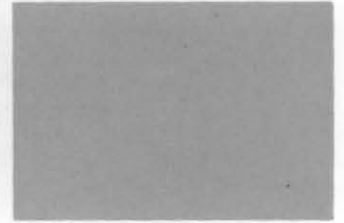

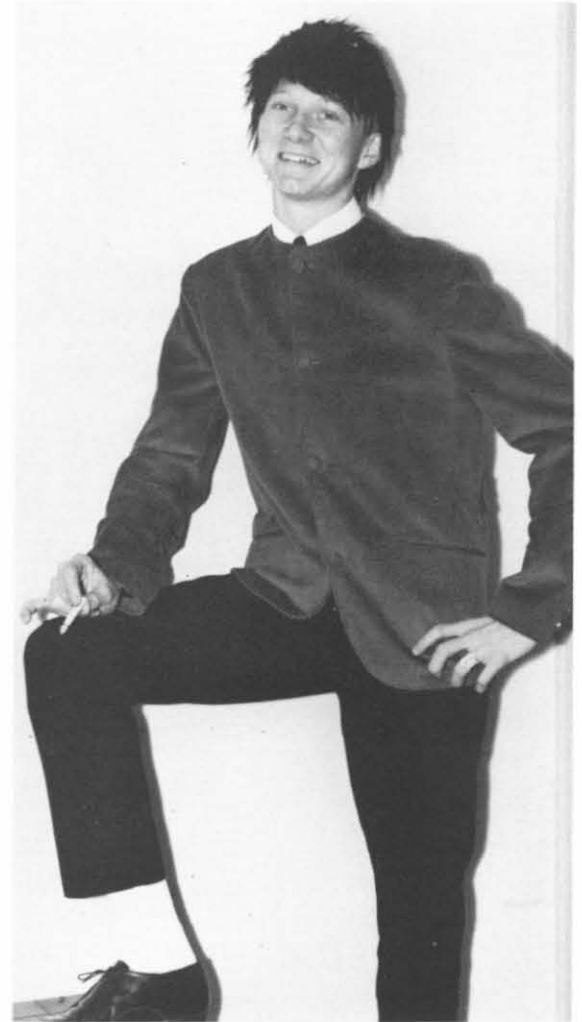

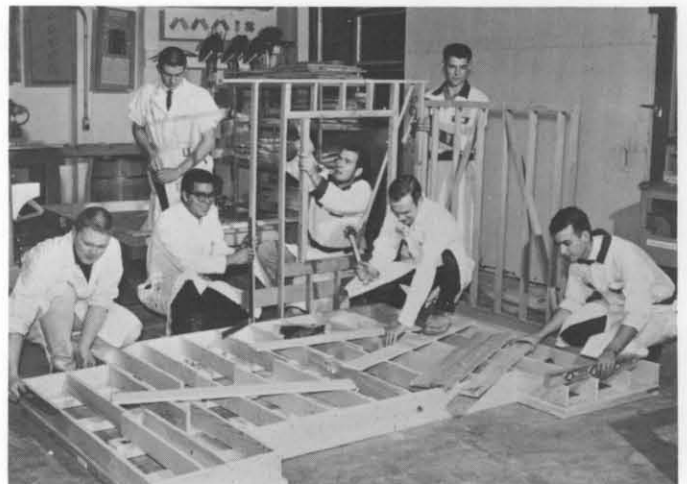

The girls in Little Sisters of Minerva are members of a unique group on campus. They serve as an auxiliary to Sigma Alpha Epsilon, a social fraternity. They must maintain a 2.4 grade point average and must have attended UNM for no less than two semesters.

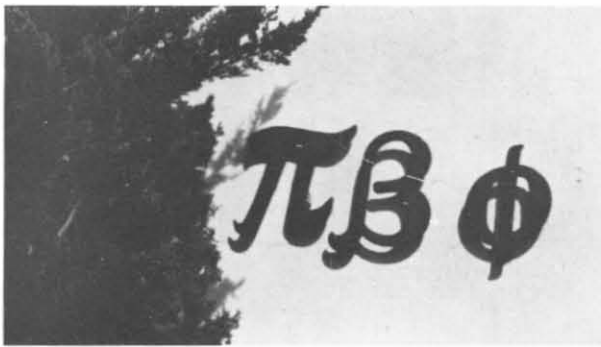
The Theta Chapter at UNM was established as Gamma Omicron Chapter in 1948. This year, the Thetas welcome their new house mother, Mrs. Fischer.

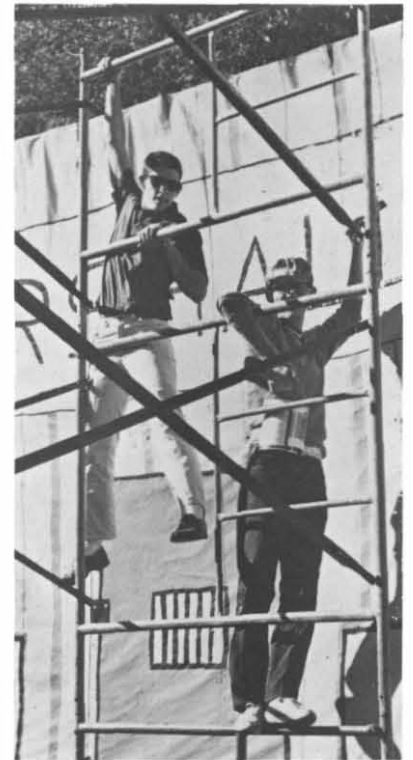
From planning stage . . .

