Whereas the law requires that all vouchers for Sheriff's expenses be approved by the board of county commissioners and the District Judge, therefore BE IT RESOLVED that the County Clerk is hereby authorized to draw out a warrant in payment of the amounts approved on vouchers whenever the same bears the approvals required by law.

Whereas the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County requested the State Highway Commission to construct the approaches of the new Los Lunas bridge and where as the same are now completed and adequate for the traveling requirements, therefore he it resolved that the State Highway Commission is hereby requested to expend no further funds on the construction of the same, provided however, that it is understood that the State Highway Commission will maintain and improve the said approaches out of the State Highway Commission funds.

Be it further resolved that the County Clerk is hereby requested to transmit a certified copy of the foregoing resolution to the State Highway Commission.

Paid certificate of indebtedness No. 1, against Special Bridge Fund, in favor of the Midland Bridge Company, Kansas City, Missouri, in the sum of \$3380.49 dated the 14th day of July, 1920, having been paid, the same was destroyed.

Mrs. Silvestre Mirabal, Nabor Mirabal and Jose Rafael Mirabal appeared before the board through their attorney Mr. Dobson. And protested against the valuation of certain lands in Valencia County and the board after considering said protests resolved as follows:

The board of county commissioners of Valencia County sitting as a board of equalization of said county, are of the opinion that the alternate section of lands returned for purposes of taxation by the Mirabals are no more valuable than the lands returned by the Santa Fe Pacific Railroad for taxation purposes which are returned

ed at \$1.25 per acre in pursuance of an order made by the State Tax Commission fixing the value at \$1.25 per acre and while the lands of the said Mirabals have been assessed at \$2.25 per acre and we as a board of Equalization would if possessed of the power make said reduction as requested by the said Mirabals yet we are advised that we are powerless to make any reduction in the value of said lands but we are required to value same at \$2.25 as fixed by the State Tax Commission at its meeting held Dec. 22nd 1920 whereby District No. 6 which included Bernalillo, McKinley and Valencia Counties the value of grazing lands was fixed at \$2.25 per acre, less a deduction of ten per cent, which was to be assessed at \$1.00 per acre.

It is therefore ordered that the request of the said Silvestre Mirabal Jose Rafael Mirabal and Nabor Mirabal for reduction in the valuation of certain lands is denied for lack of power and authority to make same.

The protest and petition of W. C. Reid for a reduction of the valuation of certain lands contracted from the McKinley Land and Lumber Co., was denied for lack of authority, as in the case of the Mirabal claims.

The following claims as to the assessed valuation of Land Grants and lands purchased from Grants, to wit:

Belen Land Grant, Nicolas Duran de Chavez Grant, Cubero Land Grant, Antonio Gutierrez and Juquin Grant, Antoni Sedillo Grant, Lo de Padilla Land Grant, San Clemente Land Grant, Seboyeta Land Grant, and Town of Tome Land Grant were rejected by this board due to the fact that the authority for fixing the values of same is placed by law in the hands of the State Tax Commission.

The Board of Equalization of the county of Valencia adopted the following resolution in regard to these lands:

Whereas there has been a great difference in opinion as to the true value of land grants and it has been a matter of controversy during past years and whereas in the matter of Texas of W. H. Fiquit for the taxes of 1920, relating to taxes on similar lands, the District Court of the county of Valencia after hearing all testimony presented as to said values, fixed the value of land Grants at \$1.50 per acre, the attorney representing the State Tax Commission consenting thereto as being just and equitable.

Be It Resolved that the Board of Equalization of Valencia County hereby declares that it is its belief that the value so ascertained and fixed by the District Attorney is correct.

Be It Further Resolved that the county clerk is hereby instructed to transmit a copy of the foregoing resolution to the various claimants to be listed.

The Board of equalization then reconvened as Board of County Commissioners and acted on the following matters:

Hon. E. Kempenich appeared before the board, as Flood Commissioner of Valencia County and requested the board to act on the recent law passed by the last legislature, relating to flood matters, and the board passed the following resolution:

Whereas pursuant to section 1314, compiled laws of 1915, the respective board of county commissioners of the various counties in the State of New Mexico, are authorized to summon and call out all the able bodied male persons under the age of sixty years, residing within five miles on each side of any stream or river, in all cases when property or lives are threatened by sudden flood waters, against which no proper provision has been made; for a term not to exceed five days during any calendar year, and whereas an emergency requiring prompt action to prevent serious damage and loss may arise at any moment, and it is deemed proper by the board of county commissioners of the county of Valencia to place carrying out of the provisions of the above law in the hands of bonded officials.

And Whereas under a recent law his Excellency, the Governor of the state of New Mexico has appointed a county Flood Commissioner of the county of Valencia.

Therefore be it resolved by the said flood commissioner and his duly authorized agents under said Act are hereby empowered to execute the provisions of sections, 1314, 1315 and 1316 of the compiled laws of 1915, as fully as this board of county commissioners might or could do when actually in session.

The resignation of Agustin Chavez as Justice of the peace of precinct No 18 was accepted, and Serafin Marquez was appointed to act in his place until his successor is elected and qualified.

The county clerk was authorized to draw a warrant in the amount of \$200.00 in favor of Hon. J. F. Tondre, county purchasing agent to buy postage stamps for the various county officers.

Hon. J. F. Tondre appeared before the board and requested in behalf of the state Board of Health, that there is due the sum of \$75.00, to said board of Health for medicines bought for the Ramah Indians in the recent contagious disease. The county clerk was instructed to draw a warrant in payment to the State Board of Health, for said amount.

The following resolution was adopted by the board of county commissioners:
