## PROCLAMATION AND NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE VILLAGE OF BELEN, SCHOOL DISTRICT NUMBER TWO, VALENCIA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

Pursuant to law and the request of the Board of Education of the Village of Belen, School district No. 2, in the County of Valencia and State of New Mexico, and the requisite action of the Board of Trustees of said Village of Belen, public notice is hereby given that a special election will be held on Monday the 24th day of January A. D. 1921, in the territory comprising the Board of Education of the Village of Belen and subject to the jurisdiction of said Board, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the Board of Education of the Village of Belen, comprising the territory within the limits of said Village of Belen and the territory adjacent and attached thereto for School purposes and within the jurisdiction of said board, in School district No. 2 the following question:

"Shall the Board of Education of the Village of Belen, in School District No. 2, Valencia County, New Mexico, incur an indebtedness and issue its negotiable coupon bonds to the amount of Forty-five Thousand dollars (\$45,000.), due not less than twenty (20) nor more than thirty (30) years after date, and redeemable at the pleasure of said district at any time after ten (10) years from their date, at the option of said Board of Education and bearing interest, payable semi-annually, at the rate not exceeding six (6) per cent per annum, for the purpose of erecting and furnishing suitable school buildings, and acquiring ground for such purpose in and for said school district No. 2?"

The said election will be held and the polls therefore will be opened and kept open between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and six o'clock P. M. of said 24th day of January A. D. 1921.

The following place and persons have been designated as place for and persons to conduct such election to-wit:

That the place for holding said election shall be at the Garage Building on Dalies Avenue in said Village of Belen, and that Bernard Jacobson, Chavez and Herman Baca shall be the judges of said election, and that Paul B. Dalies and Herman Baca shall be clerks of said election.

All qualified electors of the Board of Education of the Village of Belen and the territory adjacent thereto and attached thereto and subject to the jurisdiction of said Board, in School District No. 2 are entitled to vote at said election.

At said election, the questions submitted to the electors shall be as aforesaid and shall be as follows to-wit:

"Shall the Board of Education of the Village of Belen, School District No. 2, Valencia County, N. M., incur an indebtedness and issue its negotiable coupon bonds to the amount of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$45,000.), due not less than twenty (20) nor more than thirty (30) years after date, and redeemable at the pleasure of said district at any time after ten (10) years from their date, at the option of said board of Education, and bearing interest, payable semi-annually, at a rate not exceeding six (6) per cent per annum, for the purpose of erecting and furnishing suitable school buildings, and acquiring ground for such purpose in and for said school District No. 2?"

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, by virtue of the power vested in me by law and by virtue of the requisite action of the board of education of the Village of Belen, School district No. 2, Valencia County, New Mexico and the board of Trustees of the Village of Belen, I have hereunto affixed my signature as Mayor of said Village under the seal of said Village Clerk, and I have caused this proclamation to be made and notice of said election to be issued this 22nd day of December, A. D. 1920.

### SON ARRESTADOS DE NUEVO LOS 16 VILLISTAS

Se hacen Nuevas acusaciones por el conde de Luna.

Santa Fe, N. M., Diciembre 16.—Cualquiera que sea el resultado del recurso de "habeas corpus" que será resuelto mañana, para poner en libertad a los diez y seis villistas que estan cumpliendo sus sentencias, por homicidio en conexión con la incursión hecha por Villa en Columbus, en 1916, dichos presos no podran salir de la prision.

Los Villistas fueron perdonados por el gobernador Larrazolo hace unas pocas semanas, y la libertad no se llevo a cabo, por las gestiones de los ex-soldados y otras personas, que alegaron que el indulto era ilegal porque el gobernador no habia consultado con la oficina de indultos.

El recurso de habeas corpus, que será visto mañana, fue introducido por los abogados de los prisioneros.

R. A. Lane, diputado sherife de condado de Luna, llegó ayer a Santa Fe, procedente de Columbus y técnicamente arrestó a todo el grupo de Villistas.

En el evento de que la corte declarara legales los indultos, los presos tendrian que continuar en la cárcel.

Se alega que fueron convictos por una sola acusación de homicidio. Varias personas fueron muertas en la incursión se hace por el homicidio de personas que no se habian citado en el primer caso.
