The meeting was called to order at 10 A. M. there being present Hon. Daniel Lucero chairman of the board, Hon. Narciso Frances and Hon. Celso Lobato, Hon. Joseph F. Tondre, sheriff, Hon. Avelino Gutierrez, clerk of the board.

Whereas the law requires that all vouchers for Sheriff's expenses be approved by the board of county commissioners and the District Judge, therefore BE IT RESOLVED that the County Clerk is hereby authorized to draw out a warrant in payment of the amounts approved on vouchers whenever the same bears the approvals required by law.

Whereas the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County requested the State Highway Commission to construct the approaches of the new Los Lunas bridge and where the same are now completed and adequate for the traveling requirements, therefore be it resolved that the State Highway Commission is hereby requested to expend no further funds on the construction of the same, provided however, that it is understood that the State Highway Commission will maintain and improve the said approaches out of the State Highway Commission funds.

Be it further resolved that the County Clerk is hereby requested to transmit a certified copy of the foregoing resolution to the State Highway Commission.

Paid certificate of indebtedness No. 1, against Special Bridge Fund, in favor of the Midland Bridge Company, Kansas City, Missouri, in the sum of \$3380.49 dated the 14th day of July, 1920, having been paid, the same was destroyed.

## HAS HUSTLING LABOR BUREAU

Nashville, Tenn., Post Tackles Hard Problem and Makes Most Efficient Showing.

In accordance with the general activity of American Legion posts in meeting the unemployment crisis as it affects the ex-service man, Nashville, Tenn., Post has tackled the situation with a considerable degree of Argonne enthusiasm.

An employment bureau has been established in charge of a Legion member, who devotes his full time to it. Both job applicants and employers seeking men are listed in a card index, according to their abilities and needs.

When a man applies at the Legion headquarters for a job, he is required to fill out a blank giving the following information: Name, address, place of birth, married or single; if he is an ex-service man, if he has dependents, special training and schools attended, with the extent of the education gained.

Trade test questions are: "Can you speak any foreign language?" "Do you understand card-index system?" "Can you operate a switchboard?" "Can you use a typewriter efficiently?" "Are you good at figures?" "Can you run an automobile or truck?"

Trades included in the list of job applicants for one day were electrician, druggist, salesman, accounting clerk, bookkeeper, draftsman, insurance salesman, machinist and mattress maker.

When the job seeker has filed his application, he is given a card to show that he has registered with the Legion bureau. When he is sent to an employer in response to a call, he is given a card of introduction stating that he is sent by the Legion bureau. His original application, together with the secretary's endorsement or estimate of the man, is forwarded to the prospective employer.

By arrangement with the negro post of the Legion, the employment bureau is able to answer calls for negro labor, applicants for work being listed with the negro secretary.

The work of the employment bureau is supported by funds available in the Legion treasury from a post show given last year. Another entertainment will be given soon to raise money for further operation of the bureau.

## Special Meeting Of The Board Of County Commissioners Held The 18th day of April, 1921.

The meeting was called to order at 10 A. M. there being present Hon. Daniel Lucero, chairman of the board, Hon. Narciso Frances, Hon. Celso Lobato, Hon. Aniceto Gurule chief deputy, and A. A. Gutierrez clerk of the board.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved by the board.

The board of county commissioners of Valencia County, in conformity with the provisions of section 8 of Senate bill No. 127 (as amended) passed by the last legislature, for county road purposes, after due consideration adopted the following plan and road budget, for the remainder of the present fiscal year.

Apportionment of road funds as regulated by the board of county commissioners.

Road No. 1. Precinct No. 1, Los Lunas, to be expended on local roads, \$273.60

Road No. 2. Precinct No. 2, Belen south, East of R. R. right of way, including precinct No. 3, starting from plaza bicja, by house of Feliciano Trujillo, and Rincon towards Jarales. Total to be expended on this road, \$295.10

Road No. 3. Precinct No. 2, Belen South, West of R. R. right of way towards Puellos and el Bosque, by house of Felipe Castillo to Jarales, Precinct No. 33 and 28, total to be expended on this road, \$407.50

Road No. 4. Precinct No. 5, Cubero, to be expended on local roads \$322.30

Road No. 5. District No. 6, and Seboyeta Marquez road, District No. 7, and Seboyeta Marquez road, total to be expended on this road \$236.60

