NOTICE OF CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS.

To the Pueblo of Acoma and the Indians of the Pueblo of Acoma, and each of them, Greeting:

You are hereby notified that the United States of America has filed in the United States District Court for the District of New Mexico a petition alleging that in the opinion of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs of United States it has become necessary to acquire under authority of an act of congress approved May 25, 1918, a certain tract of land situate at Acomita, Valencia County, New Mexico, within the Pueblo of Acoma Land Grant, belonging to said defendants, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a point 16796 ft. west and 4598 ft. north of the northeast corner of section 1, township 9 north, range 7 west, of the New Mexico Base and Meridian; thence south 3 deg. 32 min. west, 233 ft.; thence south 86 deg. 20 min. east 500 ft.; thence north 3 deg. 40 min. east, 375.3 ft.; thence south 77 deg. 38 min. west to place of beginning, containing 3.5 acres.

That it is necessary and advantageous to acquire title to said tract by condemnation proceedings because in his opinion the Pueblo of Acoma and the Indians of the Pueblo of Acoma are incapable of conveying a full and valid title thereto.

That the said tract is necessary for and is to be used as a site upon which to erect and construct a school building to be used as a day school for the Indians of the Pueblo of Acoma at Acomita aforesaid; that the Commissioner of Indian Affairs through the Secretary of the Interior has requested that this condemnation proceeding be instituted under authority of the act of Congress approved August 1, 1888; that defendant, the Pueblo of Acoma, is a corporation and that the names of the Indians of the Pueblo of Acoma are unknown to petitioner, and that they are all residents of Valencia County aforesaid.

The said defendants are further notified that on August 15, 1919, the said petitioner, United States of America, will present to the United States District Court at the Federal building in Santa Fe, at 10 o'clock a. m., of said day, the Honorable Colin Neblett presiding, its said petition for condemnation, praying the said court to appoint three disinterested freeholders as commissioners to assess the damages which the owners of said tract of land may sustain in consequence of the taking thereof for the uses herein set forth, and to ascertain and appraise the compensation, if any, to be paid for said tract of land.

County Commissioners proceedings.

SPECIAL SESSION

The Board of County Commissioners met in Special Session April 28, 1919. There being present, Hon. Manuel Garcia Chairman, Abel Vigil and Tranquilino Jaramillo members, Salome Jaramillo Deputy Sheriff and Diego Aragon County Clerk.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Whereas a committee consisting of Mrs. J. M. Luna, and Mrs. Telesforo Mirabal appeared before the Board of County Commissioners soliciting subscriptions for the V Liberty Loan and whereas, the Board of County Commissioners realizing the necessity of our nation for funds to defray the cost of the victorious war; therefore be it resolved that it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners to subscribe the sum of \$7,000.00 to the said loan; \$5,000.00 of which are to be paid immediately and \$2,000.00 to be purchased on time payments; Said Bonds to be registered bonds, in the name of the county of Valencia; Be it further resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to draw warrants from time to time to meet the time payments for the \$2,000.00 bond and the chairman of the board is hereby authorized to sign same in behalf of the board of county commissioners.

On suggestion of A. E. St. Morris state highway superintendent the county clerk was instructed to write to the state highway commission to cooperate with \$1,000.00 to aid in cooperation with like amount from county road fund for highway road No. 6 section 12 Precinct No. 16.

Bond of El Paso Bridge & Iron Co. of El Paso Texas on contract of Bridge structure across the Rio Puerco west of Belen was approved. Be it therefore resolved that the salary and expense of inspector placed by state highway engineer for the inspection of the construction of above said bridge be paid by the county of Valencia out of the general road fund, and be it further resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the state highway engineer and The El Paso Bridge and Iron Co., at the same time to request of said bridge company to notify the State Highway Engineer at Santa Fe N. M., and the county clerk of Valencia county the day on which the construction of said bridge is to begin.

Quarterly report ending

March 31, 1919 of Dr. Wittwer as county Health Officer was approved.

Additional bond of \$6500.00 from First National Bank of Belen was approved.

A petition from citizens of Valencia, school district No. 11 on school was referred to County School Superintendent.

Official bond of Antonio J. Archuleta as Justice of the Peace was approved.

