RAILROAD ATTORNEY BUJAC

A Few Questions Asked the Chairman (By Appointment) of the County Board

IS HE REPUBLICAN IN PRINCIPLE OR DEMOCRAT?

Is he Not an Admirer and Follower of Two Prominent, Red-hot Republicans--Taft and Roosevelt?
Did not the Railroad Cause Him to get Appointment as Commissioner?

The Current has often stated that it is a friend of Capt. E. P. Bujac and as a friend desires to propound the captain a few pertinent questions pertaining to the office of county commissioner seeing that he has published a creed or platform in the Argus, the republican paper of this town, defending his position. The Current believes that when a man places himself before the people asking for their suffrage he should not object to answering questions pertinent to the office which he seeks, and therefore the Current will ask:

First. Are you not carrying and riding on a pass furnished by the Santa Fe Railway?

Second. Are you not the railway attorney at Carlsbad?

Third. Did you not get your appointment as county commissioner through the influence of the railway?

Fourth. Are you not a staunch friend of one T. Roosevelt, former republican president?

Fifth. Have you not stated that you are a Roosevelt republican--whatever that is?

Special Tax for Erection of Building to Preserve County Records

It has been reported that the county board made a levy amounting to \$30,000 for the erection of an addition to the court house. The facts are as stated in published report of the proceedings of the board that a two per cent levy be made with a view of providing a fund whereby a vault or building of some kind to be decided on later whereby the proper security may be given district court records. This action was made necessary by the receipt of the following letters from the officials of this judicial district who would be justified in removing the records to a place of safety outside the county unless some action was taken by the board to provide suitable quarters for their safe keeping.

The following letters are self explanatory:

My Dear Sir--Up to last year the levy for Court purposes in Eddy County was 1 mill. Last year, by reason of the collection of certain forfeited bonds, this fund reached proportions where

Dear Sir--During the recent term of Court in Eddy County my attention was called to the fact that the County had practically no protection from fire for her court records and the files belonging to the office of the Clerk of the Court.

Most of these are kept in the vault in the Sheriff's office as there is no other place to put them but I do not consider this at all safe as the doors of the vault, if closed, which is seldom, do not seem to fit well enough to protect the contents from a fire of any size.

A fire proof vault somewhere in the court house for the District Clerk's office, is a necessity to protect the County from the

tude on levying a small assessment for building some time in the future, a suitable vault for the preservation of our public records, I beg to quote you from a letter I received from him on the subject on reporting to him that I had used his name in connection with the matter:

"I have your letter of July 12, and note the memorial which has been presented to the County Commissioners. I have felt very deeply the lack of suitable vaults for our District Court Records.

The loss of these would perhaps mean the unseizement of a great number of titles and would be a public calamity. While I do not recall having threatened to remove these records to Roswell, I might very well have done so, I deem their ultimate preservation of very much greater moment than any temporary inconvenience to the community by their removal to judicial headquarters."

By the above quotation you can readily see his position on the subject.

Chosen by Democratic Primaries for District Judge and District Attorney

BY MAJORITIES OF 400

Three Counties for Scott and Chavez Gives More Than Two to One for McClure

The result of the primary election last Saturday proved as much an agreeable surprise to the friends of Judge McClure and K. K. Scott as is seldom the case for both were elected by majorities reaching close to 400. Here in Eddy county the friends of Reese made a hot fight and the many old true friends of the Dow family sent him away ahead so it was considerable of a surprise when it was found that Scott carried the other three counties of the district. The fact that Dow carried a railway pass was unknown here and would lessened his vote had it been published. The following is the result in the other three counties on judge and district attorney:

Chaves: McClure 1244, Reese 592. McClure's majority 652.

Scott 1124, Dow 637. Scott's majority 487.

Curry: McClure 698, Reese 496. McClure's majority 202.

Scott 740, Dow 402. Scott's majority 338.

Roosevelt: Reese had 369 majority and Scott 193 majority.

The chairman, clerk and six members of the county central committee met yesterday afternoon and canvassed the vote of the county. The final canvass showed 44 for McClure and only 2 for Reese at Lovington while the first report to each was 26 for Reese and 24 for McClure.

This with other canvasses from the reports, showed a reduced Reese's majority from 158 as at first reported to 77 as the official count stands now.

Quince, Nadine and Monument sent in no returns and at Monument it is said no primaries were held there so the committee for that precinct is said, refused to hold the election, being in possession of poll books, tickets, etc.

Noting has been heard to date from the poll books sent to Quince and Nadine. The toll was the vote in Eddy county:

I found it possible to recommend to the Commissioners that the levy be reduced to 1 mill, and that is the levy for the current tax year. The County Treasurer, Mr. Merham, informs me, however, that the proceeds of that levy will not exceed \$2,000. The fund has been reduced to something like \$4,500 after deducting the expenses of the last term of Court. With only \$2,000 coming in for the coming year, we would have insufficient funds during 1911 to conduct the Court as each term in the County costs from \$3,000 to \$4,500. I therefore recommend that the levy be increased from 1 mill to 2 1/2 mills for the ensuing year.

The Clerk's office has need of a storage vault for papers in disposed of cases and also for records of the Court. I am requesting Mr. Roberts to write you just what kind of a vault would be desirable. I think this might be located in the basement.

If your Board can arrange for such a vault, it will tend to the safety of the public records in the Clerk's office.
