EDITOR'S NOTE

Due to a variety of circumstances the subscription price of the NEW MEXICO ANTHROPOLOGIST must be raised to \$2.00 a year. This will not affect subscriptions already received. Individual numbers retail for 60 cents.

Rather than carry a nearly two-year old date, an attempt has been made to bring nominal date and actual printing date in closer agreement by issuing no numbers for 1942, and by consolidating volume VI with volume VII. The whole number maintains a faithful record of individual numbers. Subscribers for volume VI will receive VI-VII, and those who have already subscribed for volume VII (in addition to VI) will receive volume VIII.