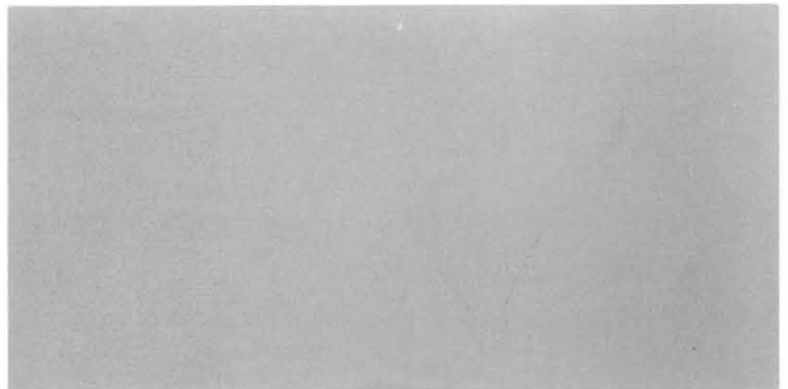

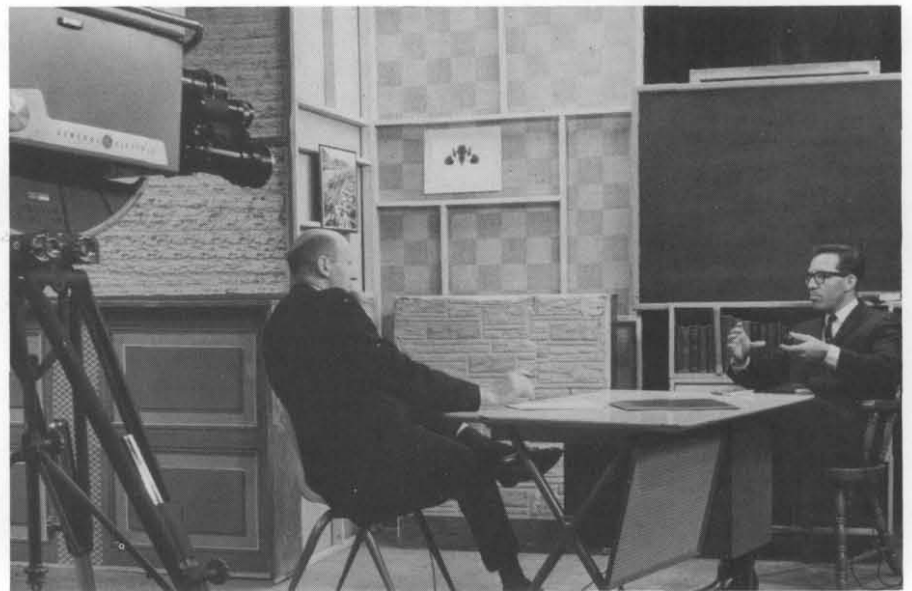

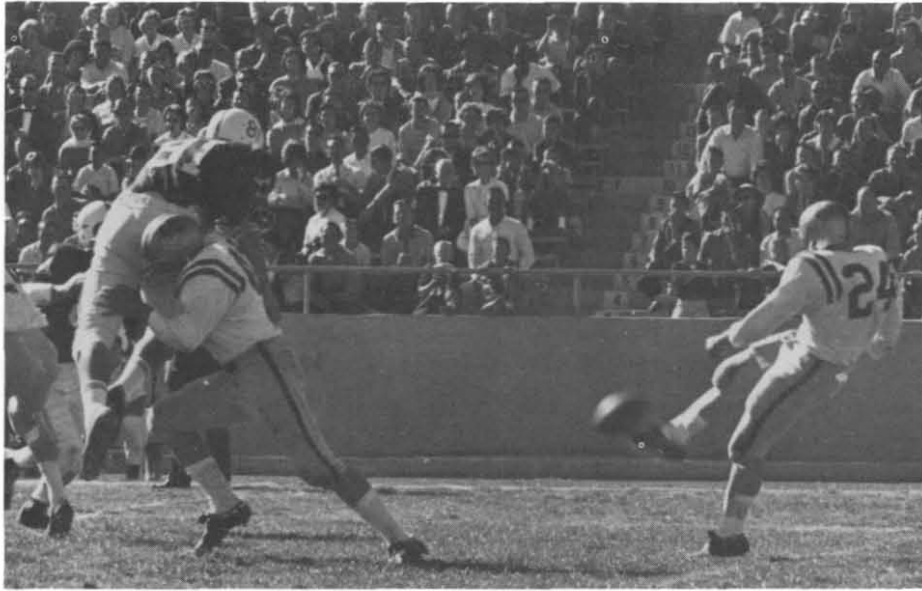

THE SEASON

Texas Western: Many questions were to be answered that night. Did we have a quarterback? How good were we? Could we beat Western? The Lobos played well and to the surprise of many, downed the Miners, 23-7.

Utah: Hopes were high for a Lobo victory but a seasoned Utah quarterback named Hertzfelt and a hard running backfield stunned the Wolfpack, 19-6.

Utah State: "The Monsters of the Cache Valley," as they are unaffectionately known by their opponents, lived up to their title when they downed the UNM Lobos. The passing of Utah Bill Munson and the three deep platoon system of Coach Ralston proved to be too much for some valiant play and out-manned interior line. Final score, 47-14.

New Mexico State: It seemed as though the Lobos couldn't buy a victory after that Saturday night in Las Cruces. Playing on a soggy turf, the Lobo running game was slowed down considerably. Once again, it was a quarterback, Armando Alba, that did the damage. A fine 40 yard run by tailback Joel Harris, which resulted in the Lobo's second score of the night, went by the wayside as the Aggies' proved true. The pack went down, 13-12.

Montana: Ah, things started to look better. The Lobo running game finally got into high gear and the Wolfpack had a victory, 24-6. Led by quarterback Stan Quintana and backs Bucky Stallings and Joel Harris, and inspired by the fine interior line play of Eddie Stokes and Gary Plumlee, the Lobos defeated the Grizzlies.

Wyoming: This bright, sunny day in University Stadium proved to be lucky for the pack as the experience of the last five games began to tell. The Lobos, led by sophomore quarterback Stan Quintana, simply "out-toughed" the Cowboy squad from Laramie and sent them back to the bunkhouse with a 17-6 defeat.

Air Force: Hopes were high for a Lobo upset, but a cold afternoon and a young man named Isaacson iced the dream of many a Lobo fan. Escaping from the hands of the would-be Lobo tacklers, the running Falcon led his team to a 30-8 victory.

Brigham Young: Hard hitting, good passing, and brilliant running by Lobo backs were the criteria for UNM victory number four. They were avenging a loss which kept the pack out of the race for a while last year and they were not to be denied this day. Good defense by Eddie Stokes, Jack Abendshan, and Chuck Kelly paved the way for the Lobo offense as they defeated the Cougars 26-0.

Arizona: Postponed by the death of the late President John F. Kennedy, the game in Tucson was championship material. Only 17,000 fans turned out to see the game that day. The Lobos, smelling another championship, rode the wave of solid defense coupled with brilliant offense to smother the Wildcats, 22-15. The Kit Carson Rifle, "Lonesome," and the respect of the Lobo fans who had watched their early losses, were regained.

Congratulations to a fine group of men—Western Athletic Conference Champs for the second consecutive year.





