SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Held April 4, A. D. 1921.

The meeting was called to order at 10 A. M. there being present Hon. Daniel Lucero chairman of the board, Hon. Narciso Frances and Hon. Celso Lobato, Hon. Joseph F. Tondre, sheriff, Hon. Avelino Gutierrez, clerk of the board.

Whereas the law requires that all vouchers for Sheriff's expenses be approved by the board of county commissioners and the District Judge, therefore BE IT RESOLVED that the County Clerk is hereby authorized to draw out a warrant in payment of the amounts approved on vouchers whenever the same bears the approvals required by law.

Whereas the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County requested the State Highway Commission to construct the approaches of the new Los Lunas bridge and where as the same are now completed and adequate for the traveling requirements, therefore be it resolved that the State Highway Commission is hereby requested to expend no further funds on the construction of the same, provided however, that it is understood that the State Highway Commission will maintain and improve the said approaches out of the State Highway Commission funds.

Be it further resolved that the County Clerk is hereby requested to transmit a certified copy of the foregoing resolution to the State Highway Commission.

Paid certificate of indebtedness No. 1, against Special Bridge Fund, in favor of the Midland Bridge Company, Kansas City, Missouri, in the sum of \$3380.49 dated the 14th day of July, 1920, having been paid, the same was destroyed.

Whereas it is impossible for the board of County Commissioners to audit justices of the peace accounts unless the quarterly report is in their hands. REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

July 6th, 1921.

The board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, met in regular session, as per adjournment of July 4th, 1921. There were present Hon. Daniel Lucero, chairman of the board, Hon. Narciso Frances, and Celso Lobato, members, Hon. Joseph F. Tondre, sheriff and A. A. Gutierrez, County Clerk.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Jesus C. Sanchez and other citizens of Precinct No. 12 appeared before the board, in regard to the boundary line of Precincts No. 12 and 13 and the Board after due consideration deferred action on this matter, pending more information from the District Attorney.

Mr. Federico Sanchez from Precinct No. 2, and the board passed the following resolution on this matter: Be It Resolved by the board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, Clerk is hereby instructed to notify Mr. Maximiliano Sanchez, to show cause before the board of county commissioners, on July 20th, 1921, why the road leading from Los Lecos to the Rio Puerco, passed the house of Placido Chavez shall not be declared a public highway. The county clerk is also instructed to invite all persons interested in this matter, to be present to give any evidence which

may assist the board in its decision. Various citizens of Precinct No. 3 appeared before the board in regard to school funds of District No. 3 and 33, claiming that school funds of said school districts have not been equitable and justly distributed in the past, and the board passed the following resolution:

Resolved that the board hereby allows the expenditure of the sum of \$50.00, each for accurate location of the boundary lines and corners of school districts No. 3 and 33, provided that the county surveyor shall file a plat of this boundaries, together with his field notes in the office of the County Clerk.

The chairman then convened the board, as county board of finance, and after due consideration the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS the County Board of Finance of Valencia County has approved depository bonds of the First National Bank of Belen, N. Mex. in the sum of \$62500.00 dollars, and of the First National Bank of Albuquerque, N. Mex. in the sum of \$100,000.00 dollars under the authority granting them supervising, depositing and safe-keeping of public moneys imposed on them, under the provisions of chapter 57 of the 1915 Statutes (as amended) by the provisions of chapter 70 of the laws of 1917.

Whereas section 12 of the said chapter 70 of the laws of 1917, provides that the Treasurer of the county shall deposit the public moneys in the banks which have qualified as depositories, in equitable ratio.

Be it resolved that the Treasurer of Valencia County is hereby specifically authorized and directed to deposit the Public Moneys of Valencia County in the two above mentioned depositories, in ratio to the bonds of the same, heretofore approved by the county board of finance.

Be it further resolved that the County Clerk is hereby requested to transmit a certified copy of the foregoing resolution to the treasurer of Valencia County.

Mr. J. W. Chapman representing various bidders appeared before the board in order to bid in the deeds for various certificates for taxes. The board not being fully advised in the premises deferred action until July 20th, 1921.

Mr. Adelino Sanchez appeared before the board in support of his claim in conformity of Chapter 101 of the laws of 1917. The same was referred to school auditor Hon. John Joerns, Santa Fe, New Mexico for his recommendation.

Felipe Sena justice of the peace of Precinct No. 6, tendered his resignation and the same was accepted. Eutimio Chavez was appointed in his place to act until his successor is elected and qualified.

Resolved by the board of County commissioners of Valencia County, State of New Mexico, that a special tax of two mills on each dollar of the valuation of all property in said county subject to taxation for state and county purposes is hereby levied and imposed for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and improvement of Public Highways and to enable the state and counties to meet the provisions of the Federal Aid Road Act, being the tax authorized and directed to be made by said board by the Act of the Legislature of said state entitled "An Act authorizing and directing boards of County Commissioners to levy taxes for each of the years 1921, 1922 and 1923 for the construction and improvement of Public Highways and to meet dollar for dollar allotments to the State of Federal Funds under the Federal Aid Road Act, and for other purposes", approved March 12, 1921.

The County Assessor of the county is hereby authorized and directed to extend said levy on the tax roll for said county for the year 1921 and the County Treasurer of the county is hereby authorized and directed to collect said tax and remit the same to the state Treasurer to be placed to the credit of the State Road Fund.

Be it resolved by the board of county commissioners that the county clerk is hereby authorized to draw a warrant in favor of the Midland Bridge Company of Kansas City, Mo.

on the Special Bridge Fund in the amount of \$1,138.96 and the county clerk is furthermore instructed to cancel certificate of indebtedness No. 7.

The claim of Mr. H. G. Wilson was rejected on the ground that the charges are exorbitant and the county clerk was instructed to write a letter to Mr. C. E. Waller director of New Mexico Bureau of Public Health in regard to this matter.

The quarterly reports of Joseph F. Tondre as sheriff, and Emiliano Castillo, County Road Superintendent were audited and approved. Also the monthly report of A. A. Gutierrez, county clerk was approved.

The County clerk was instructed to correspond with The First National Bank of Albuquerque, New Mexico, advising this bank that the railroad Company paid its taxation under protest and therefore the board cannot draw warrants against the Special Bridge Fund until this matter is adjudicated by court.

Being no other business before the board it adjourned to meet on the 20th day of July, 1921.

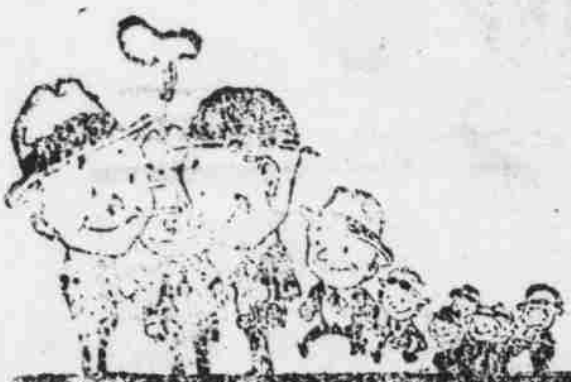
