Went out of Magallon canyon and went to the Gila above Gila and packed specimens. While there we collected Holbrookia texana and Coluber taeniatus which climbed a small juniper to escape. A Temnodactylus was captured but it escaped. Region is one of River bottom with desert willow, Deep Willow, Sycamore & Mesquite.

Went to Hurley to make arrangements to get into Fagerwood Warm Springs. Tagged along on a picnic and made the collections in the spring and in the pond, presumably fed by the spring.
