NEWS IN ABBREVIATED FORM.

Freeman J. W. Murphy, who has been with the Chicago road, has been reinstated at Los Angeles.

Route No. 216, from the local depot, has been sent up the road for work on the mountain division.

W. P. Powers, route agent for Western Express company, was a passenger going north yesterday.

C. G. Sholes, of Topeka, is here on business. He is on the way to the city of the Santa Fe railway.

Mrs. Sullivan, mother of G. E. Sullivan, agent of the Santa Fe at Flagstaff, is visiting friends in Los Angeles.

D. B. Shiley, who was a local freight depot clerk last year, after spending a few days in the city, left yesterday for Topeka.

Quite a number of engineers, firemen and brakemen are now on the extra board. They will receive several days work per week.

Orange trains, running on passenger train time, continue passing through the city from California. Two trains yesterday, and one up to noon today.

Dr. Benedict Allen, at the local clinic, is recording the death of his patient, the result of a case of pneumonia, which he had been treating for some time.

Several men have gone to work in the station shops since the first day of April. With all this increased force the amount of work in this is certainly increasing.

YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS.

Charged With Petit Larceny of Candy and Coal from Railroad Company.

Yesterday Ben Williams, special officer of the Santa Fe, succeeded in capturing seven young boys whom he suspected of having entered cars laden with merchandise. Their names are: Ben Williams, Willie Dean, Elmer McCowan, Charles Riverdale, Epitapho Martinez, Antonio Martinez and Juan Martinez, and their ages are between 12 and 15 years. It is reported that the boys broke a seal on a box car and stole some candy, and for this offense the charge of burglary could be preferred, but the officers, who are lenient with them this time, owing to the extreme youth of the boys, and let them down with a charge of petit larceny. The boys were taken to the local station and are now in the custody of the Santa Fe railway.
