Regent President Robert Certificates of Appreciation
 Sanchez presented certificates
 of appreciation to Marion Cottrell, past president of the Faculty
 Senate, Robert Mateucci, past president of the Alumni Association,
 and Charles Penny, past president of the Associated Students of
 UNM. On behalf of the Regents, he thanked them for their dedicated
 service to the Board during their tenure as advisors.

Lila Bird, past president of the Graduate Student Association,
 was unable to attend the meeting and Secretary Anne Brown was asked
 to mail the certificate to her.

President Richard Peck Administrative Report
 introduced Ted Martinez, President
 of the Albuquerque Technical-Vocational Institute, who gave a brief
 report.

T-VI Mr. Martinez said that, with the help and cooperation
 of the University of New Mexico, he believes that T-VI will become
 a successful community college. He stated that he was flattered
 when President Peck invited him to lunch soon after Dr. Peck
 arrived in Albuquerque, and he was impressed with Dr. Peck's
 knowledge of T-VI and its mission. UNM's Office of Admissions is
 working closely with T-VI to make the transfer process for students
 easy and smooth. Because of the recent change in the funding
 formula which permits T-VI to receive Commission on Higher
 Education funding for remedial instruction, faculty from T-VI are
 able to conduct remedial courses on the UNM campus. The two
 institutions work closely in other areas also. Once a year the
 Dean of T-VI's Arts and Sciences Department meets with UNM deans
 to discuss ways that New Mexico students can be better served.

Mr. Martinez concluded his remarks by thanking the Board of
 Regents for their support of T-VI.

College of Engineering President Peck introduced Dr. James E. Thompson, Dean of the College of Engineering, who presented a brief overview of the College. He stressed the importance of engineering education to economic development in New Mexico and outlined the academic, research, and outreach activities of each of the college departments -- Chemical and Nuclear Engineering, Civil Engineering, Computer Science, Electrical and Computer Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. He explained the mission and programs of the College's research units -- the Center for High Technology Materials, New Mexico Engineering Research Institute, the Center for Micro-Engineered Ceramics, and the Institute for Space Nuclear Power Systems.

He summarized his presentation by stating that the College offers complete undergraduate and graduate programs in seven disciplines; has an active continuing education program for New Mexico via television and evening offerings; supports an aggressive minority engineering program to recruit and retain students; sponsors active and growing research programs; and benefits from the close proximity of the federal laboratories.

The Regents thanked Dean Thompson for an interesting and informative report.

Ray Marshall President Peck introduced Ray Marshall, Coordinator of Disabled Services for UNM, and said that he had asked Ray to attend the meeting so that the Regents could meet him and recognize him for his achievements. At the University, most of Ray's efforts are focused on helping disabled students obtain appropriate academic support services. However, he is an effective advocate for the disabled in other ways. He is president of the local chapter of the Association for Blind Athletes and since 1980 has served on the National Board of Directors of the Association for Blind Athletes. From 1980 to 1988 he served on the Olympic Committee on Sports for the Disabled where he played a major part in getting the Olympic Committee to consider the area of sports for the disabled as a major olympic activity. For eight of the past ten years, Ray has been named "most valuable player" in the world series of beep baseball. His association with various sports activities for the disabled, such as beep baseball and skiing, have taken him to competitions around the globe. Recently, a crew from NBC's "Today Show" was on campus to film Ray at work and with his beep team at practice. CBS is flying him to its studio in Washington, D.C. to do a segment about him for its "Nightwatch" program scheduled to air on August 20, and Ray has been the subject of articles published in the New York Times, and other prominent newspapers.

President Peck and the Regents congratulated Ray for his many achievements with disabled students and for his personal accomplishments.

Mr. Marshall thanked the Regents for their recognition and said that the University of New Mexico is considered the top

university in the country for academic and recreational services for disabled students.

Enrollment Orcilia Zuniga Forbes, Vice President for Student Affairs, distributed the official enrollment report for Summer 1990 and the preliminary enrollment report for Fall 1990. She said that total summer enrollment was 8,873 which is twenty-five students less than 1989; however, total undergraduate enrollment was at a five-year high. The beginning freshmen headcount in University College is at its highest since the closure of the General College. Returning student headcount (6,730) represented a five-year high and reflects the improving retention effort at UNM. There was no significant change in the proportion of male-to-female students for Summer 1990 compared to previous summers.

As of Monday, August 13, 1990, Fall enrollment showed an increase of 1.46% compared to Fall 1989. New beginning freshmen headcount in University College was down by 64 students (3.84%) compared to this time last Fall. A new student registration is scheduled for Friday, August 17, which should help to boost the beginning freshmen headcount. Student credit hours are up 1.09% over Fall 1989. All indicators show that by the time the official enrollment statistics are published in September, both headcount and student credit hours will increase compared to Fall 1989.

