CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF THE NEVIS COMPANY, INC.

We, the undersigned, in order to form a corporation for the purpose hereinafter stated, under and pursuant to the provisions of the Twenty-Third Chapter of the second session of the legislature of the State of New Mexico, as amended by Chapter 112 of the 1917 Session Laws and Chapter 100 of the 1919 Session Laws, do hereby certify as follows:

I. The name of the corporation is "THE NEVIS COMPANY, INC."

II. The registered office of the corporation is located at Bluewater, Valencia County, New Mexico, and William E. Nevis is designated as the statutory agent therein and in charge thereof, and upon whom process against the corporation may be served.

III. The objects for which the corporation is established are:

To buy and sell, deal and engage generally in the wholesale and retail merchandise business, and to act as the agent of any individual or individuals, natural or artificial, in buying, selling or dealing for them in general merchandise; to engage generally in the business of mining, burning, producing, shipping, buying and selling, lime and lime products; to buy and sell hay, grain, alfalfa and other commodities and products; to acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, lime kilns, lime claims and other mining properties and to mine and develop the properties so acquired; to build all necessary buildings, warehouses and other facilities to accomplish the purpose of the corporation; to engage in the business of raising, selling and preparing for market, produce, poultry and eggs; to buy and sell all kinds of tools and implements, including harvesters, binders, reapers, mowers, rakes and headers; to carry on the business of dealing in cattle, livestock and sheep, and also that of dealing in cattle and sheep generally and in all branches of such respective trades or businesses; to purchase, acquire, hold and deal in and in any manner dispose of or sell on commission, or otherwise, hay, grain, wheat and bread stuffs, and all other goods, wares, merchandise and commodities of a similar kind.

IV. The corporation shall, in addition to the powers hereinbefore enumerated, have and possess all rights, powers and privileges

given to corporations by common law, to sue and be sued, to borrow money and secure the payment of the same by notes, mortgages, bond or deeds of trust upon its real or personal property; to rent, lease, purchase, hold, sell and convey such real and personal property as may be necessary and proper for the accomplishment of the objects and purposes of said corporation.

V. The authorized capital stock of the corporation with which the corporation begins business is Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), divided into five hundred (500) shares of the par value of one hundred dollars (\$100) each.

VI. The names and postoffices addresses of the incorporators and the number of shares of capital stock subscribed for by each, the aggregate of which shall be the amount with which the corporation shall commence business are as follows:

William E. Nevis, Bluewater, N. M., 80 shares, \$8,000.
M. H. Nevis, Bluewater, N. M., 10 shares, \$1,000.
S. A. Miller, Bluewater, N. M., 10 shares, \$1,000. Total \$10,000

VII. The time for which this corporation shall exist shall be fifty (50) years.

RED CROSS OFFICIAL APPROVES SEAL SALE

Dr. Livingston Farrand, Chairman of the Central Committee, American Red Cross, Expresses Hope That Public Will Give Generous Support.

SALE IS NOW UNDER WAY.

More Than 650,000,000 Seals Must Be Disposed of to Insure the Success of the Nation-Wide Educational and Preventive Campaign of the National Tuberculosis Association in 1920.

Dr. Livingston Farrand, executive head of the American Red Cross, has given his unqualified endorsement of the 1919 Red Cross Christmas Seal sale, which is now under way and which will extend for ten days under the auspices of the National Tuberculosis Association and its 1,000 allied organizations. A fund of more than \$6,500,000, which will be used in the 1920 educational and preventive campaign, will be raised through the sale of the seals.

Acquainted as he is with all questions of general health community improvement and relief because of the nature of his work and office, Dr. Farrand's endorsement is based upon an expert knowledge of what the National Tuberculosis Association has accomplished and will accomplish in the future. His letter to Dr. Charles J. Hatfield, Managing Director of the National Tuberculosis Association, follows:

"I have been greatly interested in the plans that the National Tuberculosis Association is making for the sale of Christmas Seals during the coming holiday season. The success of that effort is indispensable to the carrying out of the far-reaching plans of the Association in its fight against tuberculosis in this country.

"The American people, in common with the nations of Europe, are becoming aroused to the critical importance of the problem of vitality and conservation of health as the necessary factor in re-establishing the world after the devastation and destruction caused by the war. Of all the preventable diseases, tuberculosis takes perhaps the first place in importance. For that reason I view with keenest sympathy and approval the splendid work which the National Tuberculosis Association is conducting, and I trust that the response of the American people in the Christmas Seal Campaign will be generous and universal. HEALTH BONDS POPULAR.

The demand for the Health Bonds which the National Tuberculosis Association issued this year for the first time are meeting with a ready sale. The bonds are in graduated denominations, the smallest being for \$5. In the past some of the large business houses and other large contributors found it difficult to use up the number of Red Cross Seals their subscriptions called for. The bonds have been issued for

the convenience of large subscribers and the proceeds of their sale will be used for the same purpose as the Christmas Seal funds—the financing of the 1920 effort to reduce the number of deaths from tuberculosis in the United States. Last year the disease claimed 150,000 lives. The health bonds can be obtained from state and local tuberculosis associations.