Whereas a committee of citizens from various communities of the Rio Grande valley appeared before the board of county commissioners, urging the necessity for active river protection and reestablishment of an authorized agency as custodian and distributor of funds which are to be expended as far as possible, in cooperation with the state engineer and the citizens of threatened localities. Be it therefore resolved that a committee is hereby appointed for the purposes aforesaid; consisting of Emiliano Castillo, Paul B. Dalies, Joe Tondre, Daniel Lucero and Eugene Kempenich, the members which are to file Oath of office with the county clerk and serve without pay; be it further resolved that the said committee is hereby directed to file a complete report of all expenditures with the county clerk, said expenditures not to exceed \$1500.00 out of the Valencia county funds; be it further resolved that in case any member of the above appointed committee fails to file his oath of office or resigns, or in case of vacancy for any other cause, the members of the committee are hereby authorized to appoint a citizen of Valencia county to fill the vacancy, and give notice of appointment in writing to the county clerk.

A petition from citizens of Belen praying for relief for an indigent woman was referred to the regular session.

Claim of county school superintendent for expenses on trip to St. Louis was not approved, being that there was no authorization for its payment.

Thereupon the county commissioners adjourned subject to call of the chairman.

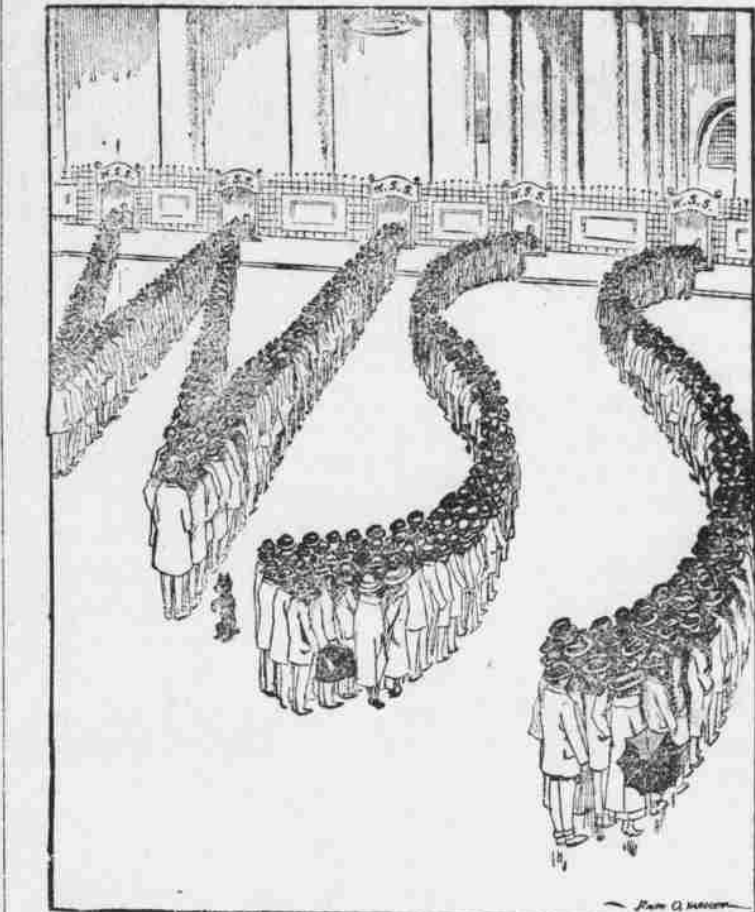

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of THE BELEN OIL COMPANY OF NEW MEXICO (No Stockholders' Liability)

We, the undersigned citizens of the United States and of the State of New Mexico, being desirous of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of New Mexico, do make, sign and acknowledge the following articles and certificate of incorporation, to-wit:

The name of said corporation is The Belen Oil Company of New Mexico, (No Stockholders' Liability).

The principal registered office of said Corporation in the State of New Mexico is at Belen, in the County of Valencia, and the name of the agent in charge thereof, upon whom process against the corporation may be served, is F. B. Calhoun.

The objects for which said corporation is formed are, to contract for the lease and purchase of the right to prospect for, develop and use coal and other minerals, petroleum and gas; to build and own all necessary oil tanks, gas tanks, cars and pipes necessary for the operation of same and to do all things in connection with said business which is necessary to develop and conduct said business which is not contrary to the laws of the State of New Mexico or the laws of any state in which said business may be conducted.

