HON. W. C. REID BEFORE NEW MEXICO UNIVERSITY.

Speaking at the commencement exercises of the University of New Mexico on "The University and its relation to the people", Hon. W. C. Reid, former attorney general, and now general state solicitor for the Santa Fe railway, urged even broader activities for the state's higher educational institutions than have been assumed even in such advanced institutions as Wisconsin and Kansas state universities. The University's service to the state, Mr. Reid declared, should lead it into active participation in all forms of social and industrial activities. He particularly urged legislative appropriation to sufficient to render active the state resources commission which he held necessary to the successful interesting of capital in large development, such as iron manufacture, drainage, forest promotion and use stock feeding. The lack of accurate and properly classified data the speaker said had been New Mexico's most serious handicap in the development of its great resources.

"The University could be of great additional service" said Mr. Reid, "by furnishing a course in practical government. It is surprising how little our university graduates know about the actual machinery of our government. It takes more than incorruptibility and intelligence to make an efficient public official. It requires specific training. Men should not take office to learn, but to perform. The business of our government is the only one that I know of where totally inexperienced men are called to fill high official places. Any railway system in the United States adopting such a system would be bankrupt in thirty days. In this respect democracy is woefully inefficient and there is no way to overcome this inefficiency, of which I know, than to have special training in governmental matters in the universities. It is one of the greatest needs of the state."

Mr. Reid pointed out the rapidly growing tendency to call the college graduate to positions of public trust. "This fact," he said, "has a special application in our own state. There is said to be a demand on the part of native people of this state for a greater representation in the higher offices of the state. The demand should be respected

office is qualified to fill it. More of the native young men of New Mexico would be qualified if they could be induced to attend the high schools and universities. If this is done I feel sure there will never be such a thing as a race issue in our politics. The intellectually strong and the broadly educated will always govern not only in this country but in every country on the face of the earth. This is a law higher than written constitutions or statutes. I believe an earnest effort should be made to get more of our native young men and women into the high schools and universities of New Mexico. We need them as teachers in our schools especially. But wonderful opportunities before them in other fields."

Mr. Reid referred especially to the opportunities in Latin America and to the need for trained men and women there who understand the people and who speak the Spanish language. He referred to the University's new department of Latin American training as one which should prove of greatest usefulness to the state and its young people.

Mr. Reid urged more permanent, stable and systematic financial support for the higher educational institutions so they could know what to expect in revenue from year to year and so that their officers might be freed of the necessity of "lobbying" before each successive session of the legislature. He gave it as his personal view that the state's colleges would thrive better under a single board of governors.

Urging New Mexico parents to send their children to New Mexico schools Mr. Reid pointed to \$300,000 a year carried out of New Mexico for cost of attending foreign institutions and the far greater economic loss in service of these young people to the state; the majority of whom he thought seldom returned to the state after college work is done.

"Not only is the loss to the state," said Mr. Reid, "but to these young people who make New Mexico their home after college days are over there is great personal loss. I refer to acquaintances with men and conditions acquired and friendships formed during the college years. In great universities counting their students by thousands it is absurd that a student gets to know personally the members even of his own class. In our smaller New Mexico schools, we have the advantage first of instruction by hands of department, instead of assignments

Railroad News on Increasing Wages

If the railroad companies grant the demands of the trainmen, the companies will be compelled to pay an additional \$100,000,000 a year to the trainmen. There is only one place where this amount of money can be raised. It must necessarily come from the public in the shape of increased rates. The amount is approximately five per cent of the present freight revenue to all of the railroads of the country.

Some sympathy and support have been gained by the trainmen by reason of the false impression that they are making a sincere and genuine demand for an eight hour day. An eight hour day in the labor world means eight hours of work for eight hours of pay. In the railway service it is entirely different. There are two standards of a "day"—hours worked or miles run, either one—and whichever will produce the more pay is the one used by employees in determining the amount of their wages.

The employees are not demanding an eight hour day as the term is generally understood, as many of them are now working less time. What they want is an eight hour basic day from which to compute overtime. The leaders of the pres-

ent movement are asking for ten hours pay for eight hours or less, or 100 miles or less, with time and a half for overtime. They are placing no limit on actual hours worked a day—the vital points is when to begin figuring overtime.

Under the present system of operation, which we believe to be as economical as possible, their demands would compel every family in the United States to contribute an additional \$5 a year to wages already admitted to be the highest paid for skilled employees in the United States.

So much for the definition of what of "day" is in the railroad world. The railroads want the people to know that they are not resisting what is commonly known as the "eight hour day." I take the liberty of quoting Mr. Val Fitzpatrick, Vice-President of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, who explains the nature of the real demands in his language:

"There is quite a difference between an eight hour work day an eight hour basic work day. The eight hour basic work day (the system proposed by the train service) contemplates that eight hours shall be the basis for a day's work, and anything in excess shall be paid for as overtime. Under such a system there is no limit to the hours that may be worked."

Give these five minutes to memory and for impression.

UNIVERSITY EXERCISES.

(Continued.)

"The time has not yet come, nor do I anticipate that it will come immediately, when we can add strictly professional schools in law and medicine. No have been able to effect a grouping of courses, however, by which work equivalent to the first two years of both law and medicine, is offered and which when completed, will be accepted at face value for two of the four years courses in the best schools of law and medicine of this country. A school of pharmacy is necessary here and should be added as quickly as our equipment and resources will permit.

