TRIUMPH FOR AMERICAN IDEALS

Peace Treaty the Most Momentous Document Ever Prepared by the Hand of Man

The Treaty of Paris is the longest single treaty ever signed. It is six times as long as the treaties of the peace of Westphalia (1648) and ten times as long as the treaty of Vienna (1815); it is as long as the latter and all the subsidiary treaties resulting from it. Though it covers more ground than any other treaty made, it was prepared in half the time required for the peace of Vienna, and in less than one-tenth of the time required for the treaty of Westphalia. This phenomenal result is attributed by European statesmen to the initial adoption of the Covenant of the League of Nations, which provides for the future settlement of a large number of perplexing problems. Despite opinions to the contrary, the verdict of history will unquestionably be that the Peace of Paris carries into effect to a remarkable degree the program accepted in advance by the peoples of the world, and embodied in the Fourteen Points put forth by the American government on January 8, 1918, ten months before the actual signing of the treaty.

The treaty as signed makes a new world, politically, physically, morally and spiritually. The mandatory system ends the old regime of exploitation, and makes wards of the whole world in Asia, Africa and the isles of the sea. The Treaty has established in the place of artificial states natural political and national units. It has removed from the map numerous historic wrongs which have long served to embitter the international relations. It has set the world upon a new path of progress marked by the following guide posts:

1. International co-operation, including the consolidation of all existing international administrative activities.
2. Extensive machinery for co-operation in a League of Nations open to all that prove worthy of membership.
3. The creation of a labor conference and labor bureau to solve the problems of an industrial civilization.
4. A pledge to reduce armaments, and as a first step toward it the disarming of the one nation whose geographical situation has made it a menace to the world.
5. The abolition of conquest by Article X, without interfering with other methods of territorial adjustment.
6. The declaration that any war is a matter of concern to all, and the erection of machinery for dealing with conditions which endanger the peace of the world.
7. An agreement not to go to war before peaceful settlement of disputes has been tried.
8. Automatic provision sanctions for the punishment of the breach of agreements voluntarily taken.
9. A representative Assembly meeting regularly and, among other things, carrying on the work of codifying and revising international law begun by the Hague Conference.

The treaty is the most momentous document ever prepared by the hand of man. It sets the world right about face. It marks the triumph of American ideas, policies and institutions, by extending to a league of sovereign nations the democratic principles first embodied in our league of sovereign states.

LEAGUE OR WAR DECLARES FORD

MANUFACTURER MAKES IT CLEAR HE BELIEVES COVENANT IS A GREAT STEP.

DECLARES "WAR IS MURDER"

Whirlwind of Questions Fall to Shake Composure of Man Who Sues for Million Because He Was Called "Anarchist."

Mt. Clemens, Mich.—The high idealism of Henry Ford has freshened the proceedings of the Ford-Tribune libel case and has brought into the wearisome arguments of counsel and the dull repetition of cross-examinations, a new quality.

For a week the man who has been described as everything from an "anarchist" to the greatest patriot of his day, has been on the stand facing a merciless fire of questions.

During the reading of an article written by John Reed on Henry Ford, and published in the Metropolitan Magazine, the audience in the court chamber violated all precedent by breaking into applause and Mr. Ford, visibly embarrassed, raised his hand in protest.

Tribune counsel had endeavored to quote paragraphs from the Reed article but had been compelled, by objection of Ford attorneys, to introduce the interview in its entirety. In the main it was highly complimentary to Mr. Ford.

"Make Farmer Independent."

"What I want to do," Mr. Ford was quoted as saying, "is to make the farmer as independent as I am; independent of the banks, independent of the trusts, independent of the railroads."

The audience, many of them from the surrounding farms of this community, showed visible evidence of its appreciation of that ideal.

Twice Mr. Ford, wearying of the questions having to do with his knowledge of history, said "Oh, I'll admit that I'm an ignorant idealist if you wish."

