## Nos batiremos hasta acabar con usted o hasta que usted acabe con nosotros

De nuestro colega, La Patria, de El Paso, Texas, fecha 31 del pasado, tomamos la siguiente informacion que nos parece muy interesante:

Ayer, al frente de una competente fuerza de tropas del gobierno provisional, arribó a Parral el general J. Gonzalo Escobar, para impedir el amenazante ataque de Villa a aquel rico mineral, y para proseguir la persecucion de Villa al sur de aquel distrito.

El general Escobar, con no menos de 2,000 hombres, no hizo el viaje ferrocarril, debido a que algunas alcantarrillas se habian quemado por los villistas en el ramal de Jimenez a Parral a fin de retardar la persecucion de las tropas federales, sino que por tierra violentó su marcha hacia la ciudad que era el punto objetivo de los villistas. La llegada de estas fuerzas alivió la situacion de Parral, que temia que Villa atacara la ciudad y la confianza volvió a los atemorizados habitantes.

Aunque Villa solo habia amenazado con un ataque, corto la corriente de la fuerza mortiz de la presa de la Boquilla a Parral que suministra fuerza electrica a los centros mineros de aquel distrito, temiendose que esto seria seguido por exacciones que impondria a las compañías mineras como lo habia ya ofrecido.

Por lo tanto, con el arribo de las tropas de general Escobar las empresas mineras reanudarón sus trabajos y ya no se atregera el temor de un ataque.

Despues del encuentro registrado el viernes ultimo en el valle de Allende, en que las tropas de Villa fueron completamente derrotadas por las fuerzas combinadas de los generales Enriquez y Escobar, el jefe rebelde se retiró rapidamente hacia los límites de Durango y Chihuahua, evadando la tenaz persecucion que se le hacia, probablemente con la intencion de unirse a los hermanos Arias, que en durango habian asumido una actitud de rebeldia hacia el nuevo estado de cosas, y sin saber que uno de ellos habia sido derrotado y se habia rendido a gobierno de facto.

La ciudad de Durango esta en poder del general Jesus Agustin Castro, quien desde un principio reconocio el Plan de Agua Prieta, estando al mando de todas las tropas del Estado, y funge ahora como gobernador y comandante militar del Estado de Durango.

### WOOD HITS PROFITEERS

Gauging by Meat Men in Cuba Brought to End.

When General Wood was governor general of Cuba he found there was plenty of food in Havana which the people could not buy because of high prices. He no sooner heard of this than he established a line of procedure to correct it. He sent for the principal butchers of the city and asked: "How much do you charge for your meat?" "Ninety cents a pound, señor." "What does it cost you?" "There was hesitation and shuffling of feet. Then one of the men said in a whining voice: "Meat is very dear, your excellency." "How much a pound?" "Fifteen cents, your excellency; but we have lost much money during the war, and—" "So have your customers. Now meat will be sold at 25 cents a pound, and not one cent more. Do you understand?" Turning to an alderman General Wood charged him to see that his order was carried out to the letter, and a he wanted to be expelled from office. Thereafter meat was sold in the markets of Havana at 25 cents. The same plan was applied to all other kinds of supplies.

### NORTH DAKOTA TO WOOD

State Springs Surprise in Recent Primary Contest.

Chicago, Oct. 30.—North Dakota, hitherto conceded as a Johnson state, is in fact a Wood state. William Cooper Proctor, who is the chief in the campaign of Leonard Wood for the Republican presidential nomination, gives figures to prove his claim on North Dakota for his candidate. "Two factions of the Republican party in North Dakota held conventions," Mr. Proctor explained; "one on February 17 and the other on February 27 both selecting a ticket of ten delegates. Later these two conventions met and decided to present only one ticket to the field and ten delegates, eight of whom were Wood men and the other two noncommittal—opposed to oppose the Johnson slate." In the recent primary, reports from which have just been received, the Johnson slate was defeated by a majority of 8,112 votes, with five counties to be heard from. Eight of the ten delegates named on the regular Republican slate are Wood men.

### Leonard Wood's Life

Here is Leonard Wood's life outlined in brief.

Born, October 5, 1859, Winchester, N. H.

Studied at Westford on Cape Cod, Mass.

Graduated from Harvard Medical school, 1884.

Worked among poor of Boston as hospital doctor.

Appointed army surgeon in 1885, served a few days in Boston and then was transferred to Mexican border on his request "for action."

Fought for many months the savage Apaches, who harassed the border and successfully blocked the approach of civilization. Years later awarded Congressional Medal of Honor for his heroism in the Mexican warfare.

In 1888 he surveyed Arizona under General Miles.

Ordered back to active service on border for a few months.

Made staff surgeon, in 1889, and stationed at Los Angeles.

Married Miss Louise A. Condit Smith, niece of Chief Justice Field.

Sent to Washington in 1890 as assistant attending surgeon, and served under Cleveland and McKinley.

Organized Rough Riders in 1898; made colonel, with Theodore Roosevelt as lieutenant colonel.

Lead his troops in first battle at Las Guasimas, June 24, 1898.