"During the year we have completed establishment of a course in special training for service in the Latin American countries. This course is very properly regarded as an important addition to our equipment for service to the state. There is an insistent and steadily growing demand for young men and women who are trained in the language, geography, economic and social conditions and in the history and needs of the Latin American nations. We are now prepared to supply that training. Men and women who have it will readily find themselves in demand for positions as teachers, sales people, executive, factory representatives; placed in fact in every branch of the business which our great commercial leaders are so eager to carry into the countries south of the Rio Grande. The language of these countries in the Spanish language and in introducing this special course of training into an institution in a state where more than fifty per cent of the people are born to a knowledge of the Spanish language we believe the University is performing a notably useful service both to the nation and to the state.

"During the coming year we will inaugurate a department of business education; not of the ordinary business college type, but on the broad plan of training in the ry. of business, waste elimination, management, publicity, efficiency—first principles which in the past it has been necessary for most American business men to learn in the costly school of experience. It will be a practical course of im-

UPHOLDS OBREGON SCOTT PACT.

Mexican Forces are to Demonstrate Ability to Control Bandit region. U. S. Troops to stay in Mexico, Obregon has agreed to police Border and to place troops in Bandit zone.

Gen. Carranza has agreed to Maj. Gen. Scott's informal understanding with Gen. Obregon, which provides that Carranza forces shall endeavor to show their ability to control the situation in northern Mexico while American troops remain in Mexico for the time being.

Secretary of war Baker laid before president Wilson and the cabinet today the information brought here by Maj. Gen. Scott. After the cabinet meeting in was reiterated that no armed intervention was in prospect and that the situation apparently was improving.

Information before the cabinet was to the effect that the Carranza government was making headway in controlling country and establishing civil government.

The net result of the military conference at El Paso, as reported Monday by Maj. Gen. H. L. Scott to secretary of war Baker, has been to convince the Carranza government that the United States has no other purpose in its operations in northern Mexico than to stamp out brigandage; and as a consequence, there exists substantially an unwritten understanding that Carranza forces shall endeavor to demonstrate their ability to handle the situation as the necessary first step toward withdrawal of the American punitive expedition.

Gen. Scott believes Gen. Obregon is acting in good faith and that the border situation is less critical today.

OUR PUBLIC FORUM

VII.--Hon. Elihu Root On Woman's Sphere



The question of Woman Suffrage is an issue before the American people. Twelve states have adopted it, four more states vote upon it this fall and it is strongly urged that it become a platform demand of the national political parties. It is therefore the privilege and the duty of every voter to study carefully this subject. Hon. Elihu Root, in discussing this question before the Constitutional Convention of New York, recently said in part:

"I am opposed to the granting of suffrage to women, because I believe that it would be a loss to women, to all women and to every woman; and because I believe it would be an injury to the State, and to every man and every woman in the State. It would be useless to argue this if the right of suffrage were a natural right. If it were a natural right, then women should have it though the heavens fall. But if there be any one thing settled in the long discussion of this subject, it is that suffrage is not a natural right, but is simply a means of government, and the sole question to be discussed is whether government by the suffrage of men and women will be better government than by the suffrage of men alone.

Into my judgment, sir, there enters no element of the inferiority of women. It is not that woman is inferior to man, but it is that woman is different from man; that in the distribution of powers, of capacities, of qualities, our Maker has created man adapted to the performance of certain functions in the economy of nature and society, and woman adapted to the performance of other functions.



mediate practical value in the
lives of those who pursue it.

"Two others departments are
urgent immediate needs of this
University, to meet constant
public demand. One in an ef-
fective extension department
which can aid those unable to
attend the University to receive
or complete college courses by
correspondence, and which can
lend direct assistance in particu-
lar subjects to those seeking it
in connection with work in hand.
The University's present exten-
sion work is so hampered by
lack of necessary funds as to
render it ineffective. The other
necessary department in a sum-
mer school. During February,
March and April of each year
since I have been president here
hardly a day has passed without
an inquiry as to our summer
school. We have felt it unwise
to attempt a summer school un-
til such time as our plant was
more nearly complete. We
can't hope to do so until we
have met the expenses. Current
conditions here are ideal for
summer school work and be-
cause of these and other, be-
cause of historical, geographical
and other advantages and dis-
advantages we would be able to
conduct it at a minimal cost the
department which we are needs
and which will be a strength
to the institution. We are
working. We are appropriating
sufficient to meet operat-
ing expenses in order to put
the summer school into imme-
diate operation."

"As Capt. P. has point-
ed out here today the University
should be prepared to furnish in-
formation of an expert character
upon all economic, social and
governmental problems of the
state and all its political divi-
sions; upon municipal problems
of utilities and streets; upon
educational and other such and
efficiency.

Such facilities would be ag-
reeably used by the people of New

Mexico were they available, but
these, too, must unit until their
necessity in more fully under-
stood by those in authority and
money provided for mechan-
ical operation.

"It is with satisfaction that I
point out to you the surround-
ing 300 acres of contiguous
campus, now the property of the
University.

ditional benefit of becoming
personally acquainted with every
member of each student enroll-
ment during the four years of
the college course. The value
of these acquaintances in future
practical life work will be found
past reckoning; by those who
count New Mexico their home
and working field."

New Mexico's advantages
and opportunities are tremen-
dous, the speaker said; but he
thought one trouble with our
development was that many who
came for business or health
could not come to regard New
Mexico wholly as home. "We
should give our whole allegiance
to this state" he concluded, "we
should beautify our cemeteries
with a view of some day occupy-
ing them. Until that time we
should be thoroughly alive to
the fact that we are most for-
tunate in that fate has cast our
lot in a state where in life can
be made so pleasant and profit-
able; where the bigness of things
produces bigness of mind and
