Uruguay Complains To Brasilia Of Delays In Implementing Expanded Trade Agreement

On July 23, Uruguayan Foreign Ministry officials told reporters that Montevideo has submitted a complaint to Brasilia regarding delays in implementation of an expanded bilateral trade agreement. Under an agreement finalized in January, the list of Uruguayan products subject to tariff-free access to the Brazilian market was expanded by 1,200. The same accord added 47 Brazilian products to the zero-tariff list on the Uruguayan side. (The 47 do not include agricultural products.) The expanded accord was submitted to the Latin American Integration Association on May 29. The officials said that the expanded agreement on the Brazilian side is not yet even in process, much less implemented. (Source: Agence France-Presse, 07/25/92)