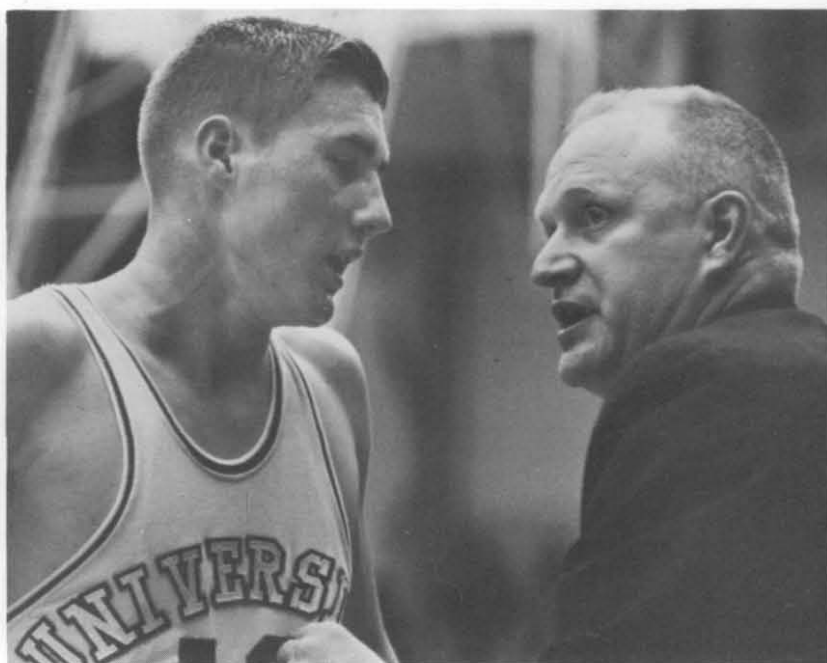

GYMNASTICS

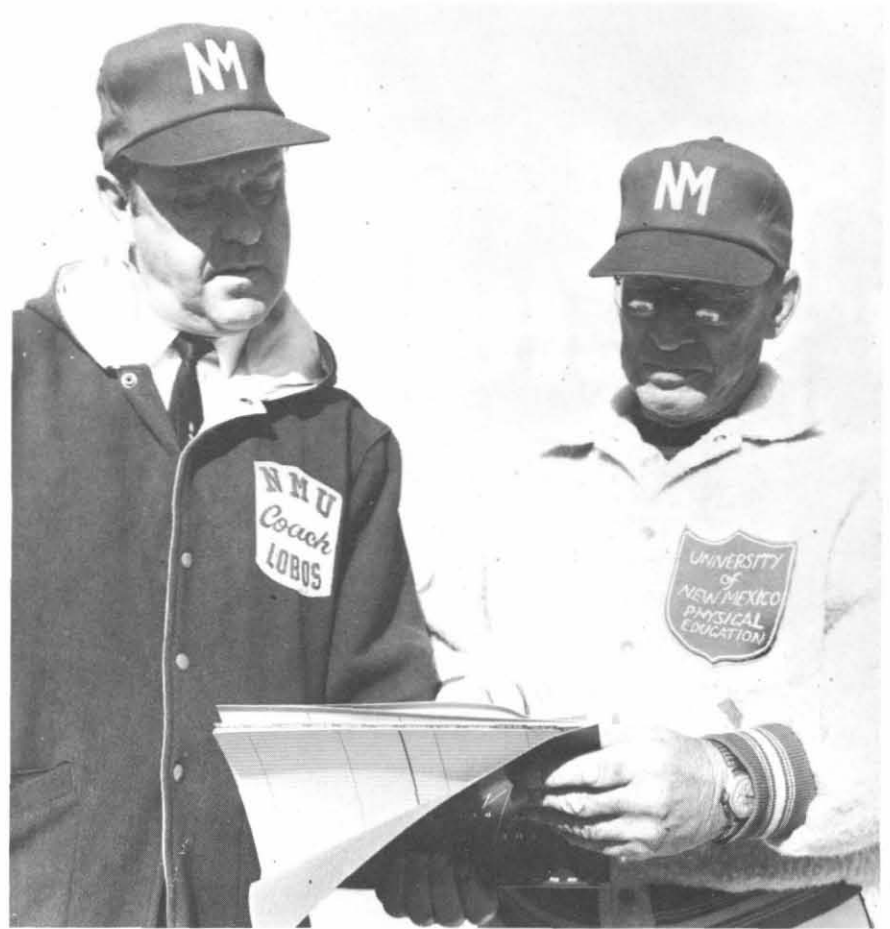

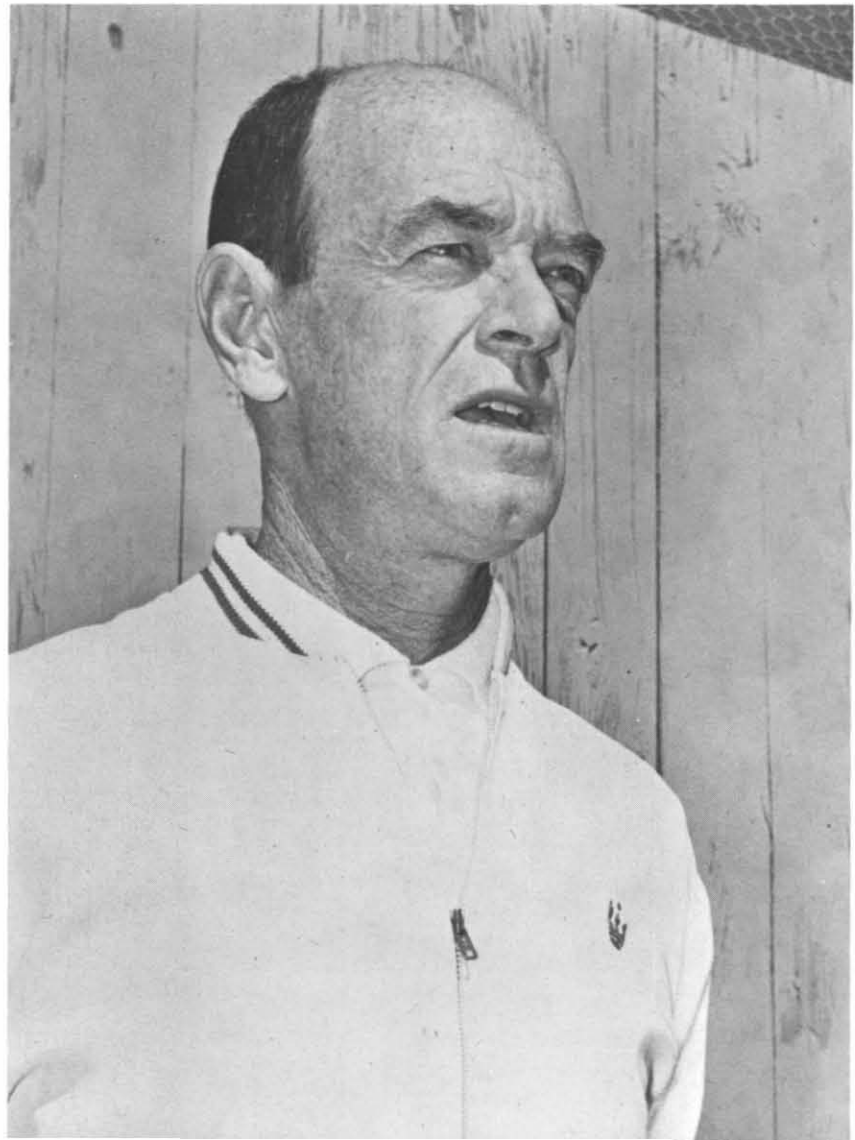

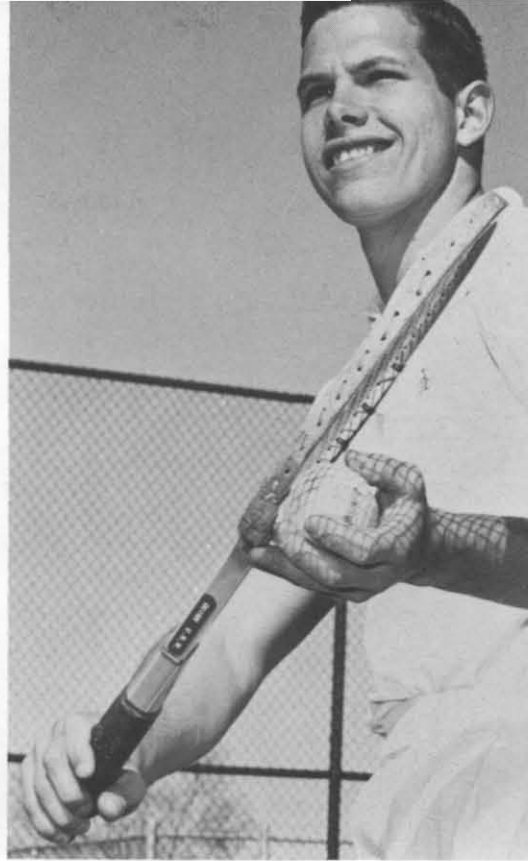

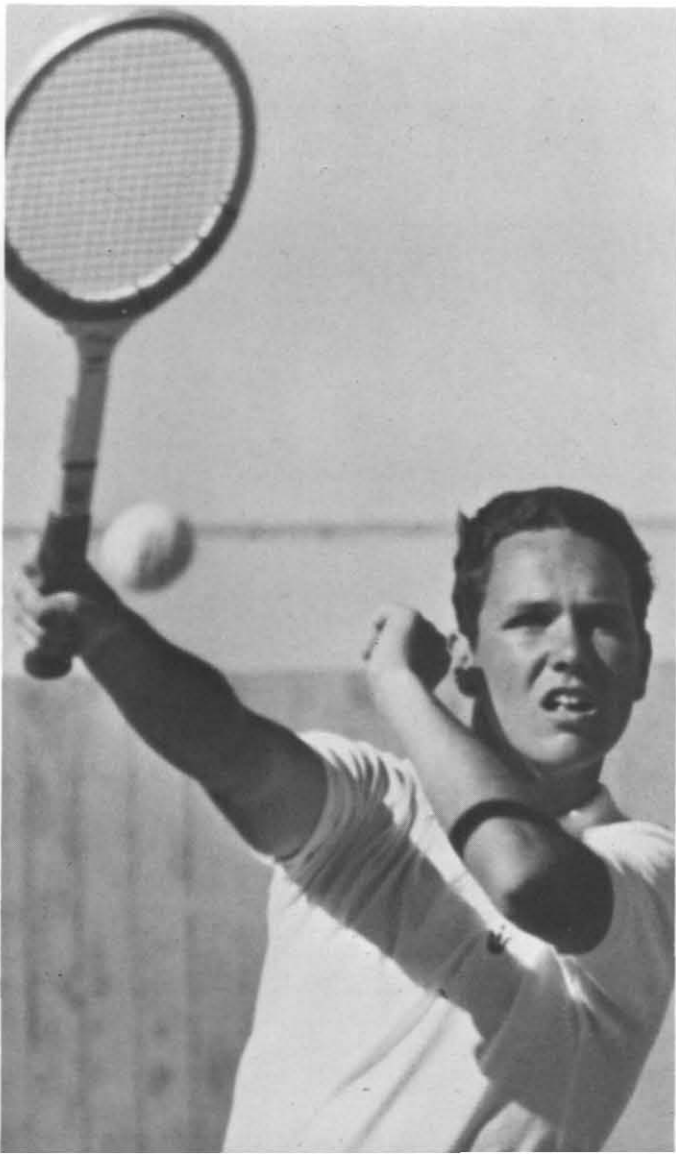

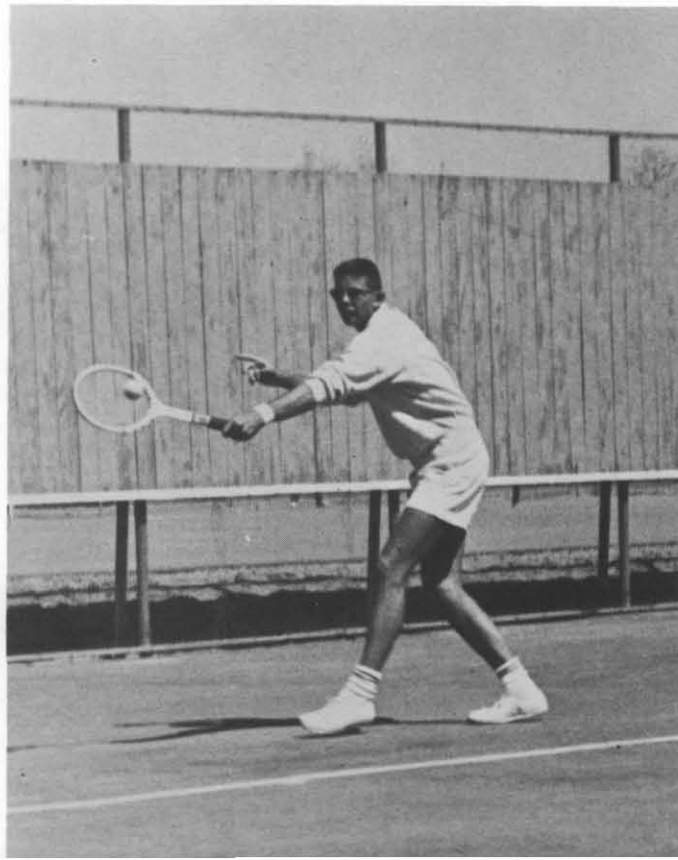

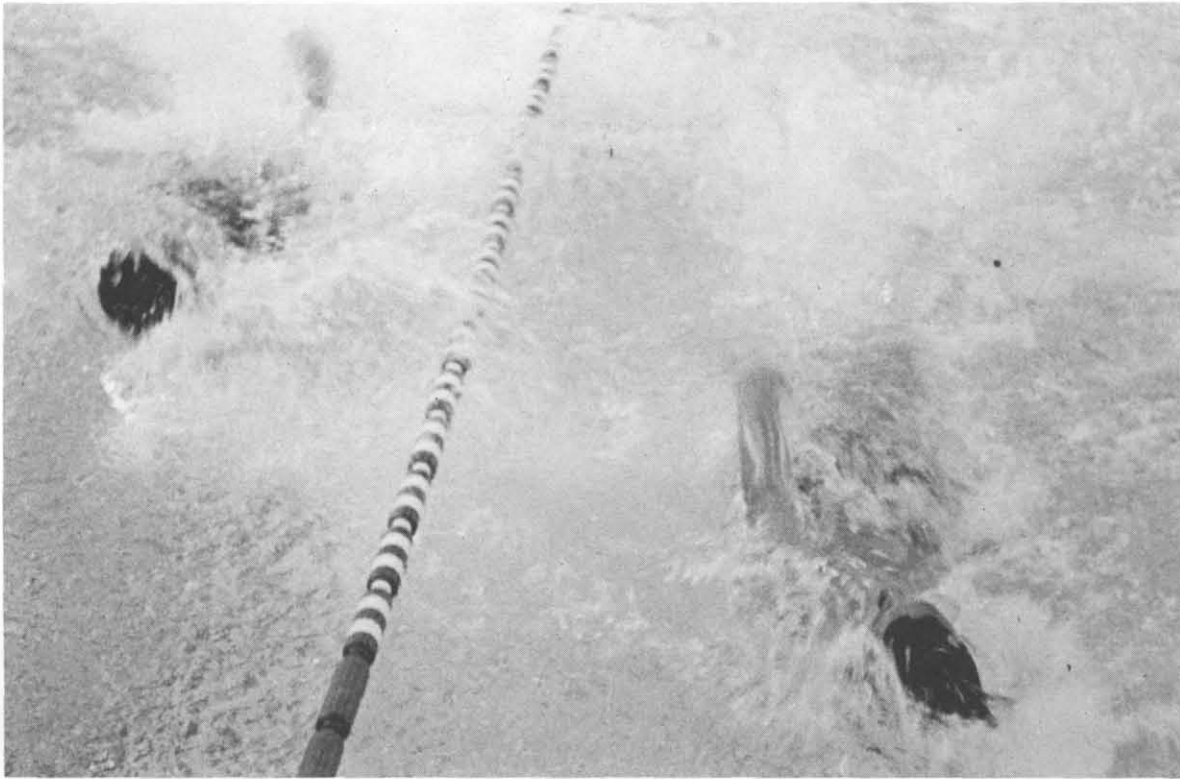

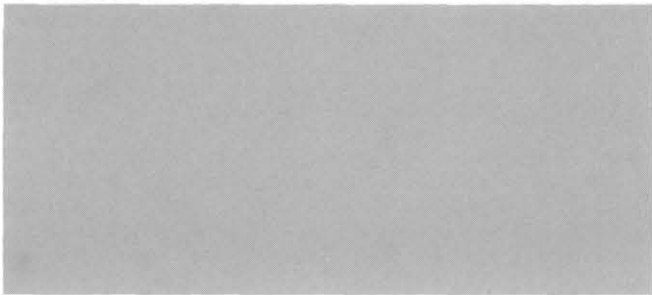

Intramurals are an integral part of a student's sport life at UNM. Competition between fraternities, residence hall sections, and the Navy and Air Force ROTC teams is high.

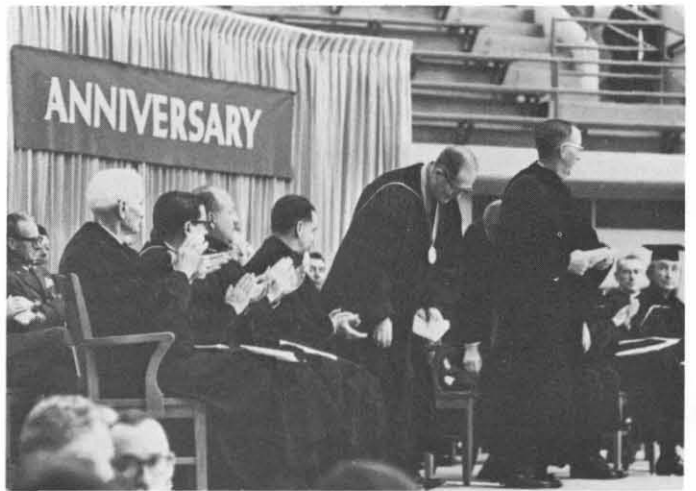

ARTS AND SCIENCES

The College of Arts and Sciences is the oldest and largest of the University's academic divisions. The college has seventeen departments including sciences, English, languages, social sciences, history, and speech.

Research in bacteriology, botany and zoology is being conducted in the Biology department. Dr. Martin Fleck is doing research on the effects of radiation on animals and Dr. William Degenhardt is conducting a study of reptiles and amphibians of New Mexico.

In the History Department, Dr. William Dabney is engaged in research on the effects of the American Revolution on religion. Dr. Henry Tobias is writing a history of a revolutionary organization called the Jewish Bund which existed in the old Russian empire. Research in the Economics Department includes a study under grant from the Department of Defense of the economic, military and other effects of the Strategic Hamlets Program in Viet Nam.

The National Science Foundation has awarded the Department of Mathematics two research grants: "Research in Analysis," and "Research in Probability and Statistics."

