## Meeting Of The Board Of Commissioners Held March

Meeting was called to order at 10 A. M. there being present Hon. Narciso Francisco, Hon. Celso Lobato, Hon. Joseph F. Tondre and Hon. Abelino Gutierrez.

The board of County Commissioners of the county of Valencia, New Mexico, for the year 1920, for the purpose of the desire to proceed with the construction of the necessary improvements of the county, as to avoid if possible the payment of the great damage done the previous year, and where the session of the New Mexico Legislature appropriated funds to be expended by the Engineer for river protection in Valencia County, therefore Be It Resolved that the State Engineer of New Mexico is hereby requested to make a survey of protection work required on the Rio Grande in the county of Valencia and to make a proposal to the board of commissioners of Valencia County for the co-operative construction and improvement of the afore-said embankments, etc., given nearly as possible an estimate of amount of work and expense in the several places and Be It Resolved that the state engineer is requested to be at the meeting of the county commissioners on April 18, 1921, for consideration of the subject and the county clerk is hereby instructed to extend said notification by writing to the state engineer a copy of the foregoing resolution.

WHEREAS, section 12 of the recently enacted county road law provides that the state highway commission shall certify to the respective boards of the county commissioners the sections of State Highway which it is unable to maintain at its own expense. Whereas the board of county commissioners are contemplating to hold a special session on April 18, for the consideration of road construction and improvement within said county during the balance of the present fiscal year, therefore Be it resolved that the county clerk is hereby directed to request the state Highway commission to forward a certificate as required by law on or before the 18th day of April 1921.

Be it further resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to transmit certified copies of the foregoing resolution to Hon. A. A. Jones, U. S. Senator from New Mexico, Hon. H. O. Bursum, U. S. Senator from New Mexico, Hon. Nestor Montoya, representative in congress

## LEGION MEN WANT P. M. FIRED

Lincoln (Neb.) Post Takes Exception to Government Official's Demand for Use of German.

A resolution requesting the government to relieve Henry C. Jarms, postmaster of Emerald, Neb., from his office was passed by Lincoln (Neb.) Post No. 3 of the American Legion, as a result of the postmaster's efforts to supplant the American language by the German language in a church of Emerald.

The trouble started when the pastor of the church invited two Legion members to deliver patriotic addresses in the church. When the speakers appeared and called for a vote of the congregation to decide whether they should be ousted. It was the will of the majority that the Legionnaires should not be heard. After the vote, the Legion members quietly left the church.

The pastor, whose invitation to the Legion men was made in an endeavor to conciliate the pro-German and American elements of his church in their controversy over the use of the American or German language, then took the floor and expressed his surprise at the turn of events and left the meeting.

In commendation of the patience of the American Legion members a Lincoln newspaper expresses the following sentiment in its editorial columns:

"The policy of the Legion to send speakers to address meetings on invitation only and to teach Americanism by example rather than by force, has everything to commend it. The small groups of unassimilated foreigners in this country can readily be cordoned into compact masses by hate. On the other hand, they can be dissolved in time by patience and friendship. The American Legion is honoring the name it bears when it adopts the latter course."

"The record set by the men who form the department of Texas, during that period preceding November 11, 1918, and the principles advocated by these men since they have welded themselves into the American Legion," he continued, "tends me to suggest that the public would be serving its own ends, as well as those of the American Legion, by lending active support to the membership campaign the latter has launched. The former service man who has not affiliated with the American Legion should need no one to point out the advantage to be derived by him and his country through his support of this organization; but in the rush of modern life, some things are overlooked and those who have no the privilege of eligibility for the American Legion may aid by calling this to the attention of their acquaintances who have been in the service."

This emergency bill is a paramount act of social and indispensable justice, he said. The American farmer stand alone today of all the producers in the world. Other governments, notable those of Great Britain, France, Germany, Italy, and Japan, are helping their farmers, protecting and supporting them, but our farmers must go it alone in competition with all the world.

## NOTICE TO ALL LIVE STOCK OWNERS

by THE CATTLE SANITARY BOARD OF NEW MEXICO

By the passage of a law relating to the recording of brands by the Fifth Legislature of the State of New Mexico, it required that all owners of live stock having brands on record in the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board shall re-record such brands by the first day of July, 1921. A failure to have such brands re-recorded as required by this Act provides that they shall be stricken from the records and become obsolete.

Proper blanks will be mailed to each brand owner from the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board.

The following is the text of the law to which your careful observance is directed:

HOUSE BILL NO. 66 As Amended AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RE-RECORDING OF BRANDS

Be It Enacted By The Legislature Of The State Of New Mexico:

Section 1. The Cattle Sanitary Board of New Mexico shall have the power to and shall cause all brands in actual use to be re-recorded. For this purpose the Cattle Sanitary Board shall issue and mail a circular letter through the United States mail addressed to each owner of any brand now of record with said Board, at the post office address shown on the brand record, requiring the owner or owners of brands to file with the Secretary of said board an exact facsimile of any brand or brands now being used or one by such owners. In addition to the above notice, the Sanitary Board shall cause to be published in either English or Spanish, or both, in at least one newspaper in each County in this State, where there is a newspaper, a copy of this act, said publication to continue at least four consecutive weeks.

Sec. 2. Within three months from the date of the first publication of this act as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of all owners of brands now in record in the office of the Cattle Sanitary Board, a facsimile of the brand or brands now in actual use and owned by them. A fee for re-recording of brands shall be one (\$1.00) dollar for each brand re-recorded, the records to be used for the cost of notice given as provided in section 1 of this act; provided, that any excess money from such fees shall be placed in the indemnity fund of the Cattle Sanitary Board.

For the right to continue the use of any brand or brands recorded with the Cattle Sanitary Board, the owner or owners thereof shall, on or before the first day of January of every third year after its recording, pay to the Cattle Sanitary Board a fee of fifty cents (\$.50) which said amount is to be placed in the indemnity fund of the Cattle Sanitary Board. Upon receipt of the payment of the said amount, it shall be the duty of the Sanitary Board to mail to any such owner or owners a brand certificate for each brand recorded on for which said fee has been paid. A failure to make such payment shall forfeit the right to use any brand. When the right to use any brand recorded as aforesaid shall have become forfeited, the said brand shall not be recorded by any other person until after the expiration of two years from the date of forfeiture. The Cattle Sanitary Board shall give

notice each year on or before the first day of November by letter mailed through the United States mail to the owner or owners of such recorded brand of the amount due to be paid as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. That it is necessary for the preservation of the public peace and safety of the inhabitants of the State of New Mexico that the provisions of this act shall become effective at the earliest possible time, and, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

## Six Barrels of Potatoes for 99c.

On September 14, Mrs. Sarah S. Hancock, of Bridgeton, New Jersey, sold six barrels of No. 2 potatoes through a New York commission house for \$1.50 a barrel—a total of \$9.00. After deducting \$2.10 for barrels, \$3.51 for freight, \$1.50 for cartage and \$.90 for commission, the firm sent Mrs. Hancock what was left—99c.
