## HUNGER KNOWS NO ARMISTICE IN CAUCASUS

Colonel Haskell Reports to Near  
East Relief on Desperate  
Needs of Helpless.

"Peace may come elsewhere in the world, but hunger knows no armistice in the Near East," says Colonel William N. Haskell, Allied high commissioner in the Trans-Caucasus, in an appeal to Near East Relief, 1 Madison Avenue, New York City, for food and supplies for the relief of the starving millions.

Colonel Haskell is in charge of all operations and disbursements of Near East Relief in the Caucasus.

"There is no fuel or shelter for the greater part of them during the terri-

ble winter in the mountains," he says, "and the existing food supply is entirely inadequate for the great number of refugees without resources of any kind."

"By a recent agreement between the premiers of the republics of Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia to cease hostilities and settle all differences by arbitration one obstacle to relief work in the Caucasus has been removed and makes accessible a great number of destitute people who otherwise would perish this winter."

"Two hundred thousand destitute Armenians and Tartars can now be reached in the districts of Karabagh, Shusha and Nakhichevan, in the southern section of the Trans-Caucasus, and we are planning to extend our work there. The economic situation is so desperate and food supplies so scanty that the Georgians have ordered 100,000 persons, mainly Russian refugees without employment, to leave the city of Tiflis. About 45,000 workers in the oil fields of Baku have been ordered by the Azerbaidjans to leave the city because there is no work for them and food is scarce."

Around every station along the railway are gathered groups of hundreds of homeless people lying huddled together on the ground, the majority of them too weak even to try to help themselves. From time to time the stronger ones climb on freight cars and move elsewhere, always seeking better conditions, which do not exist. Two hundred and sixty-three thousand homeless refugees from Turkish Armenia thus are constantly milling about throughout Russian Armenia, making the relief work conducted by the Americans a problem requiring infinite patience and organizing ability.

"This is especially true in view of the existence of 248,000 destitute inhabitants of Russian Armenia who possess homes, but no food, as well as 150,000 Greeks, Russians, Persians, Syrians and Yezidis who have been driven out of parts of Transcaucasia."

"One hundred and forty thousand Moslems, whose villages were destroyed in the course of five years of constant warfare, are helplessly encamped in the open around villages of their former enemies, begging infinitesimal quantities of food, which they mix with dirt to give the illusion of nourishment."

"These hundreds of thousands of suffering adults, mostly homeless and lacking every necessity of life, having nothing more to lose, are concentrated in a country as yet inadequately policed or governed. They constitute a fertile field for the seeds of Bolshevism or any form of anarchy, the spread of which once loosed would be impossible to predict."

"It is generally admitted in the Caucasus that the Americans of the Near East Relief already have saved the lives of at least 30,000 babies and children and of 500,000 adult refugees and destitute. Still work will be done."

In an effort to procure funds to carry on the work and save the lives of these hundreds of thousands who otherwise will die of starvation and exposure Near East Relief, of which Cleveland H. Dodge is treasurer, is making an appeal to the American people.

## 120,000 STAND IN BREAD LINE

More Than 1,000,000 Face  
Death Is Message Brought by  
Miss Dakesian.

Imagine a bread line of 120,000 famished people waiting for twenty-four hours a day for the dole of food that is the sole barrier between them and death from starvation. That is the situation in Alexandropol, a city in Russian Armenia, according to Miss Hermine Dakesian, a pretty Armenian girl, one of the survivors of four years

of the horrors of Turkish massacres and deportations. Saved by an American woman, she has come to this country and entered Oberlin College.

With her came fourteen other Armenian girls in charge of Miss Adelaide S. Dwight, a Near East Relief worker, who has been instrumental in helping to save hundreds of thousands of their people from death by starvation. Miss Dwight, who is not given to exaggeration and has seen conditions at first hand, says more than a million people are facing death by starvation in Armenia and will perish unless America aids.

Herself an eyewitness to the slaughter of hundreds of helpless women and children by the Turks and a victim of the deportations, Miss Dakesian, an unusually pretty girl, says there is untold suffering in Armenia and Syria. She praises the efforts of the Near East Relief, formerly the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief, to save as many of these people as possible. At Erivan, the capital of the Armenian republic, one hot meal is given out daily, and by this relief alone the city's death rate has been cut from a thousand daily to an average of twenty. At Alexandropol, where the refugees from Turkish Armenia were driven by thousands, the situation is appalling, Miss Dakesian says. It is to avert these wholesale deaths that Near East Relief is making a nation-wide appeal for funds.

## MORE THAN 2,000 CASES OF INFLUENZA REPORTED IN CHICAGO IN 48 HOURS.

Chicago, Jan. 17.—Chicago's health department was swamped with appeals for nurses today to combat the spread of influenza and pneumonia, of which more than 2,000 cases have been reported in 48 hours with 50 deaths.

Since 9 a. m. today 500 new cases of influenza were reported with ten deaths, and pneumonia cases numbered 100 with sixteen deaths.

Health department official is pointed out that the death rate has been small as compared to last year's epidemic and with the number of cases reported. Health Commissioner John Dill Robertson today started a campaign against "cold flat" owners when 106 complaints were received.

