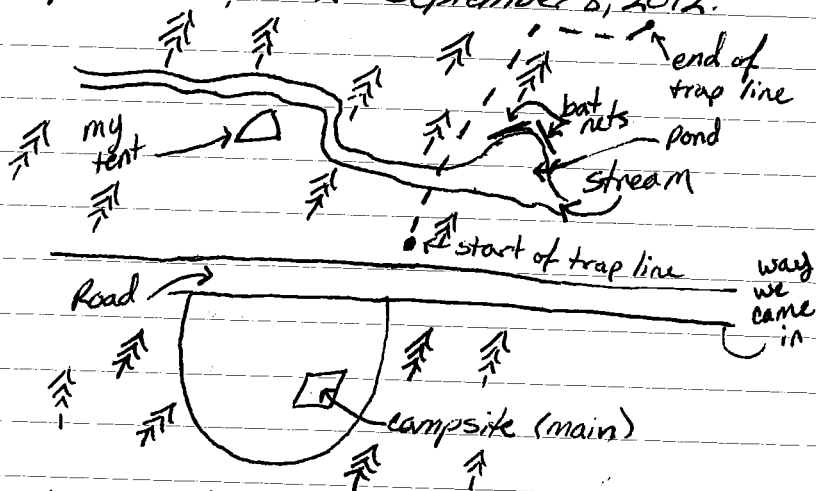

Field Notes:

- Elevation: 8,547 ft
- Habitat of trap line: Fir and spruce trees with a few aspens. Traps were set at the base of trees and beside fallen trees. Eighty traps were set, forty snap-traps and forty shermans. Upon first collection of animals in the trap, we collected four *Peromyscus* in the snap-traps and three *Peromyscus* and one *tamias* in the shermans. The trees were 30-40 meters tall and there was 50% coverage on the ground consisting of shrubbery and grasses. A stream ran through our trap line and we set a few traps around the water.
- Average temperature: $\sim 60^{\circ}\text{F}$
- There was a full moon the night of September 7, 2012 - September 8, 2012.

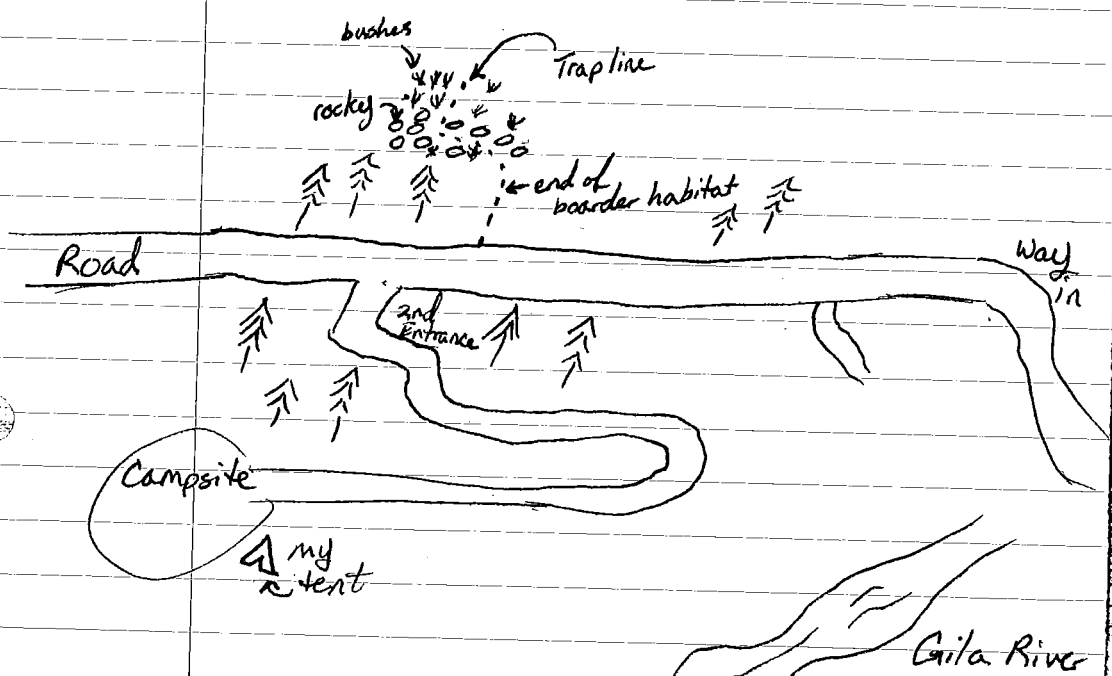
Field Notes: 11/October 2012

- Elevation:

- Locality: USA: NM; Grant County; Gila National Forest, Mogollon Mountains, Gila River 10 km N, 10 km E.

