ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
of the
EXCELLENCE MOTOR COMPANY
(No Stockholders' Liability.)
We, the undersigned citizens of the United States and of the State of New Mexico, being desirous of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of New Mexico, do make, sign and acknowledge the following articles and certificate of incorporation, to-wit:

1. The name of said corporation is EXCELLENCE MOTOR COMPANY.
(No Stockholders' Liability.)
2. The principal registered office of said Company is in the State of New Mexico at Belen, in the County of Valencia, and the Statutory agent of Company upon whom process against said corporation may be served, is F. C. H. Livingston.

3. The purposes for which said company is to be formed are the manufacture of various kinds of spark plugs, motors, machines, engines, machinery and contrivances for the generation and application of steam, electricity, gas or other agents for the production of power; the manufacture of cars, carriages, wagons, boats, and vehicles of every kind and description; the manufacture of machine supplies and devices and appliances incident to the construction of motors, vehicles, machines, engines and machinery; the acquisition and sale of inventions, patent rights, letters patent, trade-marks and copyrights covering any or all articles to be manufactured or covered in by said corporation, or covering any advertising devices, or covering matter to be used in connection therewith; the issuing of licenses under patents, trade-marks and copyrights; the sales as principal or as agent and the exporting and importing of any spark plugs, vehicles, boats, motors, machines, engines, machinery and appliances or other articles manufactured by said corporation, or by other corporations, the carrying on of any lawful trade or business incidental to the aforesaid purposes or any of them.

Said corporation shall have power to purchase, acquire, hold and dispose of stocks, bonds, and other evidences of indebtedness of any corporation, domestic or foreign; to issue its own stock or bonds or other securities or obligations in exchange for stocks, bonds, or

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

SPECIAL SESSION, JUNE 7, 1920.

The board of county commissioners of Valencia county met in special session June 7, 1920. There were present: Hon. Manuel Garcia chairman, Abel Vigil and Tranquilino Jaramillo members of the board, Fred Tondre, deputy assessor, Placido Jaramillo sheriff and Diego Aragon county clerk.

Then they adjourned as a board of county commissioners and immediately reconvened as a county board of equalization.

Various tax payers appeared before the board and made protests as to their assessments for the year 1920.

The board then adjourned until Tuesday, June 8, 1920 at 9 A. M.

June 8, 1920.
The board met pursuant to adjournment on June 8, 1920, the same members being present.

The board then proceeded to review the tax returns for the year 1920, and acted upon the same as follows:

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other evidences of indebtedness of other corporations, domestic or foreign; to make and carry out contracts of every kind, and to transact any and all business which may be necessary or proper or convenient, which is not contrary to the laws of New Mexico, to the exercise and fulfillment of any of the aforesaid powers and purposes.

4. The amount of the total authorized capital stock of said corporation is Five Hundred Thousand Dollars, divided into Fifty Thousand Shares of the par value of Ten Dollars each. The amount of the capital stock with which the said corporation shall commence business is Two Hundred Shares or Two Thousand Dollars.

5. The names and post office addresses of the undersigned incorporators and the number of shares subscribed by each are as follows:
W. J. Easterday, who has subscribed Fifty shares, whose post office address is Belen, New Mexico.
Joe Bell, who has subscribed Fifty shares, whose post office address is Belen, New Mexico.
E. G. Neumeier, who has subscribed One Hundred shares, whose post office address is Belen, New Mexico.

6. The term of existence of this corporation shall be Fifty years from and after the date of the filing of these articles in the office of the State Corporation Commission of New Mexico.

7. The board of directors shall have the power to make and alter by-laws, but any by-laws made by the directors under the power hereby conferred may be altered or repealed by a majority of the stockholders.

8. The names of the directors who shall manage the business of said corporation for the first three months after the filing of this certificate of incorporation are, W. J. Easterday, E. G. Neumeier and Joe Bell. After the expiration of said period of three months the board of directors shall consist of nine members, three of whom shall be elected for a period of one year, three for a period of two years and three for a period of three years, to be elected by the stockholders as provided by law.

