PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE ASSOCIATION OF STUDENTS

The following amendments to the Constitution of the Association of Students have been approved by a majority vote of the Student Senate and adopted by more than two-thirds of the students voting in the regular election of April 21, 1961. Approval of the faculty is requested.

The sections amended are Section 2 (b) and Section 8 of Article III. The text and proposed text of the amended sections are as follows:

Section 2. Qualifications for Representation (b)

The Student Senate shall be empowered to judge the qualifications of its members and to determine the eligibility of the representatives to be seated.

Section 8. Session

The Student Senate shall begin session on the second Friday of the academic year. At this time, the representatives shall present their credentials and preliminary business may be conducted; however, no legislation may be enacted permanently other than confirmation of appointments made by the Student Body President until the first meeting after class elections. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the representatives plus one.

Proposed wording:

Section 2. Qualifications for Representation (b)

The Student Senate shall be empowered to judge the qualifications of its members, to determine the eligibility of the representatives to be seated, and to determine a quorum to do business.

Section 8. Session

The Student Senate shall begin session within the first two weeks of the academic year. At this time, the representatives shall present their credentials, and preliminary business may be conducted. However, no legislation may be enacted other than confirmation of appointments made by the Student Body President, until the first meeting after class elections.
