Regular Session, January 3, 1921

The board of County Commissioners met in regular session at the Court house on January 3, 1921.

There were present the newly elected County Commissioners; Hon. Narciso Frances, Hon. Daniel Lucero Hon. Celso Lobato; also the deputy sheriff, Aniceto Gurule and the County Clerk, Avelino Gutierrez.

On motion of Mr. Frances, Mr. Lucero was elected chairman of the Board; on motion of Mr. Lobato, Mr. Frances was made vice-chairman of the Board.

A letter from Mr. A. E. St. Morris was presented and read, said letter requested the appropriation of \$300. for the building of a bridge at Moquino. After due consideration the board of County Commissioners adopted the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Clerk is hereby instructed to draw a warrant in favor of A. E. St. Morris, District Highway Engineer, in the sum of \$300.00, said amount to be used in the completion of the bridge at Moquino from the County Bridge Fund.

The County Road Superintendent appeared before the board recommending the condemnation of a 15-30 tractor belonging to the county, and the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the 15-30 Mogni Tractor belonging to the county of Valencia is hereby condemned and the County Road Superintendent is authorized to sell the same and shall except no bid less than \$500.00

The following resolution was also adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the county purchasing agent is hereby prohibited of making any purchases except by a requisition, said requisition shall be in triplicate, one copy to be furnished to the person or firm filling same and shall state of hat fund the goods bought will be paid, to whom and for what purpose shall be furnished and shall be in consecutive number. BE IT Further resolved that all other county officials are hereby prohibited from purchasing any supplies in the same of said county.

The commissioners then appointed the following officers:

Dr. W. F. Wittwer, Health Officer and Mr. Joseph F. Tondre, Purchasing agent.

Juan Archuleta was appointed as janitor of the court house.

Upon motion of Mr Frances the board then adjourned to meet on the 17th day of January, 1921, at 10 A. M.

Said bonds will bear date the First day of April, 1921, and will mature twenty-eight years after their date and be redeemable two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.) of said bonds ten years after date and two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.) each year thereafter. CONGRESS TO DO WORK WILSON FAILED TO DO

Washington, February.—One of the greatest failures of the Wilson administration has just been brought to light in the discovery that the president has taken no advantage of the Overman act, which gave him full power to recognize the executive bureaus of the Government on a more businesslike basis by the elimination of overlapping expense and authority.

Because of this monumental failure the joint Congressional Committee, inaugurated by representative Reavis of Nebraska, is about to investigate what may be done to save the money of the taxpayers and to make a report of the Republican Congress so that the work given the president to do three years ago may at last be accomplished.

Under the Overman act of May 20, 1918, the President was authorized among other reasons for the better utilization of resources and industries, and for

the more efficient administration by the President of his powers as commander-in-chief of the land and naval forces the president is authorized to make such redistribution of functions among executive agencies as he may deem necessary, including functions, duties and powers hitherto by law conferred upon any executive department, commission, bureau, agency, office, or officer, in such manner as in his judgement shall seem best fitted to carry out the purposes of this act.