Bacteriologists who met with the health commissioner today to discuss plans for combating the epidemic recommended that no serums and anti-toxins put forward as preventives last year be used.

## ANTI-SEDITION LAW ESSENTIAL.

The anti-sedition bill passed by the senate would impair no respectable rights. It aims straight at the criminal enemies of organized society, and at them alone. Well-intentioned persons need have no fear of injustice under its operations. Censorship of the press by the postmaster general, or any other official, is a possibility offensive to Americans, but evidence abounds that insidious propaganda will be circulated through the mails unless methods of prevention are adopted. The Sterling bill provides for appeals to the court for determination of the justice of exclusion orders issued against publications. With that safeguard for innocence we may be sure that none will suffer save those who deliberately choose to run risks. For that kind we need have no sympathy, they often are worse than open enemies. Disloyalists only will strive to find a twilight zone in which they can pursue a nefarious course.

What is essential is that the country be rid of all persons who advocate overthrow of the government by force, and those who preach resort to violence or other unlawful means of accomplishing any purpose. Devoted Americans will not shrink from making whatever sacrifices may be called for to secure the nation's safety. No anti-sedition bill that has been proposed, so far as we have knowledge, would limit any political right or personal liberty guaranteed by the constitution. Every one of them has been designed to check and punish criminal enterprises whose object is the destruction of American liberties. We must have anti-sedition law and it must be enforced fearlessly for the people's protection.

# La Aseguranza de Guerra.

## De Interes para los que Sirvieron en la Pasada Guerra Mundial.

La siguiente informacion da el resumen de los resultados del Proyecto de Sweet que fue pasado inmediatamente despues de la conferencia de la Legion Americana en Washington, y se da para informacion de todos los interesados.

Bajo la nueva enmienda al acta de aseguranza de riesgos de la guerra, la aseguranza, o sea en mejor dicho, las polizas de seguros de vida del gobierno de los Estados Unidos (convertidos) se pueden hacer pagaderas a cualquiera de las personas siguientes:

Al padre, abuelo, padre politico, padre por adopcion, esposo o marido, hijo, nieto, hijastro, hermano, hermana, medio hermano, medio hermana, hermana adoptiva, hermana adoptiva, medio hermano, media hermana, tio, tia, sobrino, sobrina, hermano politico, hermana politica, ninguna persona que haya hecho las veces de padre del asegurado por un periodo de un año o mas antes que se enlistara el asegurado, los hijos de dicha persona, padre, abuelo, padrastro, o padre adoptivo de la esposa o esposo.

La aseguranza de vida del gobierno de los Estados Unidos convertida puede pagarse ahora a la muerte del asegurado ya sea en una suma sola o en pagos semanales de 24 meses o mas, a opasion del asegurado.

Lo cantidad de compensacion por deshabilitacion ha sido aumentada en gran manera. Una comparacion entre las condiciones concedidas antes bajo el acta de aseguranza de riesgos de guerra con los que prohee la nueva ley son como sigue:

De-habilidad temporaria total	Pagos antes. Segun endo.	
Con esposa ni hijos	\$ 50	\$ 50
Con esposa, pero sin hijos	45	90
Con esposa y un hijo	65	95
Con esposa y dos hijos	65	100
Con esposa y tres o mas hijos	75	100
Con esposa pero con hijo	40	90
Con esposa pero con dos hijos	50	95
Con esposa pero con tres hijos	60	100
Con esposa pero con cuatro hijos	60	100

Bajo la nueva ley una cantidad para cada hombre deshabilitado temporariamente y que no tenga esposa de \$5 adicionales pero cada uno en exco de uno sin limite en cuanto al numero de niños.

Bajo la ley anterior lo misma escala aplica por deshabilitacion total y permanente como por deshabilitacion temporaria. Se hace ahora una distincion entre las dos bajo la nueva ley. Bajo esta ultima una compensacion mensual por deshabilitacion total y permanente es \$100.

Nota. Bajo la nueva enmienda si la persona deshabilitada esta impedida que necesite el cuidado constante de una enfermera o persona que la atienda, se provee una cantidad adicional en la discrecion del director que no exceda de \$20.

Bajo la acta W. R. I. la misma provision es efectiva, excepto que un hombre que recibe \$100 por mes como se indica en "b" abajo no puede recibir compensacion adicional.

Tanto bajo la acta W. R. I. como bajo la nueva ley, la compensacion por la perdida de ambos pies, ambas manos o de la vida, de ambos ojos o por quedar inutilizado y constantemente en cama es \$100.

La nueva ley provee que por doble total y permanente deshabilitacion la cantidad de la compensacion sera \$200.

## DESHABILIDAD PARCIAL.

Si mientras la deshabilitacion esta considerada como parcial y temporaria, la compensacion mensual debera ser un por ciento de la compensacion que sera pagadera por deshabilitacion total temporaria, igual al grado de la reduccion en la capacidad de ganarse el sustento, resultante de la deshabilitacion.