"What is an idealist?" queried Tribune counsel.

The innate goodness of the man lighted up his kindly eyes with a new light, as he leaned forward and answered slowly, "I think an idealist is one who tries to make people happy and prosperous. I think I do that a little."

Quiet, unassuming, courteous and patient, Henry Ford made a deep impression on the audience. Not once did he lose his temper under the heckling of opposing attorneys, even when their questions verged on the edge of insult. But when the examination touched on subjects which are close to his heart, the League of Nations, war and the happiness and prosperity of Humanity, counsel found him eagerly alert.

A League of Nations, or preparedness up to the hilt.

That is the way he sees the situation today. "We must either," he said, "accept the covenant of peace or democracy must arm and stand guard forever at the threshold of liberty."

"War is Murder."

He hammered that fact home and with it he always added, "War is murder."

"I was a murderer," he said, "I was a helper of murder. When the crisis came we all took a hand. But it is all the same. War is murder."

"What do you mean by murder?"

"I mean killing people."

"Killing people to protect the interests of the people?"

"Killing anybody or anything. I don't know what else war is. War is murder. There is a far better way."

"What is the better way?"

"Why, to educate people. To teach them to think for themselves."

A long examination was conducted which sought to quiz Mr. Ford concerning his views on history, based on a remark which he once made that "I wouldn't give five cents for all the history ever written."

"I don't think much more of it now than I did then," testified Mr. Ford.

"The war showed us that history didn't last a week. All the things they told us would happen didn't happen."

They went ahead, knowing what war meant, and made the same mistakes all over again. The history we write today is the thing that counts. I'm not interested in yesterday."

The Flag of Nations.

The much discussed flag of a League of Nations, which it has been stated Mr. Ford was having made in his factory before the United States entered the war, was brought into court. The testimony developed the fact that Mr. Ford did not originate the design of the flag and had never seen the banner itself. He saw a small drawing of it once in St. Paul's Cathedral, Detroit, he said, but had never heard of it again and knew nothing about it. He denied emphatically that he ever said he would raise this flag above the Stars and Stripes, and said the statement that he revered this banner above the flag of his country was "A terrible thing to say about an American."

SAVING HABIT'S TAUGHT US BY WORLD WAR

One of the things which this country will bring out of the war is an increase of interest in securities by people who ever before considered such investment says H. H. Windsor, in Popular Mechanics Magazine. The small investor formerly thought of bonds and stocks only in terms of thousands, wholly beyond his reach, and as entirely belonging to banks and men of wealth. The war savings stamps, and the government bonds of \$50 denomination up, have not only encouraged thrift, but have opened the eyes of the multitude to the fact that to be a bond owner does not require a king's ransom. Now we have some 20 million bond holders, and where formerly only 1 person in 7 was thrifter, now 5 out of every 7 are savers. We do not measure up to the stern thriftiness of the French, who, by extreme economy, paid off the war indemnity which the Franco-Russian war occasioned, in an incredible short time. But proportionately we have made a good start, for we have from the beginning been a national wholesale wasters because our resources of every kind were so enormous. Some were even ashamed to save and thought it smart to spend lavishly as fast as they earned. This condition permeated the entire land. We may well take genuine pride in a good start on the road to sound common sense and thrift. The very act of saving increases self-respect. The flowery speeches of a thousand orators in more than a century are forgotten, while these words of wisdom by Benjamin Franklin live on:

Save a little of thy income, and thy hide-bound pocket will soon begin to thrive and thou wilt never cry again with an empty stomach; neither will creditors insult thee, nor want oppress, nor hunger bite, nor will nakedness freeze thee. The whole hemisphere will shine brighter, and pleasure spring up in every corner of thy heart.

Remember that money is of a prolific, generating nature. Money can beget money, and its offspring can beget more, and so on. Five shillings turned is six, turned again it is seven and thence, and so on till it becomes one hundred pounds.

