## **Nicaraguan Citizen Receives 30-year Prison Sentence For Collaborating With Cia**

On Jan. 14 the Anti-Somocista Peoples Court sentenced Nicaraguan citizen Quant Tai to 30 years in prison for collaborating with the CIA in espionage activities. Tai, a former employee of the Nicaraguan Chamber of Commerce, publicly admitted to working for the CIA. He first went to trial in September last year. After handing down the prison sentence, the Court ordered confiscation of Tai's property, as established by Nicaraguan law for persons sentenced to over five years in prison. Tai has appealed to the Supreme Court of Justice. (Basic data from Prensa Latina, 01/15/87)
