On Jan. 25, Salvador Cajero Avelar, director of the National Campaign for African Bee Control, said although the bees have been spotted in 26 of Mexico's states, they have not negatively impacted on honey production. According to Cajero, Mexico exports 57,000 metric tons per annum, earning revenues of over \$50 million per year.