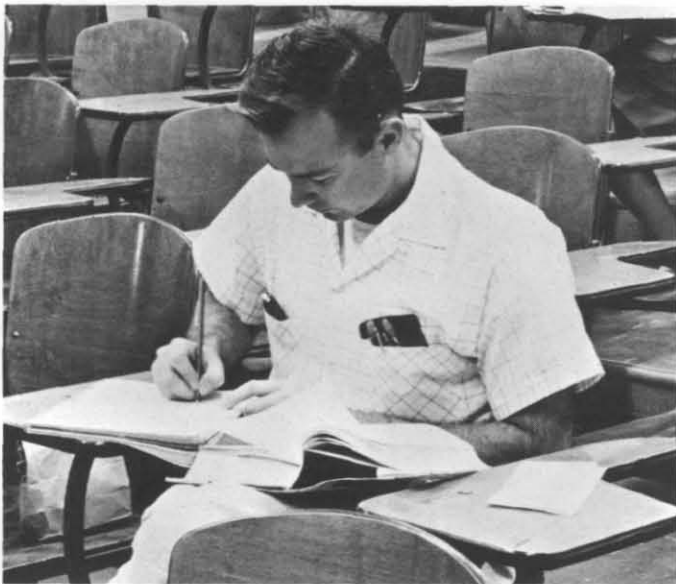

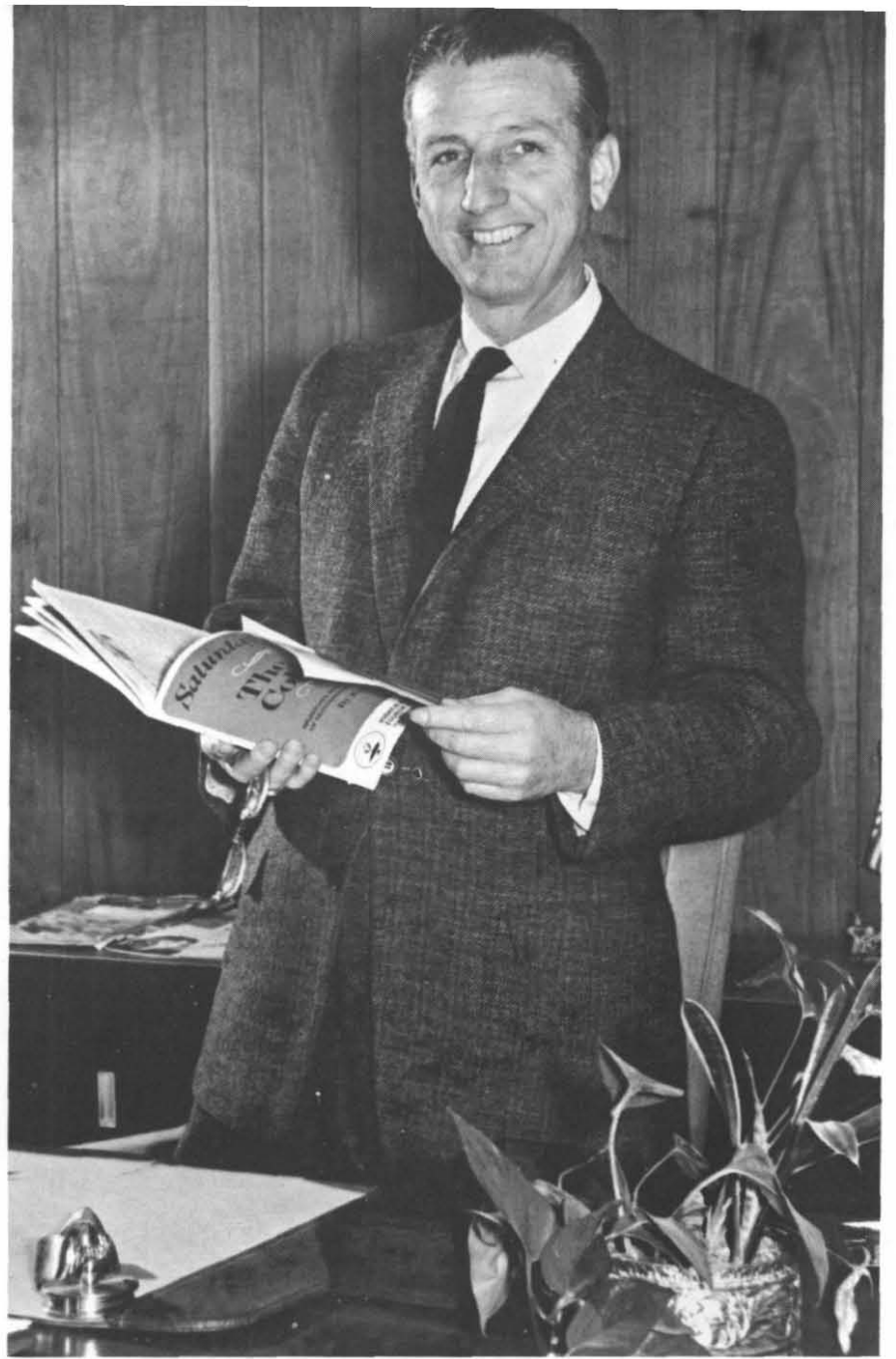

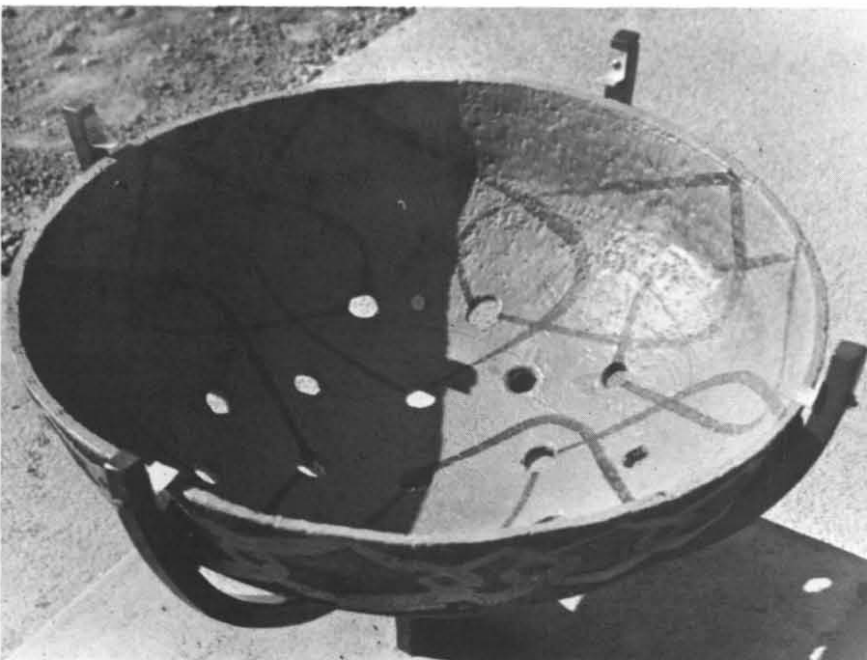

The new Education Complex as viewed from Mesa Vista Dormitory



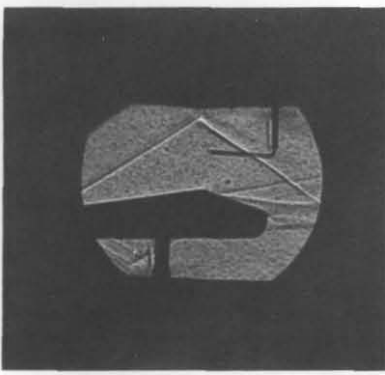

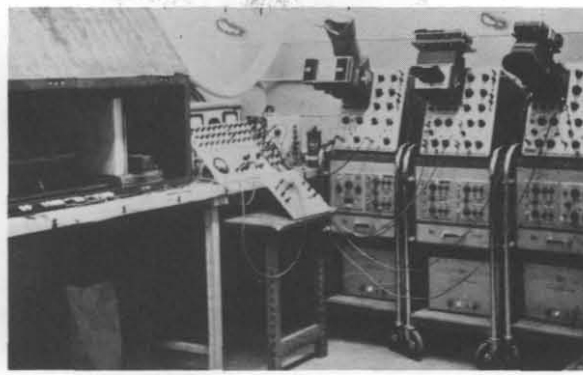

ENGINEERING



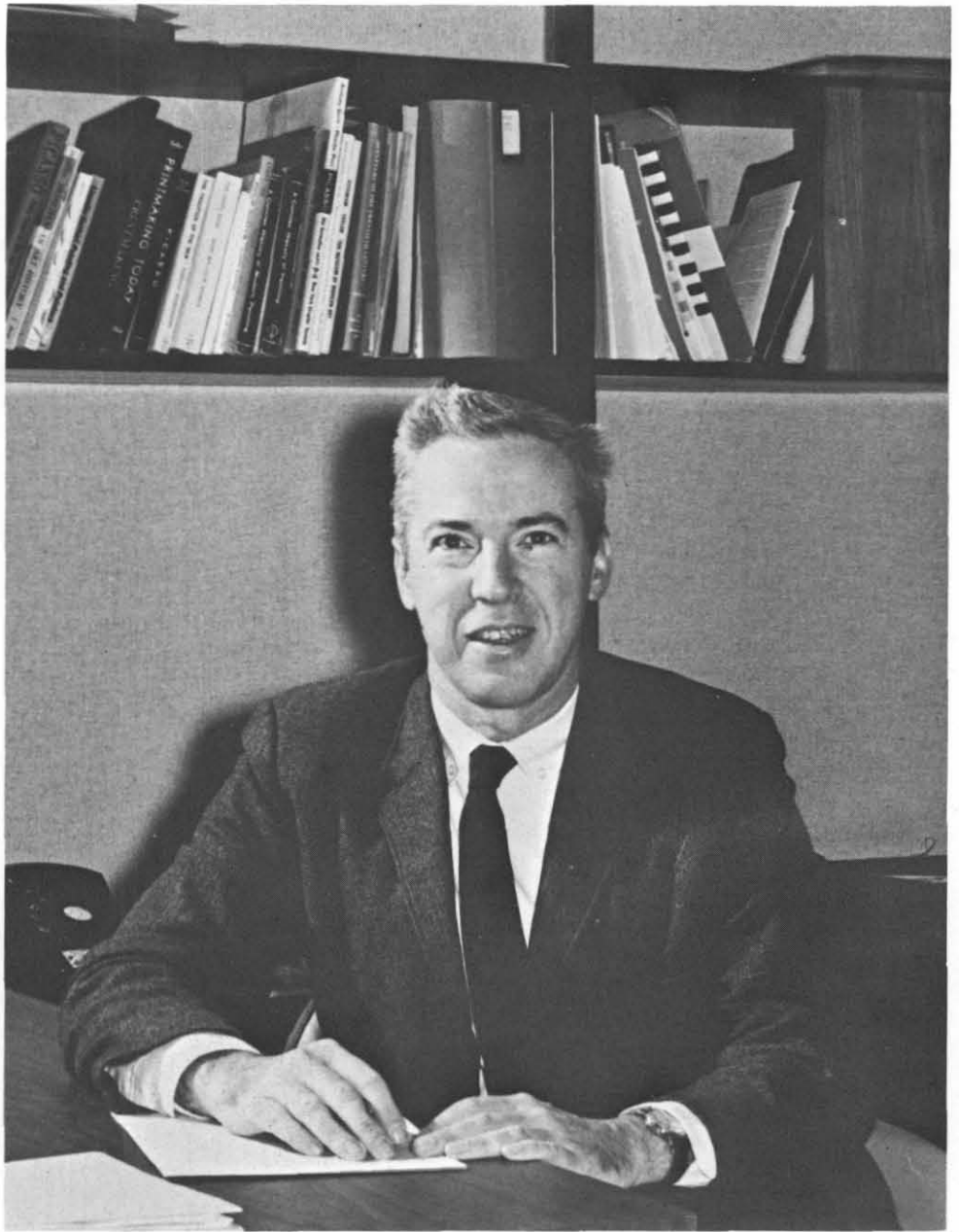
The College of Engineering encompasses five departments of the field: chemical, civil, electrical, mechanical and nuclear. It was the second college of the University to be formed.

