## HOW ABOUT YOUR RED CROSS MEMBERSHIP?

Are you one of those who think—"The war is over let's quit?"

If you are, you do not know the facts. You do not know that at least half of the returned soldier and sailors have not been seen by the Red Cross representative of his Home County; and that of this number, probably fifty per cent need something. More than that, they are entitled to something—and it is the job of the Red Cross (and that means you) to see that they get it!

At a recent conference in Washington, the government made the Red Cross its intermediary (its go-between, as it were) between the returned soldier and sailor and his family on the one side, and the government on the other side. It said, in effect—we stand ready, and willing, and anxious to do for the man who served, and for his family, all that we have agreed to do; but we cannot find him. The Red Cross must do that. One Government official said that it would take two years for the government to procure an organization half way as effective as the Red Cross for the reaching of returned men, because the Red Cross is represented in every county and every little town in the United States.

A year to go before the job is finished. That means membership (for membership means co-operation) and it means the interested help of everybody who cares the slightest bit whether we do what we agreed to do for the man in service! Are you with us? The drive starts Nov. 2nd. Will you help get a member?

### THE REAL DANGER TO OUR INSTITUTIONS

Says The Albuquerque Morning Journal:

"Why bombs? When the dissatisfied do not like the form of any American local government they say so on slips dropped into a box, and forthwith a new method goes. Then, when amendment is wanted, it is made in the same way. If a group of men of any calling are not getting a square deal, or full participation, they say so. If they prove their case, they get a remedy. The same is true all along the line, from village government to the state capital, and then to the halls of congress and executive mansion. It is but necessary to be right to win, not driving others to the case. When enough voters decree for anyone thing they get it. Wild men with wild theories and who are always in the minority, get nowhere rapidly, and are the ones who threaten, bomb and would coerce the safer minded men."

All of which is perfectly true and full of common sense. But to exercise this right of citizenship presupposes Liberty of the Press and Liberty of Speech. How are we going to convince others that they are wrong and that we are right if we are denied that essential freedom? This question was uppermost in the minds of our Constitution makers when they declared that Liberty of the press and Liberty of Speech should never be abridged in our Land. This was provided as a safety valve to human passions. Let all, even cranks, give vent to their pet ideas. After all, public common sense will find them out and separate the chaff from the wheat.

The greatest enemies of our Constitution are those who would suppress these essential Liberties and establish right here in this Land of the Free such conditions as prevailed in Russia under czarism or in Mexico under the Diaz regime.

There lies the real danger to our American Institutions!

## IS OUR REPUBLICAN ADMINISTRATION EFFICIENT?

At the biennial meeting of the New Mexico Taxpayer's Association held in Santa Fe this week, former Governor H. J. Hagerman, President of the Association, in his opening speech, among other statements made the following:

"That statistics compiled by the Taxpayers Association demonstrate that the Land Department of the State of New Mexico has, on the whole, since its organization in 1898, been conducted in a manner which would not be considered economical nor satisfactory in any similar line of private business and that the net results to date have been disappointing" and that "such a matter as the failure of the office to collect interest on large sums of public money held by it, which has been a subject of public comment for years, is not explained."

Such a statement coming from a Republican of such a high standing as Ex-Governor Hagerman is the strongest condemnation of our Republican administration. The State Land Office has been under republican management ever since its organization.