9. The directors may hold their meetings and have offices, and keep their books of the corporation, except stock and transfer books, at such places outside of the limits of the State of New Mexico as the said directors may by resolution, from time to time, direct.

Mr. George S. Downer and Mr. W. F. Taliaferro appeared before the board of county commissioners, sitting as a board of equalization, in support of the written protest of the Santa Fe Pacific Railroad Company filed with the county clerk against the action of the assessor in assessing the 542, 668.95 acres of odd numbered sections of grazing lands of said company, Valencia county at \$2.25 per acre, and and praying a valuation not to exceed \$1.00 per acre.

It appeared to the board that the lands in question had been assessed in excess of their actual value, as the odd-numbered or checkerboard sections of railroad lands are of less value than lands in solid bodies and worth not to exceed \$1.25 per acre, but it appeared that the assessor assessing such lands at \$2.25 per acre did so in order to conform to the order of the state tax commission, classifying grazing lands in the state and fixing the minimum for said Valencia county at \$2.25 per acre; and such order being binding upon this board it is unable to grant the Santa Fe Pacific railroad Company the relief for which it prays.

It is therefore ordered by the board that the protest of the Santa Fe Pacific railroad company be denied and the assessment of \$2.25 per acre fixed by the assessor be allowed to stand.

Mr. Eugene Kempenich appeared before the county board of equalization on behalf of Le de Padilla Land Grant, protesting against the valuation of \$2.25 per acre as placed by the assessor and as being excessive and said claim was rejected.

Mr. George S. Downer appeared before the board of county commissioners sitting as a board of equalization, in support of the written protest of the New Mexico & Arizona land company filed with the county clerk against the action of the assessor in assessing the 423,411.51 acres of odd-numbered sections of grazing lands of said company in Valencia county at \$2.25 per acre and praying for a valuation not to exceed \$1.00 per acre.

It appeared to the board that the lands in question had been assessed in excess of their actual value, as the odd-numbered or checkerboard sections of railroad lands are of less value than lands in solid bodies, and not worth to exceed \$1.25 per acre, but it further appeared that the assessor in assessing such lands at \$2.25 per acre, did so in order to conform with the state tax commission, classifying grazing lands in the state and fixing the minimum for Valencia county at \$2.25 per acre, and such order being binding upon this board, it is unable to grant the New Mexico and Arizona Land Grant Company the relief for which it prays.

It is therefore ordered by the board that the protest of the New Mexico and Arizona Land Company be denied and that the assessment of \$2.25 per acre fixed by the assessor be allowed to stand.

RESOLUTION
Messrs. Fred D. Huning, Jesus C. Sanchez, Ignacio Gabaldon and Eugene Kempenich representing respectively the San Clemente grant, Tome grant, Nicolas Duran de Chaves grant and the Lo de Padilla grant, appeared before the board of equalization of Valencia county, appealing from the valuation of \$2.25 per acre assessed upon the land of the respective grant represented by them, claiming that this valuation is excessive, exorbitant and greatly above the present market value of such lands, and stated that the total income from the above mentioned respective bodies of land, it is inadequate to pay for the taxes on the valuation of \$2.25 per acre.

After taking this matter under due consideration the board of equalization adopted the following resolution: Whereas it appears to the satisfaction of the board of equalization of Valencia county that the valuation placed upon the lands mentioned above is excessive, but it further appears that the assessor in placing said valuation complied with the orders of the state tax commission of the state of New Mexico, and this board feels that it lacks authority to make any deduction from the values fixed by the state tax commission. Therefore be it resolved that the foregoing appeal is hereby denied, and be it further resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to transmit a certified copy of the foregoing resolution to the respective appellants.

The board of equalization adjourned and convened as board of county commissioners.