Research in the Mechanical Engineering department includes a project on the "inelastic behavior of materials by the dislocation phenomena" headed by Dr. Frederick Ju, and a study of "temperature and thermal stress distributions in radiation-cooled circular cylinders" sponsored by Sandia Corporation and headed by Dr. Maurice Wildin.

A joint Civil and Mechanical Engineering project on "low-cycle failure criteria" is being sponsored by the National Science Foundation.

Prof. L. J. Thompson of the Civil Engineering department is studying the pressures in the fill over a highway culvert in order to design a gauge to measure the pressures in soils. Another Civil Engineering research project is the study of the "compaction and plasticity characteristics of bituminous mixtures."

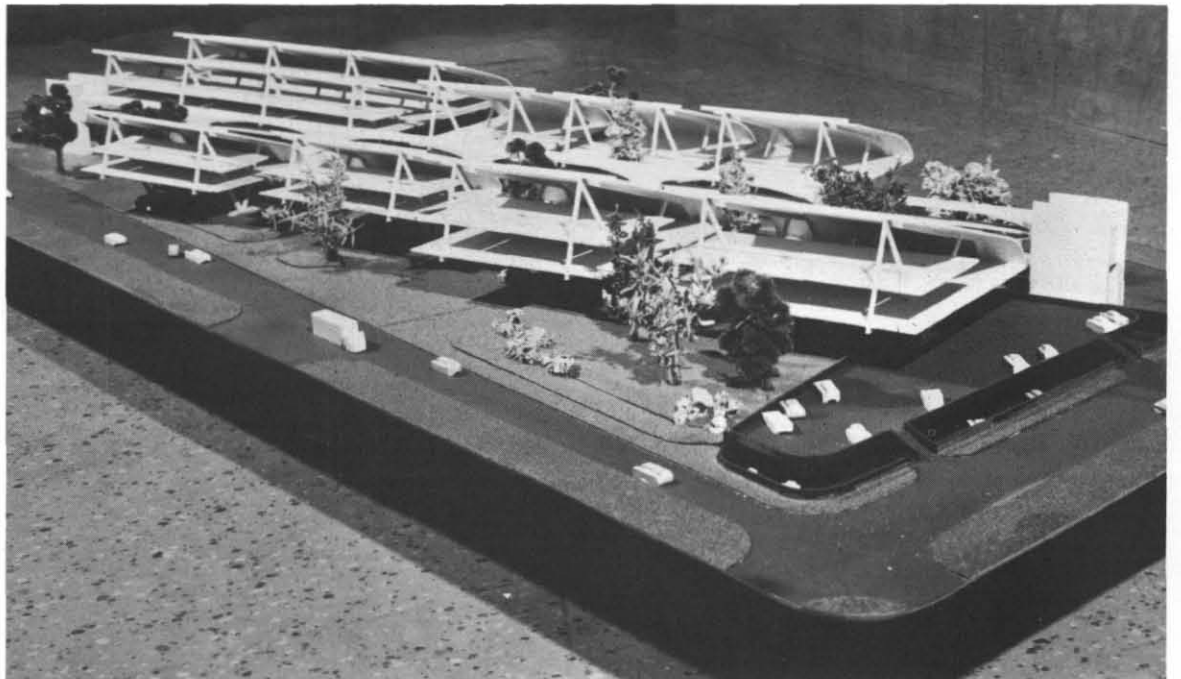

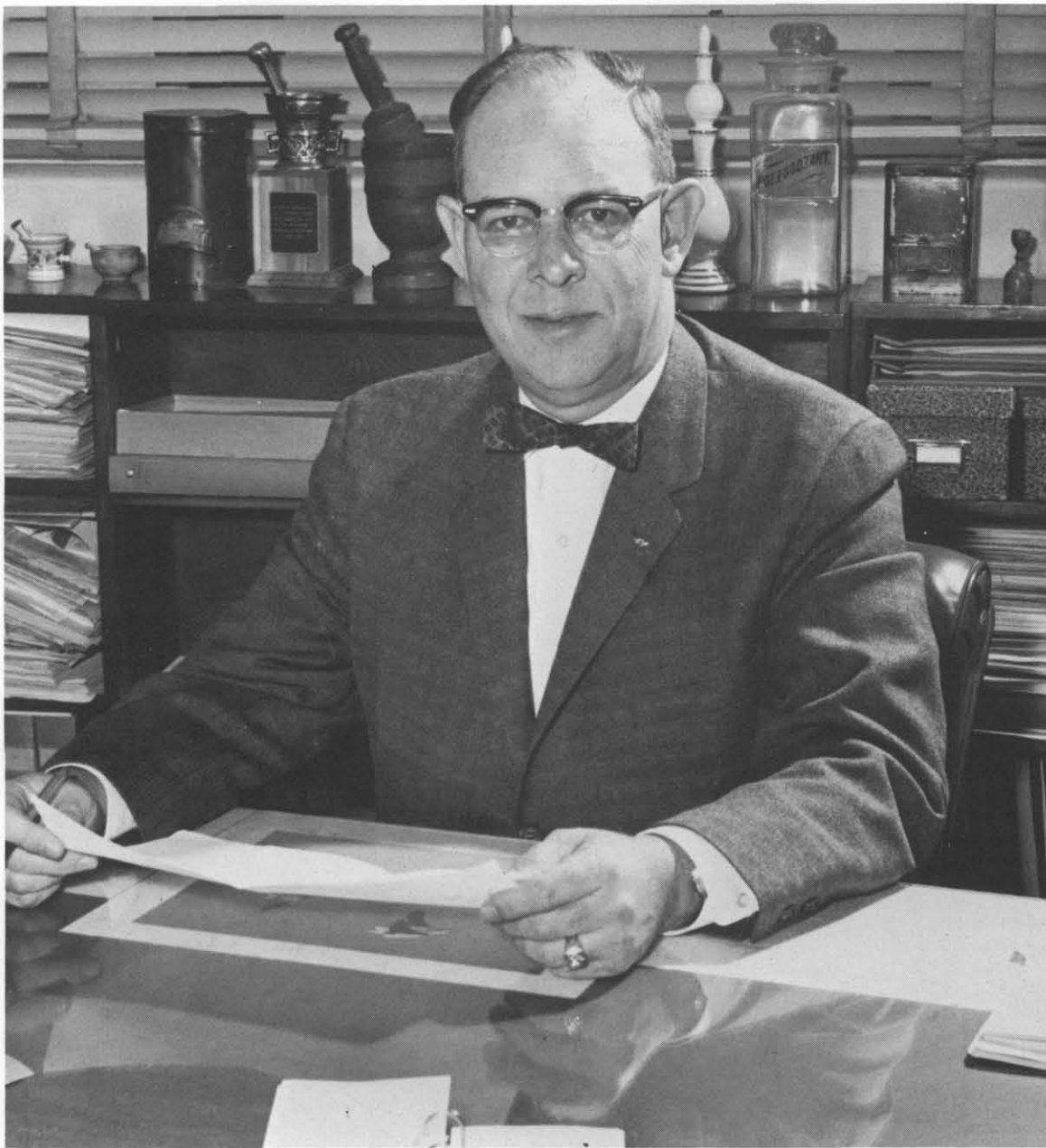
FINE ARTS

The first phase of the new Fine Arts Center was completed this year and will be dedicated in October. The College of Fine Arts achieved the status of a college in 1936 and includes the departments of architecture, art, drama and music.

An exhibition of work done by Art Department alumni was featured by the University Art Gallery this year. "Masterworks of Contemporary Art, 1889-1964" will be shown as the 75th Anniversary Exhibition. "The Magic Flute" was produced by the Opera Workshop and the University Chorus and Orchestra presented Verdi's "Requiem." Fifth-year design students in the Department of Architecture designed a college for the site of the new St. John's College at Santa Fe. "Major Barbara" by George Bernard Shaw was one of the dramatic offerings of the drama department this year.

The College of Pharmacy has building expansion in mind for the future. The college has grown to now include a five-year curriculum for pharmacy majors, and a two-year dental hygiene program. These curricula combine a liberal arts education with professional courses. Founded as a college in 1945, the school now has its own building and laboratories.

PHARMACY



The College of Nursing received a \$25,295 grant from the National Institute of Mental Health this year for a project to educate nursing students on the problems of emotional stress. Miss Catherine Norris was appointed by the Institute to head the project.