Entered Santiago July 17, and was promoted for valor to brigadier general.

Made military governor of Santiago July 20, and turned city from pest-house to modern municipality.

President McKinley appointed him governor general of Cuba, in December, 1899. In next three years he brought Cuba out of darkness and established it as a modern, law-abiding, self-governing nation.

Sent by Roosevelt to Germany in 1902 as military observer.

Appointed governor of the savage Moro province in the Philippines, in 1903, by President Roosevelt.

Went with his men to the front lines, fought fanatic tribesmen, established government and civilization, and in three years redeemed another "lost land."

Made commander in chief of American forces in Philippines in 1905.

In 1908 transferred to United States and made commander of the department of the east.

Sent as special ambassador to Argentine republic.

Four years headed American military forces as chief of staff.

In 1914 again made commander of the department of the east.

Became premier leader in preparedness in United States by establishing training camps in 1914, 1915 and 1916. Thousands of men trained under his direction to become officers on call.

Transferred in 1917 to department of south, request for overseas duty having been ignored.

August 26 began training of crack Eighty-ninth division at Camp Funston, Kansas.

Sent to Europe in December as military observer.

Wounded by bursting gun; three weeks in hospital.

Returned and resumed command of Eighty-ninth division April 12, 1918.

### RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST

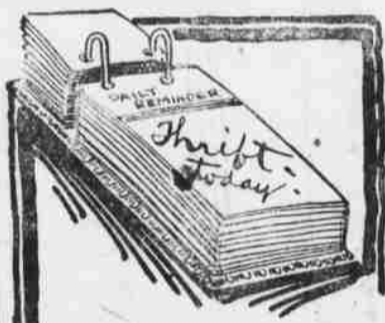

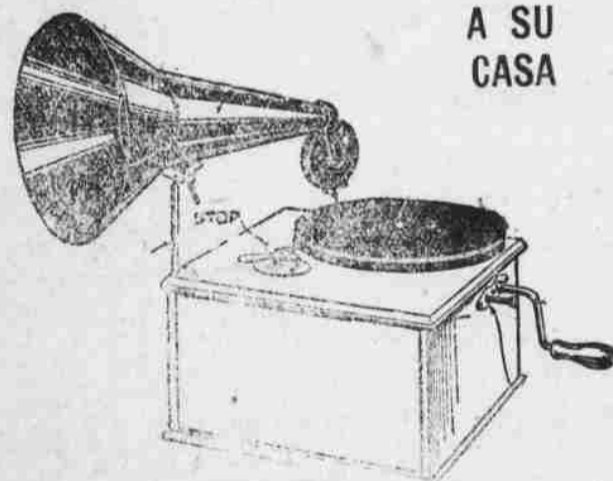

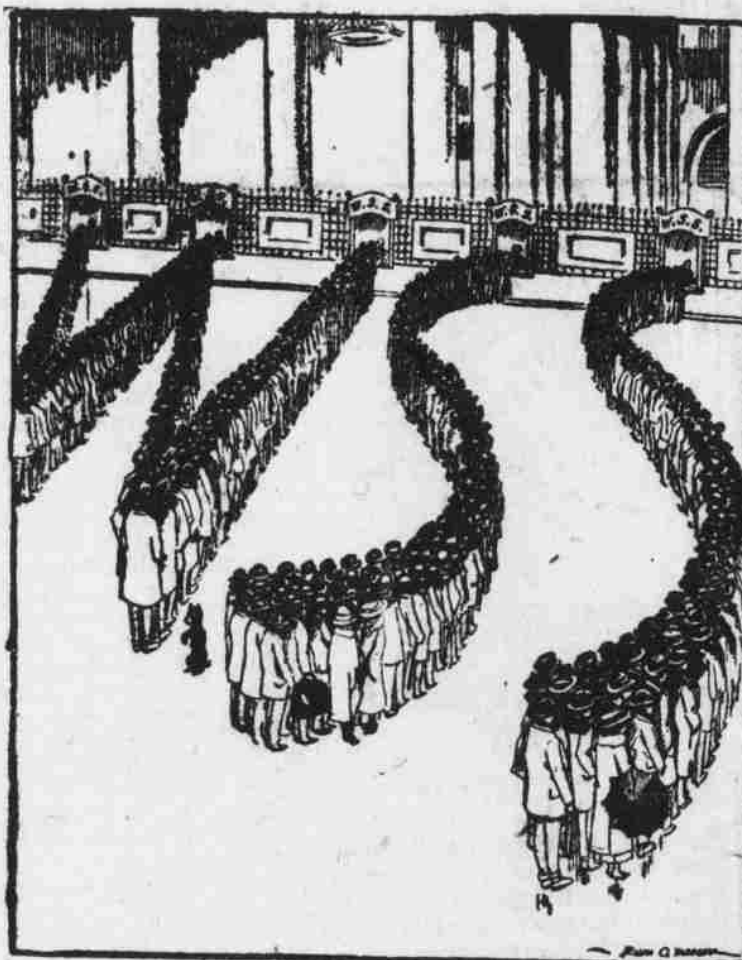