Student Award Vice President Forbes announced that Gary Lee Aragon, a medical student from northern New Mexico, was notified in Spring 1990 that he was one of thirty medical students to receive a Commonwealth Fund Fellowship in Academic Medicine for Minority Students. The award recognizes potential for a career in research and academic medicine; and each fellow will receive \$5,000 to assist in a research project. Mr. Aragon was a presidential scholar at UNM for four years, and will graduate from the School of Medicine in 1991. He plans to practice in rural areas after his residency and then plans to return to research and academic medicine.

President Peck concluded the Administrative Report by saying that during recent trips to other parts of New Mexico, he and Mrs. Peck had visited UNM's Branch Campuses and were impressed with the vitality of their programs. A number of representatives from the Branch Campuses were in the audience and Dr. Peck expressed appreciation for their presence and also for the warmth with which he and Mrs. Peck were received during their visits.

David Mc Kinney, Vice President for Business and Finance, presented the following proposed capital outlay projects to be forwarded to the Commission on Higher Education for submission to the Governor and the

1991-92 Legislative Capital Projects Request

Legislature:

General Classroom Facility - Requested \$8,500,000 to provide general classroom space consisting of approximately 33 to 35 teaching spaces, including lecture halls, classrooms, and seminar rooms.

Zimmerman Library/Colonial Southwest Research Center - Requested \$1,800,000 to remodel the entry of Zimmerman Library and to add compact storage space.

Handicap Accessibility - Requested \$750,000 to provide for numerous handicap accessibility projects including improvement of elevators, lifts and ramps, and restroom accessibility.

Learning Technologies Center - Requested \$1,250,000 to convert the Industrial Arts Complex of the College of Education into a two-story academic space for instruction in advanced teaching technologies.

Science and Technology Complex - Requested \$300,000 in planning money for a state-of-the-art research complex to facilitate joint research projects between the departments of Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Engineering, and others.

Johnson Center, Phase III - Requested \$4,000,000 to complete the expansion and renovation of Johnson Center.

Long-Term Ecological Research Facility - Requested \$380,000 to provide facilities for long-term ecological research on the Servillita Reserve.

Yale Mall - Requested \$600,000 to increase the funding for the completion of Yale Mall.

Campus Street Paving - Requested \$600,000 to provide for the resurfacing and improvement of Redondo Drive.

Parking Structure III - Requested \$4,500,000 to provide approximately 1,000 spaces for use in the Fine Arts and Johnson Center areas.

Cancer Research and Treatment Center Expansion - Requested \$4,750,000 to relieve overcrowded facilities and support facilities.

Hospital Equipment - Requested \$2,000,000 to continue replacement of outdated and deteriorating equipment.

Computer Classroom and Lecture Hall (Gallup) - Requested \$2,000,000 to construct computer teaching facilities and a major lecture hall.

Library/Student Services Expansion (Los Alamos) - Requested

\$1,000,000 to provide additional space for the learning resource center and various other student services.

Learning Resource Center, Phase II (Valencia) - Requested \$1,375,000 to provide for classrooms, science laboratories and additional space for community outreach programs.

Mr. Gil Berry, Landscape Architect, showed architect's drawings and explained the Yale Mall project to the Regents.

Vice President Mc Kinney asked the Regents to approve the projects to be sent to the Commission on Higher Education, and Regent Sanchez moved that the Regents approve the projects as presented. The motion was seconded by Regent Hecker and carried.

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Regent Siegfried Hecker explained that by resolution adopted September 8, 1987, the Regents established a nine-person Advisory Group consisting of three parents of chronically disabled children and six health professionals or other persons with experience in the delivery of health services to children. At that time Charlotte Abbink, John Arango, Alice King, and George Omer, M.D. were appointed to three-year terms on the Advisory Group. Their terms have expired and because of the excellent service each has rendered to the hospital, it was recommended that they be reappointed to second three-year terms, September 1990 to August 1993.

It was moved by Regent Sanchez, seconded by Regent Johns, that the Regents approve the reappointments as requested. Carried.

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Regent Hecker asked the Regents to approve the re-appointment of Laree E. Perez and the appointment of Don Perkins and Daniel Sanchez to the UNM Hospital Board of Trustees. He explained that Mrs. Perez's term expired in May 1990 and she has been nominated to serve another term. Daniel Sanchez has been nominated by the All Indian Pueblo Council and Don Perkins is nominated to replace Nedra Gathings whose term expired in May 1990.
