Pursuant to law and the request of the Board of Education of the Village of Belen, School district No. 2, in the County of Valencia and State of New Mexico, and the requisite action of the Board of Trustees of said Village of Belen, public notice is hereby given that a special election will be held on Monday the 24th day of January A.