Miss Norris has held appointments at Boston University, Columbia University Teachers' College, University of Colorado and the Illinois State Psychiatric Institute for Training and Research.

Dr. Philip Bock of the UNM Anthropology department assisted Miss Norris by working on the cultural differences and influences of cultural beliefs and practices on health and illness.

The nursing students train in Bernalillo County Indian Hospital, Bataan Memorial Hospital, and in various health and rehabilitation centers.

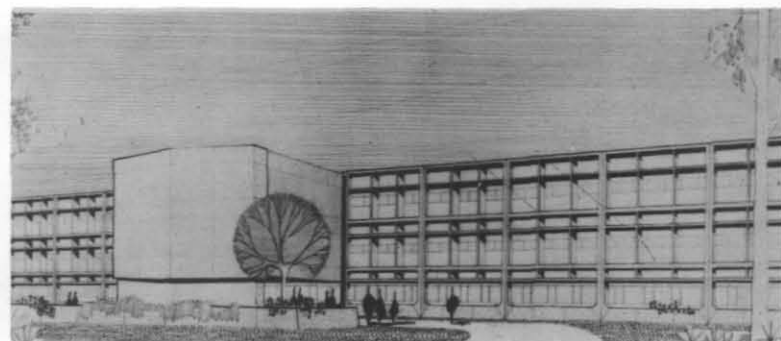

The Medical School is one of UNM's newest colleges. It was founded in 1960 under a Kellogg Foundation grant, and will be operating this fall.

The faculty of the School of Medicine is working on five research projects. Solomon Papper, M.D. and Carlos Vamonde, M.D. are doing research on the kidney. Research on the significance of myocardial metabolism via shunt pathways is being done by Martin Brandfonbrener, M.D. and a project studying red cell biochemistry is being done by Ernest Simon, M.D. Robert Wang, M.D. is researching magnesium metabolism and Robert Stone, M.D., viroetology of cancer.

The department of Physiology has two research projects underway. Both are supported by the National Institutes of Health and involve the determination of molecular moieties involved in transport of inorganic ions and also the driving force involved in the renal concentrating mechanism.

CAREER SCHOLAR PROGRAM

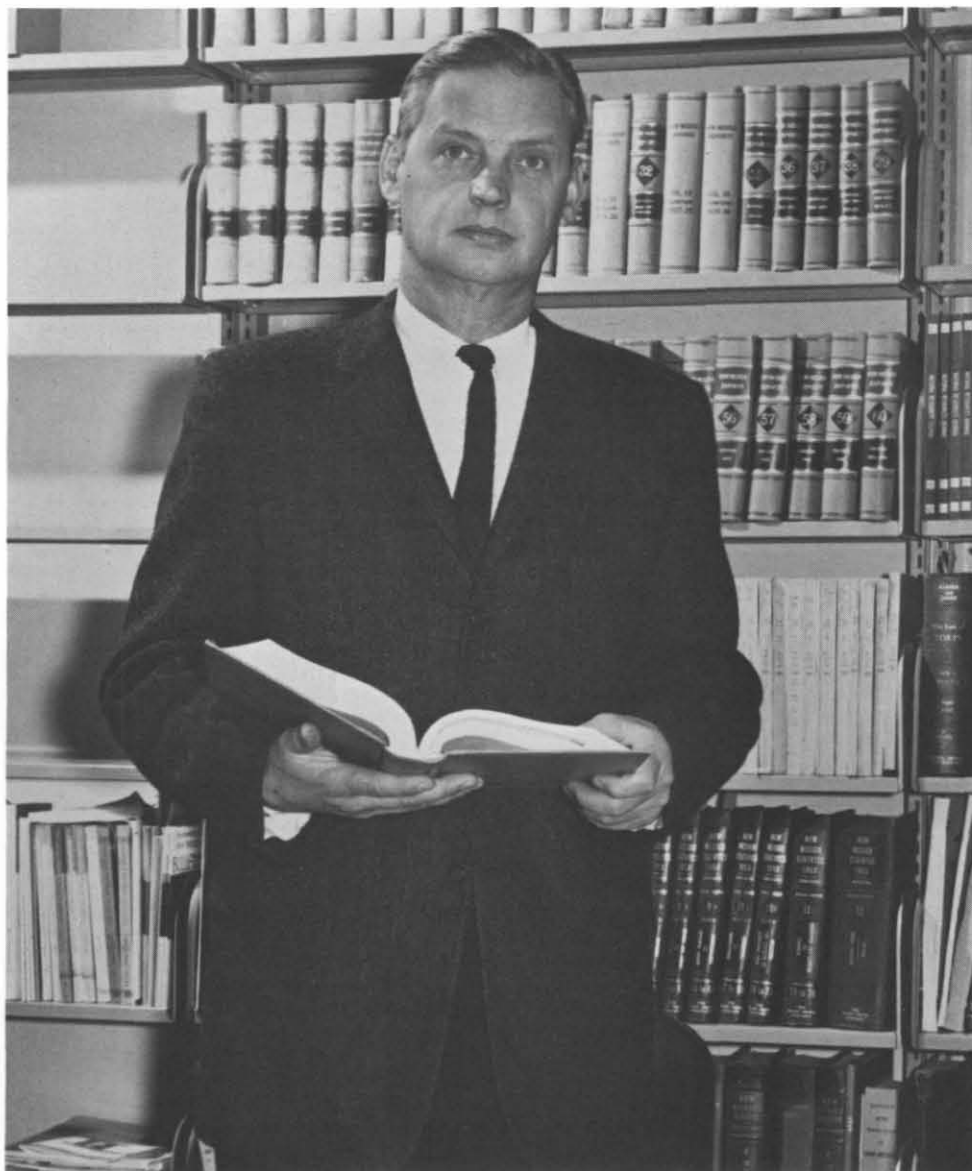
The Career Scholar Program was founded on the University campus in 1961 with a Ford Foundation five-year grant of \$222,490. The program is designed so that a student may receive a Masters' degree in three years by beginning an accelerated program in his junior year of undergraduate work. The program is expressly designed for the purpose of educating students for a career of college teaching either after they have attained a Master's degree or a Doctor's degree.

Each student in the program is assigned to a professor in his department who acts as his tutor. He is introduced to skills necessary for effective college teaching and to problems and techniques of research. He often assists his tutor in a research project and, when ready, he begins his own research project which often serves as the basis for a Master's thesis.

Eleven departments in the College of Arts and Sciences and the Graduate School are participating in the program and two more will be added next year. Financial awards are offered all participating students, and a small allowance is made for their purchase of books of lasting professional benefit. Departmental tutors also receive stipends for their services to the students.

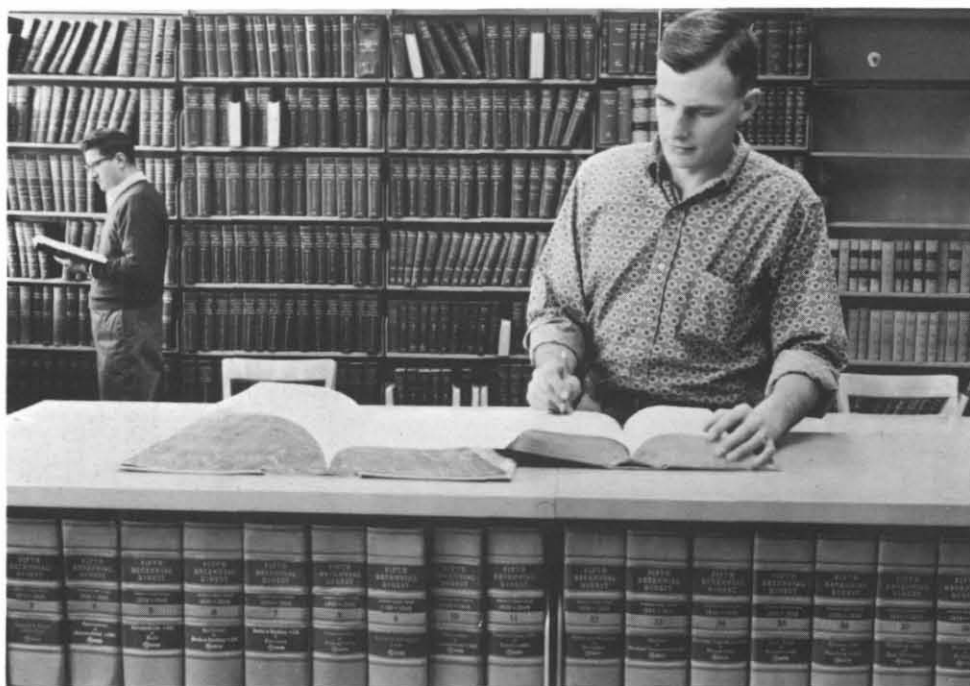

SCHOOL OF LAW

The School of Law has met the standards of the American Bar Association and the Association of American Law Schools. It has its own building which houses a moot court room, student and faculty lounges, "Natural Resources Journal" offices, and Student Bar Association offices. The library, a soundproofed room, as are the classrooms and the halls, has over 58,000 volumes and a collection of unbound pamphlets, appeal papers for the New Mexico Supreme Court and the U.S. Court of Appeals, Tenth Circuit.