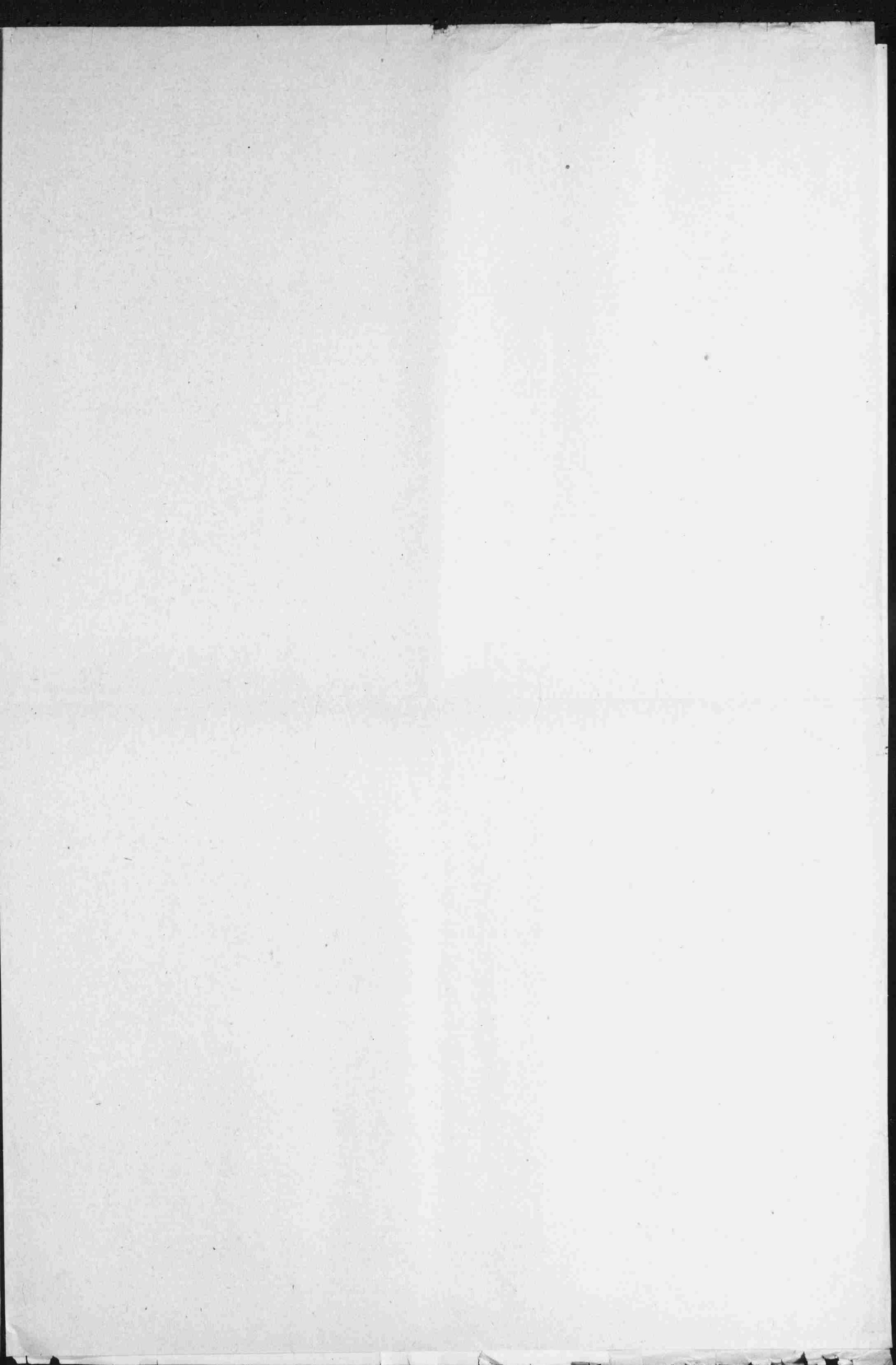
