FIFTH ANNUAL ROLL CALL BEGINS ARMISTICE DAY

American Red Cross to Enroll Members Throughout Nation November 11 to 24.

The American Red Cross will conduct its Fifth Annual Roll Call this year beginning on Armistice Day, November 11, and ending the eve of Thanksgiving Day. National headquarters in Washington, division headquarters in the eight divisions of the Red Cross, and headquarters of each of the more than 2,000 chapters, are busily engaged on their Roll Call program, according to information given at local Red Cross headquarters. The effort will be to re-enroll every present member of the Red Cross and to add as many new members to the roster as possible in the period given.

There are at present 6,041,163 members in the American Red Cross. John Barton Payne, chairman of the Red Cross, hopes to hear the answer, "present," when each one of these names is called between Armistice Day and Thanksgiving Day this year. He says, thus providing for the continuance of the work of service to the public of America and the suffering in foreign lands which the Red Cross has started and is conducting on the basis of its peace-time program.

In a letter sent out from national headquarters, W. Frank Persons, vice-chairman of the American Red Cross in charge of Domestic Operations, calls attention to the fact that the strength of the Red Cross in the past has been in its volunteer workers. He urges, therefore, that all chapter membership committees seek to re-enroll the largest number possible of the men and women who have served the Red Cross as volunteers in the past, and suggests that the Roll Call is a logical channel for bringing former workers back to service in the Red Cross.

The interest manifested in the Red Cross Convention at Columbus, Ohio, the first week in October, showed that the public is as keen to stand behind the work of the Red Cross in its peace-time program as during the war, and that the thinking public realizes that the Red Cross is as necessary to the welfare of the civilized world in time of peace as in war. Officials of the Red Cross believe, therefore, that the Roll Call this year will result in many more members than were placed on the roster of the American Red Cross last year.

The Red Cross throughout the country is putting on this year its new peace-time program, which includes public welfare service in every direction.

SPECIAL SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HELD OCT. 18th, 1921.

At a special session of the board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, held the 18th day of October, 1921, there were present Hon. Daniel Lucero chairman of the board, Hon. Seiso Lobato, member, Hon. Valentin Jaramillo, deputy sheriff and A. A. Gutierrez, county clerk.

The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Mr. R. S. Conroy, County Agricultural Agent appeared before the board in behalf of the county Agricultural fund levy, stating that in figuring out the budget for the coming year an error was made in said levy and after due deliberation on the matter the following resolution was passed:

Whereas it has been made to appear to this board that 00005 of a mill is the levy inserted in the budget for the year 1921 for the county agricultural fund levy through an error in figuring said levy and where as it is the desire of the board to continue the services of the county agricultural agent for the coming year and the levy of 00005 of a mill not being sufficient to meet the required expenses of said agent.

Therefore be it resolved by the board of county commissioners of Valencia county that the state tax commission is hereby requested to change and correct the county agents tax levy so that 00011 mills will be levied for County Agent purposes, and that such deductions be made from the miscellaneous fund out of the general county fund so as to make 11-100 of a mill for the county agent fund, leaving 00079 of a mill in the general county fund. Whereas Mr. Stevens and Mr. Van White have personal knowledge of how this error was made, their assistance and information is requested in assisting the State Tax Commission in making their correction.

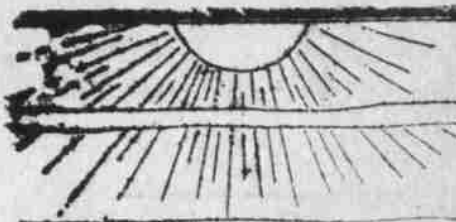
