Monroe Avenue, four blocks, from Gidding to Connelly Street. Grand Avenue, four blocks, from

Gidding to Connelly Street. Main Street, four blocks, from Monroe Avenue south to the Santa Fe right-of-way.

Gidding Street, five blocks, from Otero Avenue to Bent Avenue,

Pile Street, two blocks from Otero to Monroe.

Washington Avenue, six blocks, from Main Street east to Ross.

There is also a petition being circulated for paving on Otero Avenue from Gidding to Connelly but this is not quite ready for presentation, but may be by the time the council meets next Monday.

This will mean a big paving program for Clovis and it is hoped that there will be no hitch in its being carried out this spring and summer.

The name of this corporation shall be "Jackman-Barker Motor Company."



of Influenza. 1. Keep away from the siek,

2. Avoid crowly.

3. Do not use cups, glasses or towels that anyone else has used. 4. Get all the fresh sir, good food and exercise you can.

5. Wash your hands frequently, 6. Avoid the use of sprays, drugs, etc., for preventive purposes. They do no good and may do harm,

7. To protect your neighbor, cover your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze. Cough and sneeze toward the floor or ground.

8. If you feel sick when influenza is prevalent, go to bed and send for a doctor.

9. If you have the disease stay in bed until entirely well. Pneumonia may result from getting up too soon. 10. Help your health officer fight the disease.