El 24 de Diciembre, 1919, el dia que la ley fue firmada por el presidente el bureau de aseguranza de riesgos de guerra expidio 1,000 checks como de \$800 cada uno por termino medio, cada uno como un pago atrasado bajo la accion retroactiva de la ley. El bureau espera terminar todos los pagos retroactivos para el 10 de Enero.

Se llama la atencion al hecho de que la ley enmendada hace una provision para los numerosos casos donde los hombres han sido puestos en el servicio por los cuerpos locales, los cuales antes de haber sido aceptados y enrolados para servicio militar actual han sido total o permanentemente deshabilitados, y han muerto sin haber aplicado por aseguranza. En tales casos los hombres seran considerados de haber aplicado por un pago mensual de \$95.

Debe notarse, sin embargo, que estos pagos deben hacerse a las siguientes personas solamente:

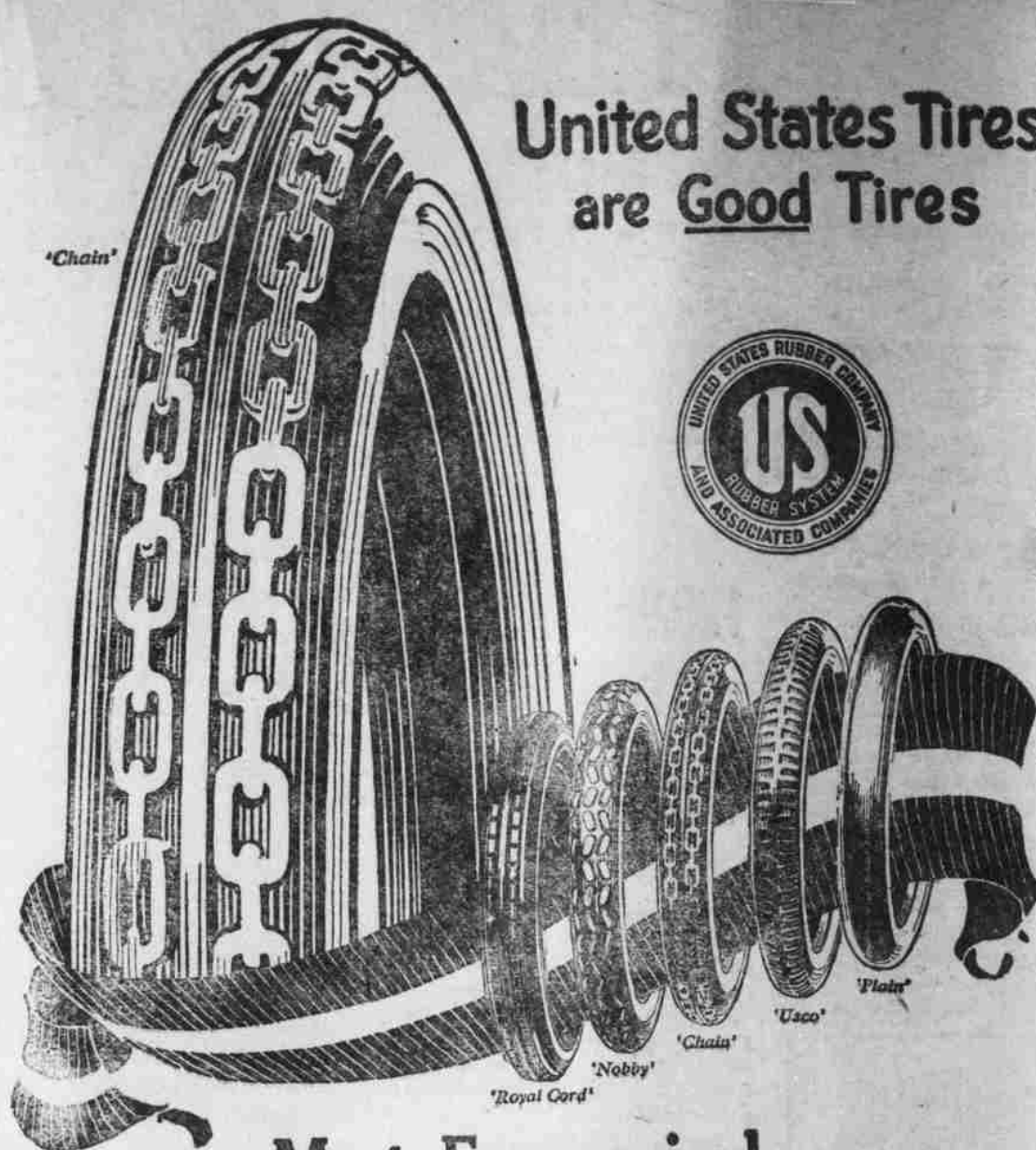
Primero. Al mismo individuo durante la deshabilitacion permanente.

Segundo. A la viuda desde el tiempo de la muerte del individuo y durante su viudez.

Tercero. Si no hay viuda sobreviviente, entonces a los hijos del individuo.

Quinto. Si no tiene madre que le sobreviva, entonces a su familia.

Hay muchos casos de estos en la actualidad que deberan ponerse inmediatamente en conocimiento del oficial de riesgos de guerra del estado de la Legion Americana.