The amount of the total authorized capital stock of said corporation is fifty thousand dollars, divided into five thousand shares of the par value of ten dollars per share. The amount of the capital stock with which said corporation shall commence business is two hundred fifteen shares, of the par value of two thousand one hundred fifty dollars.

After the expiration of said period of three months, the board of directors shall consist of nine members, three of whom shall be elected for a period of one year, three for two years and three for a period of three years to be elected by the stockholders as provided by law.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION of LOS LUNAS IMPROVEMENT COMPANY.

We, the undersigned, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated under and pursuant to the laws of the State of New Mexico, do hereby certify as follows:

1. The name of said corporation is the Los Lunas Improvement Company (no stockholders' liability).

2. The registered office of the corporation is at Los Lunas in the County of Valencia, State of New Mexico, and Mr. Harry P. Owen is designated as the statutory agent therein, in charge thereof, and upon whom process against the corporation may be served.

3. The objects for which the corporation is established are:

(a) To acquire by purchase, lease, location, entry and otherwise, city, town or village lots, agricultural and other lands, and to work, develop and improve the same; to improve city, town or village lots and erect thereon houses, hotels, hospitals and other buildings and structures; to improve and colonize agricultural lands, and to acquire such other property and to engage in such other lines of business as, in the opinion of its board of directors, can be advantageously undertaken in connection therewith, or in addition to the business herein specifically mentioned; to acquire and purchase any and all real or personal property, deemed necessary or advantageous in carrying on its business, or in the promotion of any enterprise in which it may engage; to subdivide, lease, sell, mortgage, and otherwise dispose of its city, town or village lots, agricultural lands and other property; to buy, sell or otherwise dispose of lumber and all necessary building materials; and to do and perform every other act or thing that may be deemed necessary or advisable by its board of directors in the conduct of such business or enterprises, not inconsistent with the laws of the State of New Mexico.

(b) To purchase, obtain by contribution or otherwise acquire to hold, own, operate, improve and otherwise deal in; to sell, rent, mortgage, lease, or otherwise dispose of lands, or any interest therein, whether improved or unimproved, without limit as to amount or location; and to develop the resources of, and turn to account the lands, buildings and rights of the company, by colonizing, mining, clearing, irrigation, planting, farming, grazing, manufacturing, building and otherwise, as may be deemed desirable.

(c) To purchase, construct or otherwise acquire canals, water mains, dams, reservoirs, gas works, electric works, sewers, pavement and other works of public utility, to sell, rent, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of same, and to operate, conduct or manage same.

(d) To purchase, acquire, appropriate, take on lease, hold, control and operate water for any purpose whatsoever, also water rights, water power, and any and all privileges and concessions for the use of water and for the development of water power to be used generally for the purposes of the company, and especially in connection with the generation or supply of electricity for light and power, and in connection with such other uses and purposes as water power may be adapted to.

(e) To acquire by gift, devise, purchase, or otherwise, and to hold, sell, mortgage, bond, lease, transfer or otherwise dispose of same, or any portion thereof, water and water rights for irrigation, power and domestic purposes; to likewise acquire, hold, incur or otherwise dispose of, construct, operate, and maintain reservoirs, dams, canals, ditches, laterals, syphons, flumes, pipe lines, stand pipes, mains, and other water systems of all descriptions, for irrigation, power and domestic purposes, and any interest therein; to take, acquire, hold, incur or dispose of reservoir sites, the rights of way for canals, ditches, laterals, syphons, flumes, pipe lines, and water systems of all kinds; to sell, lease and rent water and water rights, or the use of water in canals and ditches, and to take notes and mortgages on real estate and water rights as security therefor to appropriate and supply water and water rights to the streams of New Mexico, and enjoy the unappropriated direct flow of the flood of the waters of the Rio Grande in accordance with the irrigation laws of New Mexico.

(f) To buy, sell, manufacture, export and import and with all other materials necessary and appurtenant to the business of the corporation, and to maintain warehouses, stores, etc., for the storage of such materials.

4. The amount of the total authorized capital stock of said corporation is \$50,000 divided into 5,000 shares of the par value of ten dollars each.