It having been reported to the board that the present crossing of the state highway between Los Lunas and Belen over the tracks of the Belen Cut Off is a menace to life and limb, and being it the desire of the board of county commissioners of Valencia county to do everything in their power to protect the citizens of the county from said menace, it is resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed in behalf of said board to request of the division Supt. at Winslow Ariz. to install an electric warning device at the above mentioned point, and to mail copy of said letter as well as all other correspondence to Hon. W. C. Reed attorney for the N. F. P. R. R. Co.

Be it resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to draw a warrant of \$150.00 dollars in favor of Richard Pohl to buy stamps for the county officials.

A petition was presented by residents of precinct no. 14 for the appointment of a justice of the peace and under recommendation of same petitioners Mr. Thos. J. McNeil was appointed justice of the peace for said precinct.

Be it resolved that the county road superintendent is hereby authorized to sell 4 boards 12x 18x3 for the amount of \$23.76.

Being no other business before the board they adjourned to meet on the 21st day of June to hear appeals from their action as board of equalization.

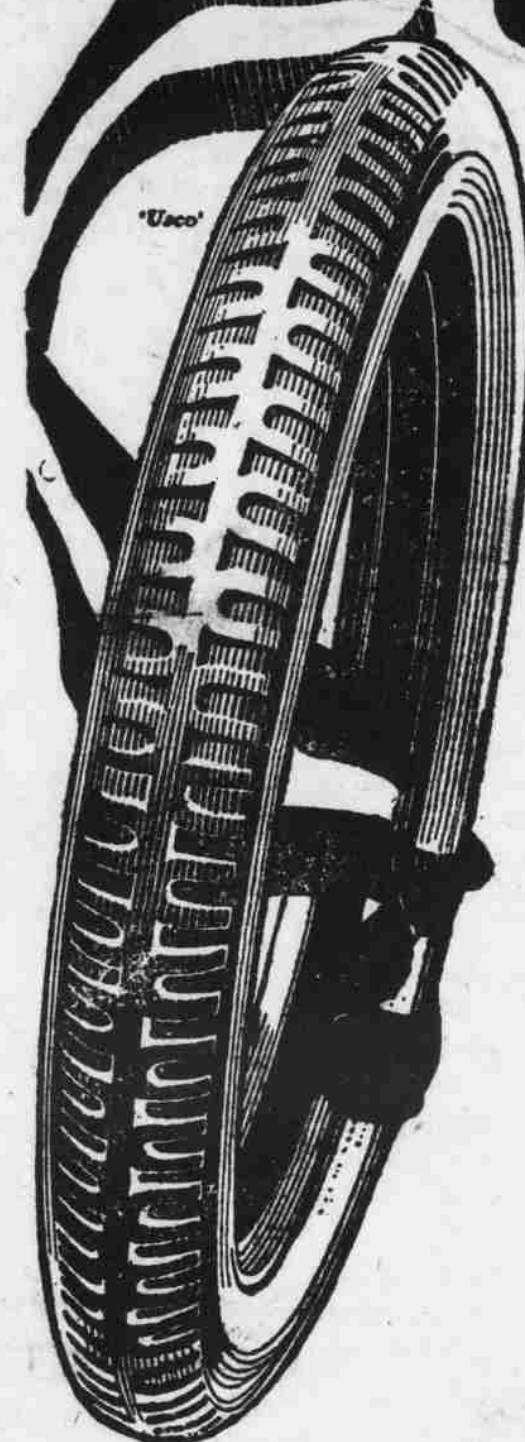

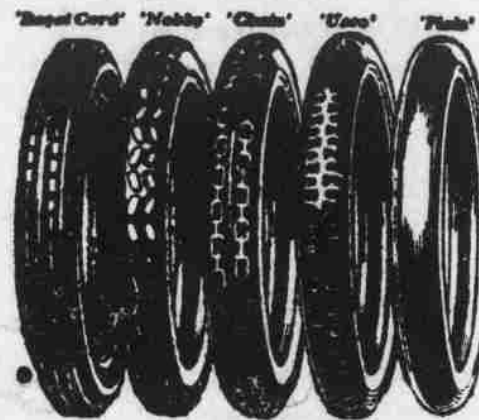