XMAS SEAL MONEY TO BE SPENT LOCALLY

91.7 Per Cent. of All Funds Raised in Any State Remain There to Carry Out the Local Programs.

NATIONAL FUND IS SMALL.

National Tuberculosis Association and American Red Cross Share Remaining 8.3 Per Cent.

"For the Health of This Community." Such is the slogan appearing on the flap of envelopes on which the Red Cross Christmas Seal is printed. The issue of such envelopes in order to save the trouble of affixing gummed seals to letters sent out in quantity by large corporations and business houses has been inaugurated this year as part of the machinery of distribution set in motion by the National Tuberculosis Association and its 1,000 State and local organizations in disposing of more than 650,000,000 Red Cross Christmas Seals during the ten day sale which began on December 1.

The significance of the slogan lies in the fact that whether the letter is mailed in Los Angeles or Boston, in Chicago or in Galveston it still holds true. "This community" literally means the place where the seal is bought and used. To be exact, 91.7 per cent of the funds raised is devoted to local anti-tuberculosis activities in the state. Of the remaining 8.3 per cent a portion goes to the Red Cross.

WILSON ENDORSES STAMP SALE.

President Wishes "The Very Best Success" for the 1919 Red Cross Xmas Seal Campaign.

President Wilson, in a letter to Dr. Charles J. Hatfield, Managing Director of the National Tuberculosis Association, expresses keen interest in the work of the association and wishes success to the 1919 Red Cross Christmas Seal sale. More than 650,000,000 seals must be sold during the ten day drive which began on December 1, to assure a one hundred per cent application of the Association's 1920 educational and preventive campaign. The President's letter follows:

"Allow me to express again my deep interest in the work of the National Tuberculosis Association. I am very much interested to learn of the efforts of the Association to raise the sum of six and one-half million dollars that the state budgets may be financed for the coming year, and write to wish the very best success of the effort."

Methodists Save Belgian and Serbian Orphans

Southern Church Buys Homes in Brussels and Belgrade and Supports Serbian Refugees in England.

Nashville, Tenn.—The Centenary Commission of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, will speak in caring for the children of Belgian, Serbia and other stricken countries of Europe, according to an announcement made by Dr. W. B. Southerland, the director-general. Dr. Southerland and a Church Commission have just returned from Europe.

For this purpose a large home, formerly a famous boys' school, has been purchased at Ucole, a suburb of Brussels. Several hundred children will be accommodated in this building, and the Methodists will assume entire responsibility for them and their future.

Another home has been bought at Belgrade, Serbia, and here the orphaned children of the Southern States will be given medical attention and cared for. A staff of women physicians, secured from Scotland, will be in charge of this home.

Still another orphanage has been taken over at Faversham, England. This home already contains more than a hundred Serbian children, orphaned refugees who were taken from their homes during the Austrian invasion.

Plight of Children Deplorable.

"One can scarcely imagine the plight of the Belgian and Serbian children," declared Dr. Southerland. "The mines of Northern France have been flooded or filled with concrete by the Germans, and thousands of children will literally freeze to death this winter."

"I have seen them living in the cell trenches and dug-outs left by the enemy, with little to eat save what is gathered from the passers-by."

Relief stations will be established as quickly as workers can be obtained and supplies sent. These will be at Brussels, Lyons, St. Quentin, Valenciennes, Belgrade and other centers.

The Centenary Commission is sending for two young physicians, eight nurses, a dozen women social workers, and a number of superintendents and directors to reinforce the staff. These will be sent abroad at once.

The Church has a fund of \$100,000 for this purpose. It is a part of the \$53,000,000 fund which was raised by the recent Centenary Drive.

Christians Invade The Holy Land

Southern Methodists Send First Wave to Palestine for Bible and Literature Distribution.

(Special Correspondence)

Nashville, Tenn.—The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has the distinction of being the first Christian denomination to send workers to Palestine since the free regime inaugurated under the occupancy of General Allenby.

The Centenary European Commission of the Church, headed by Bishop James Atkins and Dr. W. B. Southerland, have already dispatched five colonporters to the Holy Land. These will be followed by five more in the next few weeks. These workers will establish no stations, but will follow the early Methodist custom of itinerating over the country distributing Bibles, tracts and Christian literature.

Lightning Wrecks House, but Family Is Unhurt

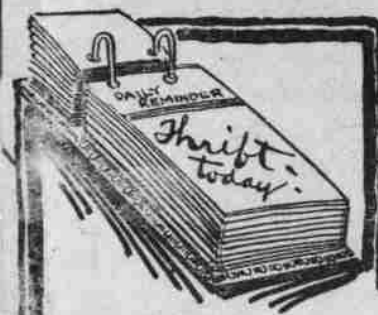