• Weather: Partly cloudy, mid 80s to mid 50s F

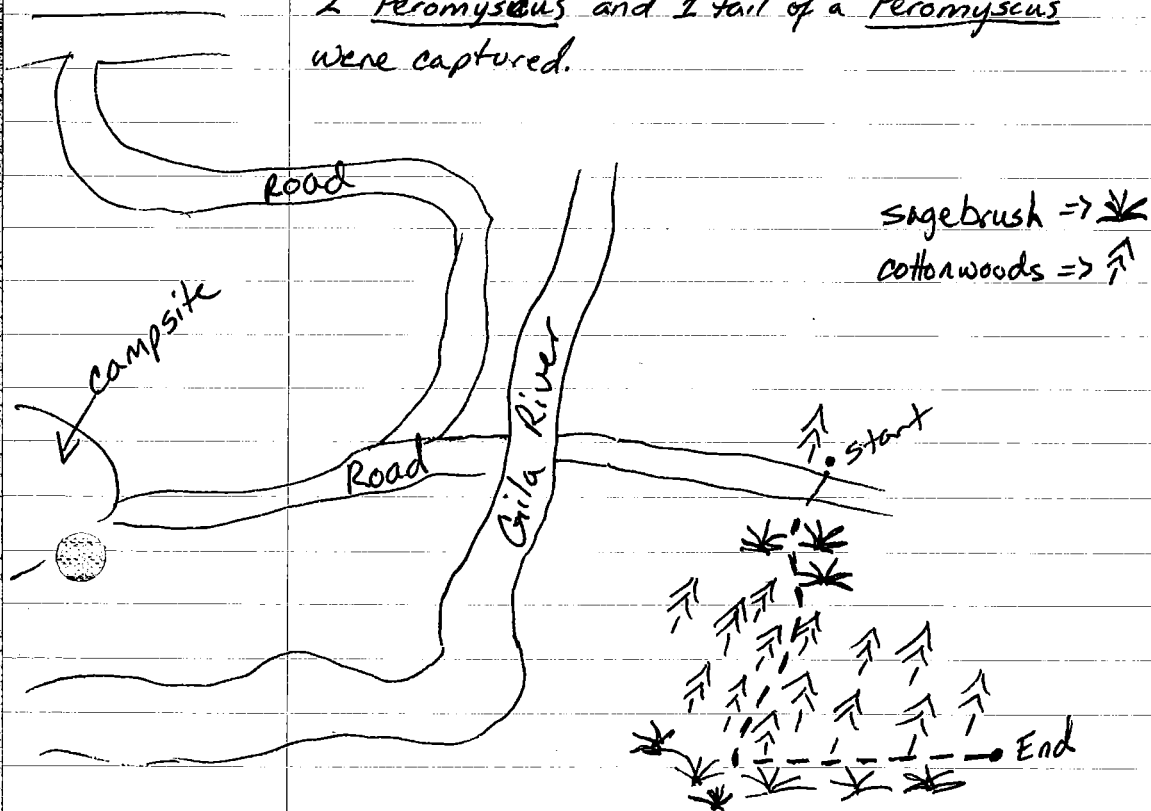
- Habitat of trapline: It starts in boarder habitat and then goes into Piñon - Juniper habitat. Two Peromyscus were trapped in the boarder habitat and a peromyscus and a pocket mouse were trapped in the P-J habitat. The P-J was very rocky and on a steep incline. The boarder habitat was relatively flat with only a slight incline. Twenty-four snap traps and forty shermans were set, one of each every ten yards until we ran out of snaps and then two shermans were set every ten yards after that.

Field Notes: 12 October 2012

- Weather: Windy, mid 60s, partly cloudy. slight rain the night before.
- Habitat of trapline: Lots of fallen trees (Cottonwoods) for most of the trapline. The beginning 3m of the trapline was set in Sagebrush. About 1/2 way through the trapline, we turned left because we reached the boarder of the cottonwoods and sagebrush. We stayed on the boarder for the remainder of the trapline. We did not go into the sagebrush because I am very allergic to it. Forty shermans and forty snap-traps were set. The following morning, 2 Peromyscus and 1 tail of a Peromyscus were captured.