Road No. 6. District No. 8, San Rafael, Grants and San Mateo road, total to be expended on this road \$727.41

Road No. 7. District No. 9, Los Lentos, to county line on north Total to be expended on this road \$479.10

Road No. 8. District No. 10, Peralta, total to be expended on this road \$83.20

Road No. 9. District No. 11, Valencia, total to be expended on this road \$54.40

Road No. 93. Los Lunas, East to gravel pit, this money to be expended between Vigil and Lujan store and Gravel pit \$300.00

Road No. 10. This road comprises El Cerro, Tome and Adelino, boundaries being on the north, the Los Lunas bridge, and on the south the Belen bridge, total to be expended \$592.80

Road No. 11. District No. 13, total to be expended on this road \$312.00

Road No 75

Leading west of Belen, towards Rio Puerco, this money to be expended in fixing the approaches of the Rio Puerco bridge, total to be expended on this RRoad \$225.00

ROAD NO. 12. District No. 16, Bluewater, to be expended on Local Roads, \$209.00

ROAD NO. 13. District No. 17, San Rafael, Atarque and Canyon Zuni Roads, total to be expended on these Roads, \$758.40

ROAD NO. 14. District No. 18, Moquino to Piedra Lumber Road, total to be expended on this Road \$191.20

ROAD NO. 15. District No. 19, Seboyeta Road, \$244.00

ROAD NO. 16. District No. 21, La Vega local roads \$192.40

ROAD NO. 17. District No. 27, Los Chavez Local Roads, \$216.20

ROAD NO. 18. District No. 30, Ketter Local Roads \$6456.11

Total \$6456.11 The Board of County Commissioners, in conformity with the provisions of Section 1 of the recently passed road Act, employs Hon. Emiliano Castillo, of Los Lunas, New Mexico, as County Road Superintendent.

Whereas the board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, complying with the provisions of Section 1, of Senate bill No. 127 (as amended) passed by the last state Legislature has decided to employ a county Road Superintendent, and Whereas the said County Road Superintendent is already appointed as above stated:

Be it resolved by the board of County Commissioners of Valencia County that the said road Supt. is hereby required to furnish a bond in the amount of \$5,000.00, with two good sufficient securities, or issued by a Surety Company, authorized to transact business in the State of New Mexico, for the faithful performance of his duties.

Be it Further Resolved that said county Road Superintendent shall receive a salary of \$100.00 per month, and all actual and necessary expenses, both salary and expenses however shall not exceed the amount permitted under the terms of the above mentioned act.

Be it further resolved that said county Road Superintendent is strictly prohibited from doing any work outside of emergency, not included in the road budgets adopted by the board of County Commissioners.

The County Clerk and Chairman of the board of county commissioners are hereby authorized respectively to draw warrants in payment of services and material expended upon roads, provided that the same are supported by vouchers and attested by the County Road Supt. Each said voucher shall bear the budget number showing where the funds have been expended.

Mr. Bradley appeared before the board and petitioned for a change of road in Precinct No. 22.

The County Road Supt. was authorized to confer and make a satisfactory settlement with Mr. Bradley in regard to the road matter in Precinct No. 22.

Hon. Emiliano Castillo appeared before the board and presented his report as county road superintendent for the time he has been temporarily county Road Supt. and the same was audited and approved.

The board approved the following quarterly reports of justices of the Peace: Narciso Oront, Lauro Baca, Jose M. Baca, Federico Chavira and Pablo Pena.

The following vouchers were approved for payment and county clerk

was instructed to pay the same: Martin Lopez, Ralph Whittington, Blits Vallejos, and A. A. Gutierrez, this being the telephone bill, for the month of March of the county clerk's office.

Hon. Miguel E. Baca and other citizens of Precinct 12 appeared before the board in regard to boundary matters, and after mature deliberation the board assured the citizens of precinct 12 that there would be no change in district lines, between district 12 and 13, and they would confer with the district attorney regarding the matter of precinct boundaries.

Mr. Silvestre Mirabal appeared before the board and petitioned that there is still due by the county of Valencia a certificate in a certain amount of money to the estate of late Melquiades Otero. The board informed Mr. Mirabal that they would take the matter up with the District Attorney and find out the best way to pay said indebtedness.

The bond of Pedro Torrez as constable of precinct No. 17 was approved.

The board of County Commissioners then took under consideration the valuations fixed for the year 1921 and after mature deliberation ordered that the minimum valuation for the Belen Township and the east addition of Belen, be fixed at the same valuation as for the year 1920.

