## Commissioners Proceedings.

(Cont'd)

After having examined further into the matter by the reading of contract forms, etc., Mr. Paul B. Dalies of Beldn presented a petition signed by several residents of this County petitioning the Board to enter into contract with said Departments, by appropriating the necessary funds, for the appointment of such a Home Agent. Thereupon another petition also signed by various residents of the County, was presented, petitioning for the same purpose, but requesting that the person appointed to such position be a resident of this County, and that would be able to speak both Spanish and English languages fluently and recommending therein the services of Mrs. Telesforo Mirabal for such a position. Miss Hawk, the State Leader, then stated that it was contrary to the rules of the department to appoint a person resident of the same County to such position. After due and prolonged deliberations and conclusions in the matter, the Board thereupon deferred their decision and action on the same until the meeting of this Board to be held in June 1918.

Whereas, in pursuance to the laws of the State of New Mexico relative to depositories for public moneys The First National Bank of Belen, New Mexico, has filed its written proposal to receive such moneys on deposit, together with its agreement to pay interest on daily balances of such moneys so deposited at the rate of three per cent per cent per annum, and

Whereas said bank is authorized by laws of the United States to receive public moneys, has deposited with this Board of Finance a bond in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, with The National Surety Company, of New York, as surety, and whereas said board has been approved by this Board; and

Whereas the capital and surplus of the said First National Bank of Belen is sixty Five Thousand Dollars, and this Board may under the law designate said bank a depository of public moneys of the county in the amount of 75 per cent of its capital and surplus;

Now, the before, said First National Bank of Belen, is hereby

designated as the depository of the public moneys of this County in the amount of Seventy Five Per centum of its said capital and surplus,

Mr. James G. Hamilton, Secretary of the Valencia County Agricultural War Council, appeared before the Board and presented a report of said Council of their acts and doings with the donation made by this Board of the amount of \$500.00 to them at their meeting held in May, 1917, as follows: Total payments made by said Council up to May 18, 1918, \$288.25. Balance on deposit \$211.75.

Said report was approved and said Council was instructed to use the balance now on hand in the purchase of improved seeds for obtaining better crops.

The Board then adjourned until the following day, May 21, 1918, and on said day the Board met pursuant to adjournment, the same members being presented.

The minutes of the two previous meetings of this Board were read and approved.

Upon recommendation of the County Highway Superintendent with reference to the petition referred to him by the Board of the Huning Mill road, the County Surveyor is hereby instructed to make a plat of this road and to file the same with the Clerk of the Board and the County Highway Superintendent is hereby instructed to improve the same for about one mile as in his report therein recommended.

Whereas, the County Highway Superintendent recommends that a certain road lying in Precinct No. 22 be vacated and discontinued, as it is not very necessary and the repairs to be made on same are burdensome and in excess of the benefits derived therefrom; and

Whereas, this road forks from the El Cerro Road at a point East from the present store of Aragon & Vigil to the south and southeast where it branches with the San Fernandez Road, and is at the present time about eighty feet in width; therefore,

Be it resolved, that a committee of three freeholders of this County is hereby appointed and to report to the Board of County Commissioners at their next regular meeting as is provided by Section 2655 of the 1915 Codified laws of New Mexico. Said Committee to consist of the following: Mr. Diego Aragon, Mr. Moises

Mirabal and Mr. Guillermo Orona.

The estimates of the County Highway Superintendent for the construction of several bridges on the Los Lentes Road, involving a total cost of \$710.48, and for the construction of three bridges on the El Cerro Road, involving a total cost of \$385.67, and also for the construction of a bridge over the spillway ditch on the Los Santos road, provided the owners thereof furnish half the amount of the total cost of constructing same, said half cost amounting to \$82.89, was approved and the County Clerk is hereby instructed to draw a warrant in favor of Mr. A. E. St. Morris, County Highway Superintendent, (To be cont'd.)

## RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST.

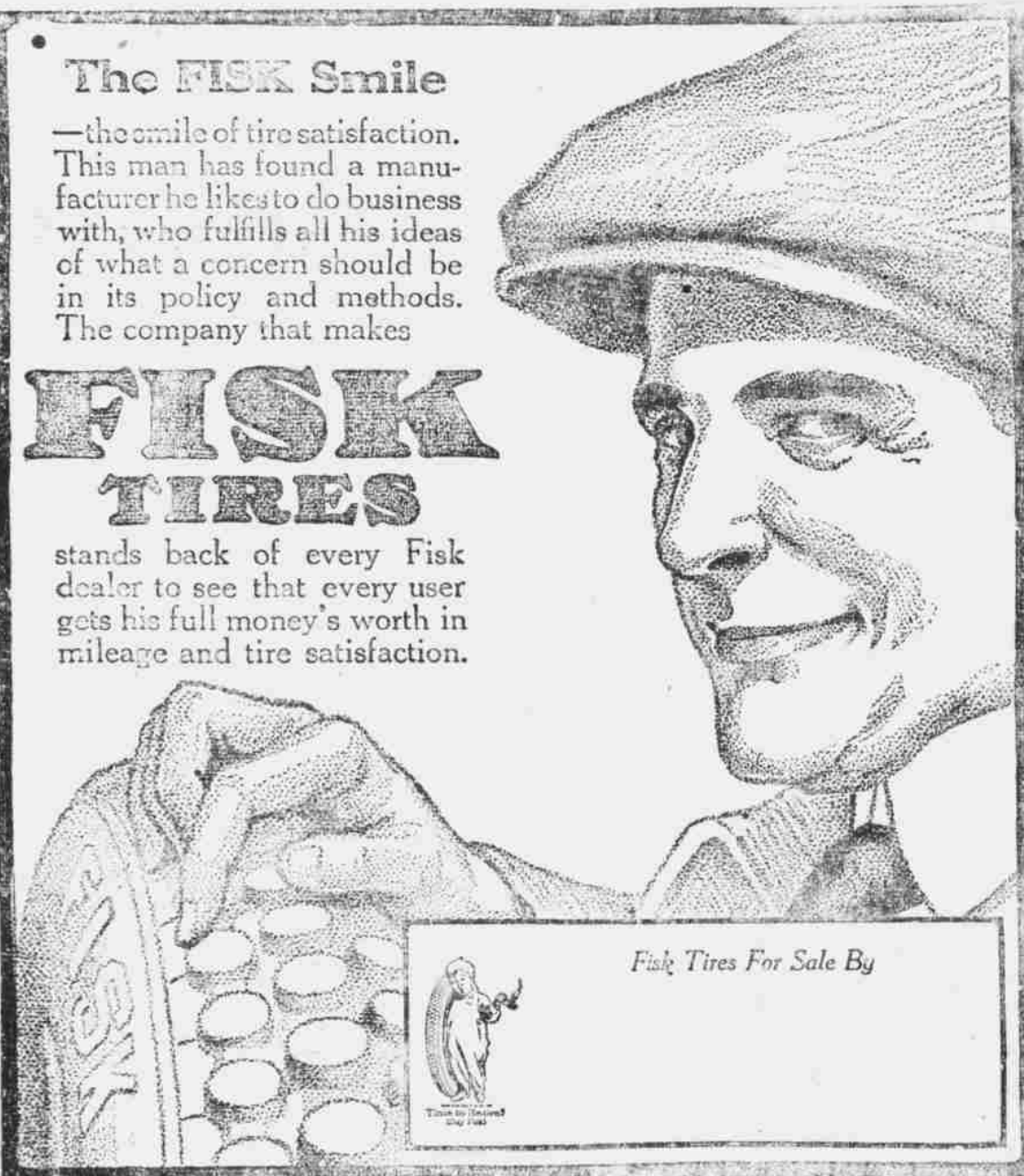

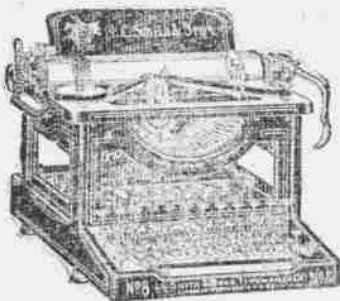
