On June 18, the Cuban Communist Party's official newspaper, Granma, reported that the nation's teacher- population ratio of 1:37 is the highest in the world. According to government statistics, 300,000 people work as teachers in Cuba at present. Most are graduates of teacher colleges or universities. According to the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), the ratio in developed countries ranges from one teacher per 50 or 80 citizens.