The Law School hosts many local and state members of the bench and bar to lecture and speak to its students. Through work with the Legal Aid Society, law students come into contact with state and municipal courts and the United States District Court.

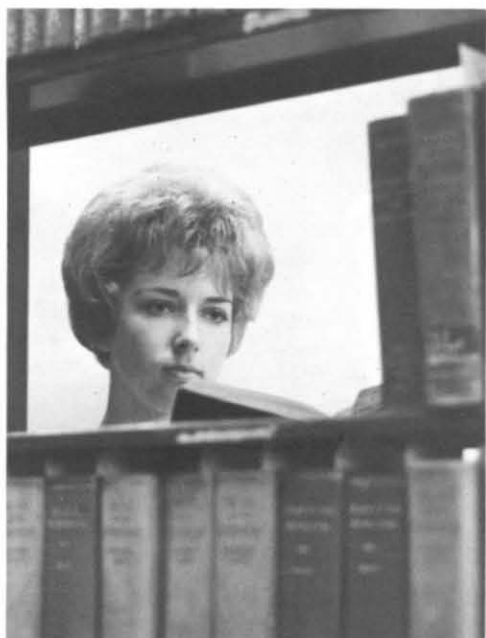

Integration of the Peace Corps training program and UNM's academic program was the main focus of the UNM Peace Corps training center this year. With the experimental period over, the training program became a solid link in the UNM academic schedule. A new eighteen month contract was signed beginning February 1, 1964.

Taos continued to be the main community center for the Peace Corps members training for work in South America, particularly in Brazil, Colombia and Ecuador. Other New Mexico communities also were visited by the trainees this year.

The first phase of training in the UNM Peace Corps program includes classes in languages, history, area studies, medical training, community development theory, world affairs and physical training. Phase two concerns field work done in community development.

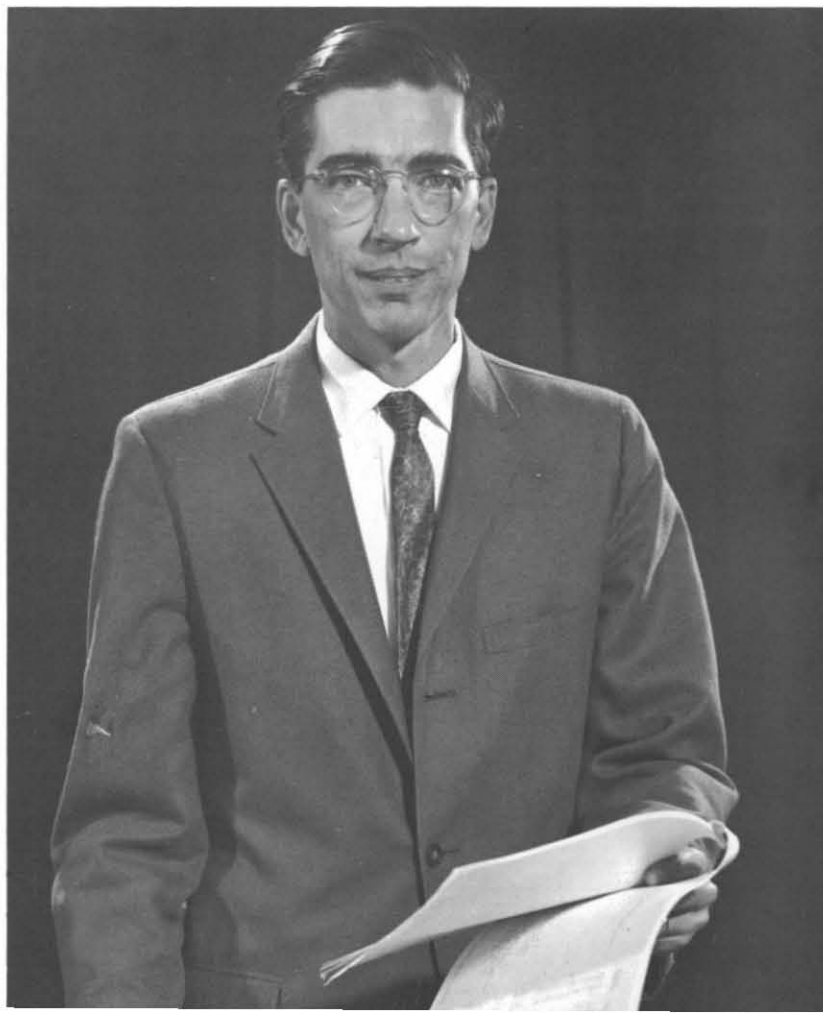

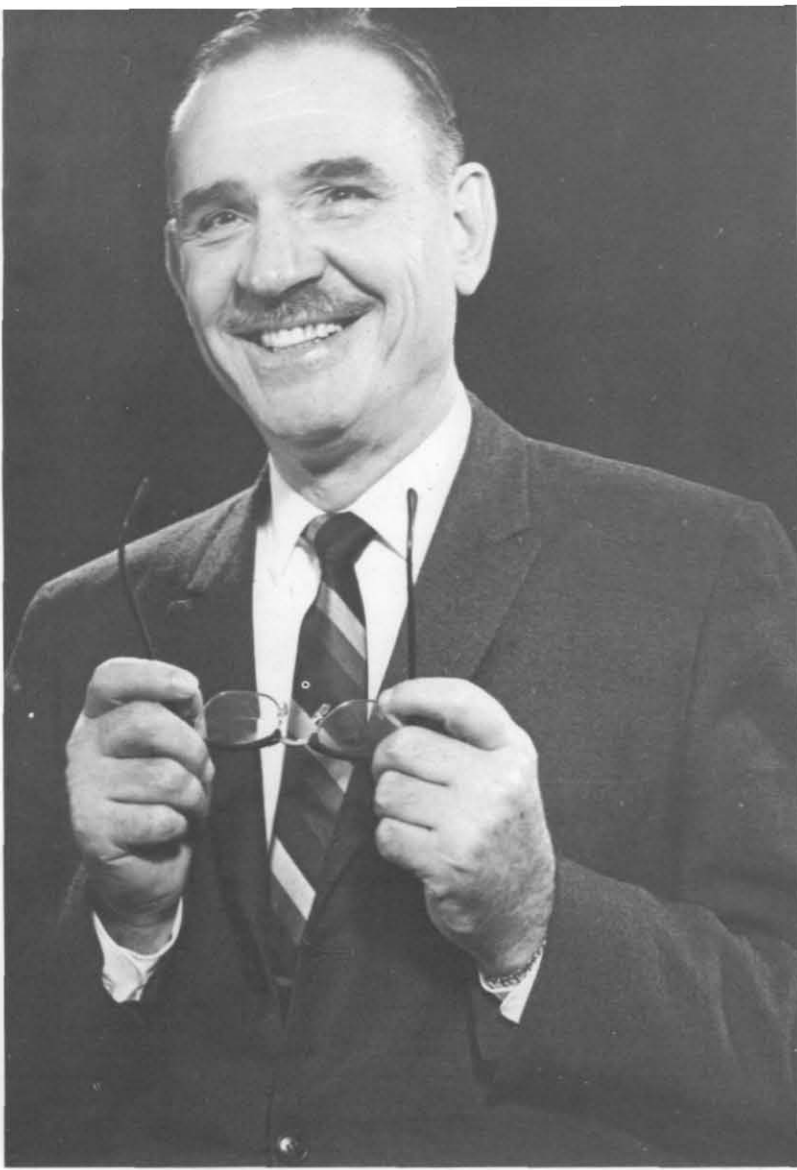


UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

HONORS PROGRAM

The General Honors Program is a supervised reading and discussion program designed to give qualified students the opportunity for development and expression of their ideas and convictions.

The General Studies curriculum includes two Freshmen colloquia in which books of various subjects ranging from Greek tragedies to psychoanalysis are read and discussed. In the sophomore year three seminars are offered each semester in the general areas of the social sciences, the sciences, and the humanities.

The seminars in the junior year are devoted to the study of major trends in Western culture. In the senior year, honors students work with current publications and books in a seminar called "Great Issues."

The Honors Program selects students on the basis of scholastic achievement and University entrance examinations. The program was initiated in 1957 and began operating under a Carnegie Corporation grant in 1961. Students who are in the program for at least six semesters and have a sufficient grade point average graduate with honors from the University.
