NEWS OF VILLA PERSECUTION.

RUMOR VILLA'S CAPTURE.

Consul Andres Garcia received a message from Chihuahua City Saturday morning saying that there was a rumor in that city that Villa had been caught at Minaca.

No details were given in the message and Consul Garcia has been unable to learn any more regarding the report.

DODD'S EXPLOIT.

Col. Dodd's exploit in surprising and battling with the Villa bandits was a remarkable bit of work and adds great to the calvary. He made a forced march of 55 miles over rough country in 17 hours and then fought five hours before the bandits began to retreat.

AIRMEN'S VIGILANCE.

Airplanes are keeping the army so ceaselessly informed as to the whereabouts of flying remnants of Villa's beaten band, the Villistas are given no opportunity to rest themselves or their badly fed mounts.

Imperialism of Safety First.

If the House concurs in the action of the Senate taken early in February, the Philippine barge of state will cut the hawser connecting it with the big convoy and drift along its own independence course in 1921. Disregarding the feelings of Americans investors in the islands, perhaps his settlement of a vexing problem is the best. After all events it is better than continuous agitation and uncertainty.

The administration has declined to do anything sweeping in Mexico, close proximity and the Monroe Doctrine notwithstanding. If this safety-first policy expresses the nature judgment of the republic, it should be applied to the distant archipelago at the earliest possible moment, regardless of the Philipinos' fate after the cable is cut.

If, however, the Philipines are to be retained until their inhabitants are really ripe for successful self-government, the action of the Senate is a piece of almost criminal stupidity. It raises false hopes in the hands of Filipino politicians clamoring for autonomy for selfish reasons and many encourage them to shed the blood of American soldiers in abortive revolts.

Relation of State to National Constitutional Prohibition.

A prohibition amendment to the federal constitution is in perfect accord with the declaration of the supreme Court of the United States, twelve times reiterated:

"There is no inherent right to sell intoxicating liquors" and with is further declaration that "no legislature has the right to bargain away the public morals." All States will benefit by the amendment States which have not themselves voted out the liquor traffic will have the aid of the national law and the appeal to uphold a national prohibition policy will be much stronger than is the appeal to a state to prohibit the traffic. A national constitutional amendment will be a great benefit to prohibition states because in law enforcement they will no longer be handicapped by a outside brewers, distillers and dealers who constantly attempt to nullify the state law and to sell liquor to dry territory. "The states will still have power to go just as far as they desire in prohibiting any phase of the liquor traffic and will have the aid which comes from a national prohibition policy." Our greatest difficulty today is the difference in policy between the nation's government and the prohibition states. With a similar prohibition standard in the nation and the states federal and state officers would furnish a frank and candid co-operation for the general good.

UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO

Albuquerque, N. M., April 5.—At a meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of New Mexico to be held Monday April 17, in this city, final plans will be canvassed, and it is expected that contracts will be let for the new building provided for by the last legislature, which is to replace Hadley Hall, one of the main buildings which was destroyed by fire several years ago.

Because of his interest in the university's Pueblo style of architecture, the institution has been able to secure the services of Walter Burley Griffith, the famous Chicago architect, as supervising architect, not only of the buildings, but of the architectural landscape work planned for the improvement of the enlarged three hundred acre campus.

Griffith is the man who, in competition against the architects of the world, won the half million dollar fee of the Australian government with his plan for the remodeling of its model city of Sidney. He passed through Albuquerque two years

Don't Ignore Fly Menace this Season.

Many persons do not realize what a serious menace the fly is to the health of the community. It is characteristic of the average man to ignore this kind of danger until it threatens his own family. "Oh, the fly may be the means of carrying a fatal disease to some puny person," your reason perhaps, "But there is no danger of his bringing it to me. I'm in pretty good shape. I eat three square meals a day and sleep all right."

That is a characteristic attitude of soldiers. Rather, it used to be so. Doubtless you remember the awful toll of life taken among the soldiers engaged at Chickamagua during the Spanish-American war. If you do not you can easily look it up. Those boys in blue "died like flies" Flies caused the death of most of those stricken with typhoid and dysentery.