The board of county commissioners then reconvened as board of Finance and audited and approved bond of the Maryland Casualty Company, on behalf of the first National Bank of Albuquerque, New Mex., in favor of Valencia County, in the sum of \$50,000.00 to cover funds of said county, also bond of the same company in the amount of \$40,000.00 to cover funds of said county.

The board then adjourned subject to the call of the chairman.

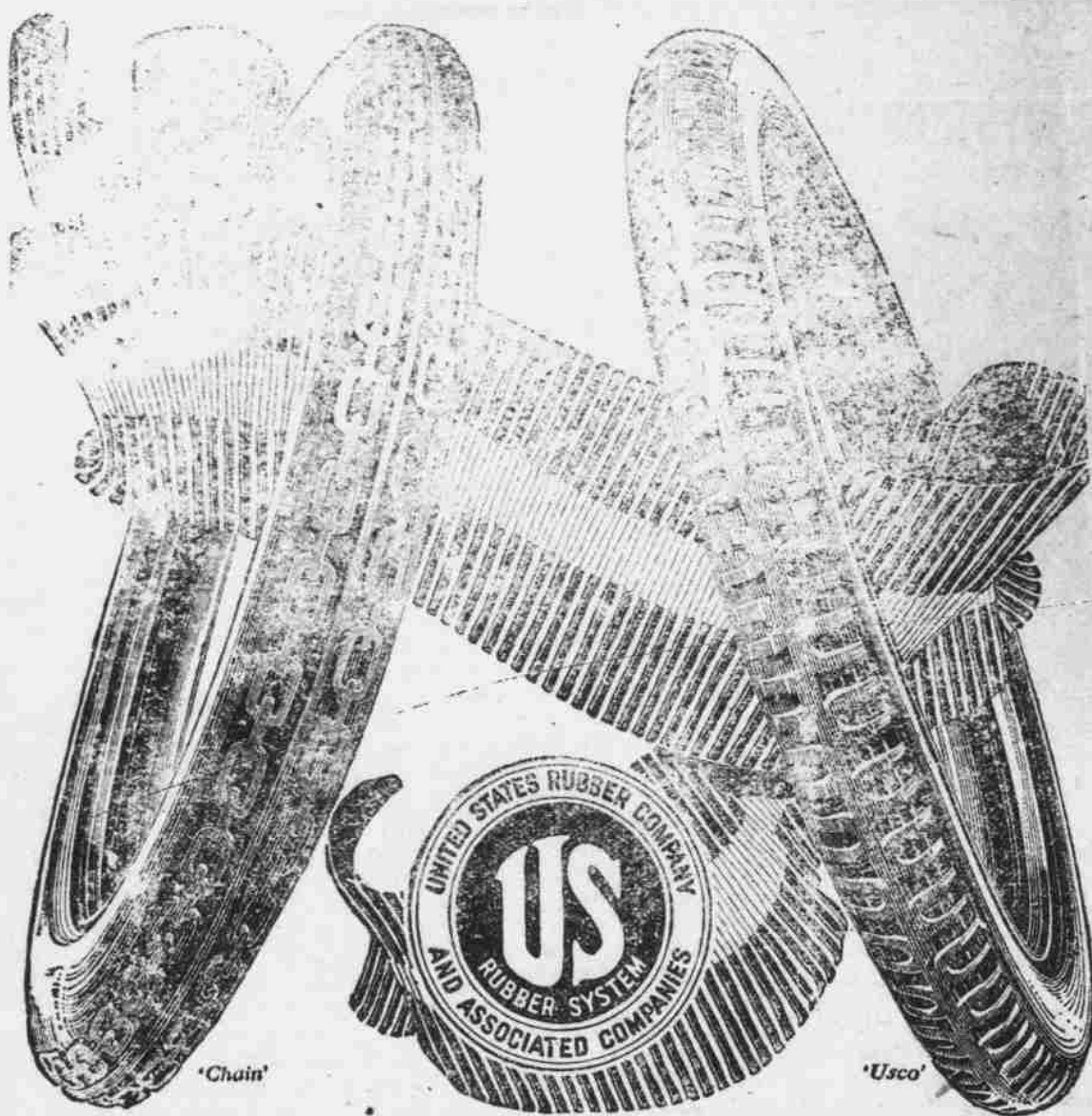