It came about in this way. Human excreta carries the bacteria and typhoid fever, cholera, dysentery, summer complaint, tuberculosis and inestinal diseases of other varieties. Flies feed on human excreta, as you know if you have kept your eyes open.

The great white plague—tuberculosis—plain, deadly consumption of the lungs, causes more deaths than any other disease in the United States. Flies are a big factor in the spread of this frightful ailment. To go into details of the subject is very disgusting, but disgust will not kill anyone. Consumption will and flies help.

Assuming that bedridden consumptives deposit their sputum only in closed vessels which flies cannot enter, consider the careless consumptive on the street. He has a coughing spell, raises germ-laden pus from his infected lungs and spits into the highway. Flies immediately swarm on this sputum, feed, cover their padded, hairy feet with the stuff and buzz into the nearest open window or door.

They alight on food spread on the dinner table—perhaps on the butter or in the milk. The germs deposited may not affect a vigorous person, but a member of the family a little under the weather, a little low in vitality, may become infected.

More Recruits Enlisted.

Washington, April 4.—Since recruiting was begun to secure the 20,000 need to bring the army up to maximum strength 2,225 had been accepted from 8,689 applying. San Francisco, Chicago and New York led in the number of recruits applying with 451, 383 and 356 respectively. The number accepted were: Chicago, 73; San Francisco, 66, and New York 64.

MATTERS.

One Standpoint of Trainmen's Demands.

The St. Louis Times many years one of the staunchest advocates and defenders of organized labor, in a recent issue sounds a warning to country upon the possible effects of the demands of railroad engineers and trainmen, which is of particular interest at this time, when the negotiations surrounding the demands of the men upon the Western railroads for the so called "Eight Hour Day" are approaching a crisis. The "Time" says, under the heading, "Killing the Goose":—

Railroad employes had better temper their demands with a bit of reason or the first thing we know these some employes will be cut with remonstrances and petitions making a desperate effort to head off Federal control of rates, Federal ownership, and Federal control of wages.

If the present arbitrary stand of the engineers and firemen, along with conductors and trainmen, is to continue, there is no way to avoid a comprehensive Federal investigation and possible Federal control of all branches of the railroad industry. The reason is that the railroads find themselves unable to meet the demands of the engineers and firemen, conductors and trainmen. The employes declare there will be no arbitration. A strike only, they say, will follow the refusal of the roads to grant the eight-hour day and wage advance. A tie-up looms. And the public will not stand for a railroad tie-up any more than will the Government. A prolonged difference in which strikers refuse to arbitrate would bring about the Federal control. A congressional inquiry into public ownership of railroads has already been proposed in a resolution at Washington.

The engineers and firemen, along with the conductors and trainmen demand an eight-hour day. Present wages are to be accepted, but time and a half for overtime is included in the demand. The increase would amount to about 25 percent. It would cost the railroads \$100,000,000 a year, officials declare. Railroad employes are in a good position to understand the

ago and by chance stopped off
and visited the university. The
great architect was instantly
struck by the architectural posi-
bilities of the adaptation of the
Taos architecture used, and by
its purity and distinction. He
came in touch with the univer-
sity authorities by his inquiries,
and because of his interest the

university finally was able to
secure his services as super-
visor.

It is hoped that one unit of
the new building may be ready
for use during the coming year.
More than a year, however, will
be required to complete the
building, which will be the most
important addition to the univer-
sity's plant since the construc-
tion of Rodey Hall.

The Fourth Annual Inter-
Scholastic Track and Field
Meet at the State University
April 27 to 29 will be the large-
est athletic gathering ever held
in the state. It is now certain
that every high school in New
Mexico will be represented and
all but two will have entries in
all the main events. The uni-
versity has made arrangements
to entertain one hundred or
more of the visiting athletes.

Action of the State Board of
Education last week provides
that graduates of the university
school of education shall receive
certificates permitting them to
teach in New Mexico without
further examination. This is a
concession for which the univer-
sity has been insisting for some-
time past and considerable grati-
fication is expressed at its grant-
ing by the state board, as it will
be of material advantage to
graduates of this school who
desire to enter teaching in this
state.
